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# LACE ILLUSIONS JUMPER

This soft mohair blend yarn Katia Illusions makes a soft and romantic style jumper, work on large needles to create an open delicate effect.

# WORKING PATTERN BACK AND FRONT BOTH ALIKE.

With 8.00mm needles and illusion cast on 67 sts.

Work 6 rows garter stitch (knit every row).

Change to 9.00mm needles.

Work 1 row purl.



#### Begin cluster star pattern

Row 1: RS - knit.

Row 2: \* P1, P5 wrapping yarn around needle twice for each st, rep from\*to last st,

Row 3: K1,\*Cluster 5 (over next 5 sts as follows; slip next 5 sts knitways onto right hand needle dropping off the extra loops, pass these 5 sts back onto left hand needle, (K1, P1, K1, P1, K1) into all 5sts together wrapping yarn twice around needle for each st), K1: rep from \* to end.

Row 4: P1, \*K5 dropping off extra loops, P1; rep from \* to end.

Row 5: knit.

Row 6: P4, P5 wrapping yarn around needle twice for each st,\* P1, P5 wrapping yarn around needle twice for each st\*, rep from\* to last 4sts, P4.

Row 7: K4,\*Cluster 5 (as before),\* K1, cluster 5, rep from \* last 4sts, K4.

Row 8: P4, \*K5 dropping off extra loops, \*P1, K5 dropping off extra loops, rep from \* to last 4sts, P4. These 8 rows form pattern. Continue until piece measures 54 cm or desired length finishing on 1 st row (knit).

Work 3 rows garter st. Next Row: K 22, cast off next 23 stitches loosely, k 22. Leave stitches on spare needle.

#### SLEEVES

Using 8.00mm needles cast (missing text for sleeves)

#### MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams.
Three needle cast off method.
Place the back and front
still on needles together
with right sides facing each
other, lining up the shoulder
stitches still on needles,
using a third needle perform
a 3 needle cast off for both
shoulders. Important: cast
off loosely.

# CROCHET MOTIF SCARF

Crochet sections to join into a scarf

#### STITCH GUIDE FIRST LARGE MOTIF

Using 5.00mm hook, make 3ch and join with a sI st in first ch to form a ring. Following diagram or work from written instructions as follows:

Round 1: 5ch, (1tr in ring, 2ch) 7 times, sl st in 3rd ch at beg, sI st in next ch. Round 2: 4ch, picot, 1ch,

picot, 1ch, \* 1tr in next 2ch

sp. 1ch. picot. 1ch. picot. 1ch rep from \* to end, sl st in 3rd ch at beg.

Round 3: 2ch, working behind first picot, 1 dc in ch sp before next picot, (7ch, miss 2 picots, 1dc in next ch space) 7 times, 7ch, sl st in first dc. \*\*

Round 4: 1ch. (1dc. 1htr. 3tr. 1ch, 3tr, 1htr, 1dc) in each 7ch loop to end, sl st in first dc. Fasten off.

#### SECOND LARGE MOTIF

Work as for first large motif

Round 4: 1ch, \* (1dc, 1htr, 3tr) in first 7ch loop, sl st in any ch sp at edge of first large motif, (3tr, 1htr, 1dc) in same 7ch loop of second large motif, rep from \* once, working into next ch sp of first large motif. (1dc. 1htr, 3tr, 1ch, 3tr, 1htr, 1dc) in each 7ch loop to end, sl st in first dc.

Fasten off.

Make a further 21 large motifs, joining to adjacent motifs as before (see motif assembly diagram).

#### SMALL EDGE MOTIFS

Using 5.00mm hook, make 5ch and join with a sl st in first ch to form a ring. Follow diagram or work from written instructions as follows:

#### Yarn

6 balls 50gm Patons Cosmos 12 Ply in shade 4547

#### Needles


5.00mm crochet hook Wool sewing needle

#### Tension

Large motif measures 15cm across at widest part using 5.00mm hook

#### Special abbreviation

Picot - 4ch, sl st in first of these ch



Round 1: 3ch, 15tr, in ring, sl st in 3rd ch at beg.

Round 2: 1ch, 1dc in same st as sl st, 6ch, 1dc in each of next 4tr, 3ch, join to first large motif with a sl st in dc as indicated on diagram, 3ch, 1dc in each of next 4tr, 3ch, join to second large motif with a sl st in dc as indicated, 3ch, 1 dc in each of next 4tr, 3ch, join to next large motif with a sl st in dc as indicated, 3ch, 1 dc in each of last 3tr, sl st in first dc.

Fasten off.

Make a further 15 small edge motifs joining to large motifs at edge of scarf in second round as before.

#### SMALL CENTRE MOTIFS

Make 6 motifs as for small edge motifs, joining with sl st (as before) to all adjacent large motifs.

# DIAGONAL JACKET

Show off multi-coloured yarn with this versatile jacket.

#### GETTING STARTED

The jacket is knitted in garter stitch, with a slip stitch selvedge. The first stitch of every row is slipped purl wise, with varn in front. Then the yarn is moved to the back and you knit across the remainder of the row.

When making a stitch after this slipped stitch, make sure you pull enough yarn through, so that your work stays flat, and does not pull.

To remember which side of your work is the right side, pin a small safety pin on it as a reminder

You may wish to use two balls of varn at a time, to prevent any particular colour appearing in a block.

#### WORKING PATTERN LEFT BACK

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1: SI 1. M1. K to end of row

Rep this row until you have 56 (62 68 74) sts. Mark next row as RS with a small safety pin. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last st. M1, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end.

Rep these 2 rows until long side (end of RS row) measures 33 (36 38 38) cm

#### Shape Armhole

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 5 times more: 44 (50 56 62) sts.

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last st. M1. K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these last 2 rows until armhole measures 23 (24 26 26) cm.

#### Shape Shoulder & Back Neck

Next Row: RS -SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 11 (13 15 17) times more: 20 (22 24 26) sts. Next Row: RS -SI 1, K2 tog, K

to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - Cast off 5 sts. K to end.

Next Row: RS -SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these last 2 rows until 5 sts remain.

Next Row: RS - SI 1 K2 tog twice.

MEASUREMENTS TO FIT CHEST: 86.91 97-102 107-112 117-122CM GARMENT LENGTH: 58CM 60 65 66CM

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K2. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, DSSO.

Fasten off.

#### RIGHT BACK

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1: SI 1. M1. K to end of

Rep this row until you have 56 (62 68 74) sts.

Mark next row as RS row.

Next Row: RS - SI 1, M1, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these last 2 rows until long side (beg of RS row) measures 33 (36 38 38) cm.

#### Shape Armhole

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 5 times more: 44 (50 56 62) sts

Next Row: RS - SI 1, M1, K to last 3 sts. K2 tog. K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows until armhole measures 23 (24 26 26) cm.

#### Shape Shoulder & Back Neck

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 11 (13 15 17) times more: 20 (22 24 26) sts Next Row: RS - Cast off 6 sts.

K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1. K to end. Next Row: RS - SI1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1. Rep these last 2 rows until 5

sts remain

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog

twice.

SI 1: slip 1 stitch (always purl wise)

17 sts over garter st to 10cm

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1: SI 1, M1, K to end of row

last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Rep these 2 rows 5 times more: 56 (62 68 74) sts.

Next Row: RS - SI 1, M1, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

ast 5 sts, R2 tog, R1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end.

Rep these 2 rows until armhole measures 23 (24 26 26) cm

#### Shape Shoulder

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1. Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 11 (13 15 17) times more: 32 (34 36 38) sts.

#### Shape Front Neck

Next Row: RS - Cast off 18 (20 22 24) sts, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1. Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep last 2 rows until 5 sts

remain.

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K 2. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, psso.

Fasten off.

#### RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1: SI 1, M1, K to end of

row

Rep this row until you have 68 (74 80 86) sts. Mark next row as RS row

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K

to last st, M1, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows until long side (end of WS row) measures 15 (18 20 20) cm. Make first buttonhole.

#### MAKE BUTTONHOLE

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K2, cast off 2 sts, K to last st, M1, K1.¾

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K across to buttonhole, turn, cast on 2 sts over the 2 sts cast off on previous row, turn, K to end.

#### Shape Armhole

Working a buttonhole every 8 cm twice more.

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 5 times more: 56 (62 68 74) sts.

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last st, M1, K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows until front edge (beg of RS row) measures 15 (18 19 19) cm.

#### Shape Shoulder

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1. Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these 2 rows 10 (12 14 16) times more, then work a RS row once more: 32 (34 36 38) sts remain.

#### Shape Front Neck

Next Row: WS - Cast off 20 sts. K to end. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog, K to last 3 sts, K2 tog, K1. Next Row: WS - SI 1, K to end. Rep these last 2 rows until 4 sts remain

Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog,

K1.

Next Row: WS - SI 1 K 2. Next Row: RS - SI 1, K2 tog,

psso. Fasten off.

#### SLEEVES

Cast on 37 (39 41 43) sts.

Row 1: RS - SI 1, K to end.

Rep this row throughout, increasing 1 st at beg and end of the 5th row, and then every following 6th row, until there are 73 (73 81 81) sts.

Continue without shaping until work measures 43 (43 46 46) cm or desired length to underarm.

Cast off 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows: 57 (57 65 65) sts. Dec 1 st at beg and end of every RS row 8 times: 41 (41 49 49) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 6 rows: 29 (29 37 37) sts. Cast off remaining sts.

#### MAKING UP

Sew centre back seam. Sew shoulder seams. Sew side seams. Sew sleeve seams. Matching underarm seams, and centre of sleeve top to shoulder seam, sew in sleeves. Sew on three buttons to left front, and one each to folded back lapels.

#### STITCH GUIDE

Using size 4.00mm hook make 55 ch.

Row 1: - 3 dtr into 5th ch from hook, miss 4 ch. 1 dc in next ch. \*4 ch. 3 dtr in same ch as last dc, miss 4 ch, 1 dc in next ch, repeat from \* ending 1 dc in last ch.

Row 2: 4 ch. 3 dtr in dc at base of these 4 ch, miss 3 dtr. 1 dc in next ch, \* 4 ch, 3 dtr in 4 ch sp, miss 3 dtr, 1 dc in next ch, repeat from \* ending 1 dc in 4th of 4 ch at beg previous

Repeat Row 2 until Scarf measures 135cm.

Next Row: 1 ch, 1 dc in first dc, \*4 ch, miss 3 dtr, 1 dc in next ch, miss 3 ch, rept from \* ending 1 dc in 4th of 4 ch at beg previous row. Fasten off.





# NATURAL CABLES **THROW**

Chunky throw in 2 sizes

#### GETTING STARTED

Moss stitch (over odd number of stitches).

Row 1: \*K1, P1; rep from \* to

Repeat Row 1 for desired length.

Cable stitch over 12 sts Rows 1. 5. 7. 9: RS - P2. K8. P2.

Rows 2, 4, 6, 8, 10: WS -K2. P8. K2.

Row 3 P2, slip next 4 sts

onto cable needle and leave at front of work, K4, K4 from cable needle P2 Repeat these 10 rows for pattern.

#### WORKING PATTERN

Cast on 115 (135) stitches. Work Moss stitch for 15 rows. Next Row: WS - Set Up Increase Row\* Moss st over 9 sts, knit into front and back of next st, P3, M1, P4, knit

into front and back of next st. repeat from \*, end Moss stitch over last 9 sts. 135 (156) sts Continue working Moss stitch as established and repeat cable rows 1-10, until throw measures approximately 145 (160)cm, ending with an even numbered row

Decrease Row: \*Moss stitch over 9 sts, P1, K1, P2tog, K1, P1, K2tog, P1, K1, P2tog, rep from \*, end with Moss stitch

over last 9 sts Continue in Moss stitch for 15 rows. Cast off loosely in pattern.

#### MAKING UP

Weave in wool ends.

#### Special abbreviations

C4B = Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and leave at back of work, K2 then K2 from cable needle.

C4F = Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and leave at front of work, K2 then K2 from cable needle.

TWB = Slip next st onto cable needle and leave at back of work. K1tbl then P1 from cable needle. TWF = Slip next st onto cable needle and leave at front of work. P1 then K1tbl from cable needle. C2B = Slip next st onto cable needle and leave at back of work. K1tbl then K1tbl from cable needle. C2F = Slip next st onto cable needle and leave at

#### Tension

22 sts by 30 rows over stocking st on 4.00mm needles to 10cm

front of work, K1tbl then

K1tbl from cable needle.

# GIRL'S DRESS WITH CABLES

Darling dress for girls

#### WORKING PATTERN DRESS (BEGINNING WITH SKIRT)

Using Thumb Method, 4.00mm circular needle and C, cast on 288 (332, 332, 376) sts, allowing 20cm per scallop (see below). Do not join but work backwards and forwards in rows for scallop edging only.

#### Work Scallop Edging

Row 1: RS - Purl.

Row 2: K2, \* knit next st, slip this st back onto left-hand needle, lift each of the next 8 sts on left-hand needle over this st and off needle, (yfwd) twice, then knit the first st again, K2, rep from \* to end. 26 (30, 30, 34) scallops.

Row 3: K1, \* P2tog, (K1, P1, K1, P1) into first yfwd (allowing extra yfwd to drop off needle), P1, rep from \* to last st, K1. 158 (182, 182, 206) sts.

Do not turn at end of 3rd row: join to work in rounds for rem, taking care not to twist work.

Next Round: Purl. Next Round: Knit.

Rep last 2 rounds once.

Next Round: (K4, inc in next st) 0 (0, 0, 16) times, (K3, inc in next st) 22 (23, 23, 0) times, \* K3, inc in next st, K2 (4, 4, 4), inc in next st, rep from \* to end. 200 (225, 225, 250) sts.

#### Beg Cable Patt

Round 1: \* P4, K4, P2, TWF, P2, TWB, TWF, P3, K4, rep from \* to end.

Round 2: \* P4. K4. P3. K1tbl. (P2, K1tbl) twice, P3, K4, rep from \* to end.

Round 3: \* P4, C4F, P3, TWF, TWB, P2, TWF, P2, C4B, rep from \* to end.

Round 4: \* P4, K4, P4. (K1tbl) twice, P4, K1tbl, P2, K4, rep from \* to end.

Round 5: \* P4, K4, P4, C2B, P4. K1tbl, P2, K4, rep from \* to end

Round 6: As 4th round. Round 7: \* P4, K4, P3, TWB, TWF, P2, TWB, P2, K4, rep from \* to end.

Round 8: As 2nd round. Round 9: \* P4, C4F, P2, TWB, P2, TWF, TWB, P3, C4B, rep from \* to end.

Round 10: \* P4, K4, P2, K1tbl. P4. (K1tbl) twice, P4, K4, rep from \* to end.

Round 11: \* P4, K4, P2, K1tbl. P4, C2F, P4, K4, rep from \* to end

Round 12: As 10th round Rounds 1 to 12 incl form cable patt.

Work a further 4 (4, 6, 8) rounds cable patt.

#### Shape Skirt

Next Round \* P2tog, patt 48, rep from \* to last 0 (25, 25, 0) sts, (P2tog, patt 23) 0 (1, 1, 0) times. 196 (220, 220, 245) sts. Keeping patt correct, work 11 (12, 13, 15) rounds.

Next Round: \* Patt 24. P2tog, patt 23, rep from \* to last 0 (24, 24, 0) sts, (patt 24) 0 (1, 1, 0) times. 192 (216, 216, 240) sts. Keeping patt correct, work 11 (12, 13, 15) rounds.

Next Round: \* P2tog, patt 46. rep from \* to last 0 (24, 24, 0) sts, (P2tog, patt 22) 0 (1, 1, 0) times. 188 (211, 211, 235) sts. Keeping patt correct, work 11 (12, 13, 15) rounds.

Next Round: \* Patt 23, P2tog. patt 22, rep from \* to last 0 (23, 23, 0) sts, (patt 23) 0 (1, 1, 0) times. 184 (207, 207, 230) sts.

Cont without further shaping until skirt measures 28 (32, 36, 38) cm from beg of scallop edging, ending with an even numbered patt round.

Sizes 2 and 6 years only Next Round: (K2, K2tog, K3, K2tog) 0 (10) times, \* K2, K2tog, rep from \* to last 0 (1) sts, K0 (1). 138 (158) sts.

Sizes 4 and 8 years only Next Round: (K2, K2tog, K1, K2tog) (24, 10) times, \* K (1, 2), K2tog, rep from \* to end. (146, 170) sts.

All sizes. 138 (146, 158, 170) sts.

#### Divide for Back Bodice Change to M.

Next Row: K69 (73, 79, 85), turn

Next Row: P69 (73, 79, 85), turn

Cont on these 69 (73, 79, 85) sts for Back.

Cont in stocking st until Back measures 3 (6, 7, 7) cm from beg of stocking st, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Armholes

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows 63 (67, 71, 77) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 55 (61, 63, 69) sts rem. Work 31 (35, 37, 43) rows without further shaping.

#### Shape Shoulders

Cast off 6 (8, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 6 (7, 8, 9) sts at beg of foll 2 rows. Leave rem 31 (31, 31, 33) sts on a stitch-holder.

#### Beg Front Bodice

With right side facing, join M to rem 69 (73, 79, 85) sts.
Work in stocking st (beg with a knit row) until Front measures same as Back to armholes, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Armholes

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows 63 (67, 71, 77) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 55 (61, 63, 69) sts rem. Work 15 (17, 17, 23) rows without further shaping.

#### Shape Neck

Next Row: K19 (22, 23, 25), turn

Cont on these 19 (22, 23, 25) sts for left side of neck.

\*\* Dec one st at neck edge in next 2 rows, then in every foll alt row 4 times, then in foll 4th row once 12 (15, 16, 18) sts.

Work 1 (3, 5, 5) rows.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 6 (8, 8, 9) sts at beg of next row.

Work 1 row. Cast off rem 6 (7, 8, 9) sts. \*\*

Slip next 17 (17, 17, 19) sts onto a stitch-holder and leave. With right side facing, join M to rem 19 (22, 23, 25) sts for right side of neck and knit to

Rep from \*\* to \*\*, working 1 row more before shoulder.

#### SLEEVES

Using 3.25mm needles and C, cast on 43 (45, 45, 47) sts.

Row 1: K2, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to last st. K1.

Row 2: K1, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows 3 times (8 rows rib in all).

Change to 4 00mm needle

Change to 4.00mm needles and M for rem.

Work 2 rows stocking st. Inc one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row 2 (2, 3, 3) times. 49 (51, 53, 55) sts.

Work 1 row.

#### Shape Top

Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 45 (47, 49, 51) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 4th row until 33 (33, 35, 35) sts rem, then in every foll alt row until 29 (31, 31, 33) sts rem.

Next Row: P1, \* P2tog, rep from \* to end. 15 (16, 16, 17) sts. Cast off.

#### NECKBAND

Join shoulder seams. With right side facing and using set of 3.25mm double-pointed needles and C, knit up 17 (19, 21, 21) sts evenly along left side of neck, knit across sts from front stitchholder, knit up 17 (19, 21, 21) sts evenly along right side of neck, then knit across sts from back stitch-holder. 82 (86, 90, 94) sts.

Round 1: \* K1, P1, rep from \* to end

Rep last round 4 times. Cast off loosely in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join side seams of bodice. Join sleeve seams, then sew in position, easing fullness into top of armhole.

Row 8: Knit.

Row 9: K4. P5. K4.

Row 10: Knit.

Row 11: K4, P5, K4.

Row 12: K, increase in first and last stitch, 15sts.

Row 13: K4, P7, K4.

Row 14: Knit.

Row 15: K4, P7, K4.

Row 16: K. increase in first and last stitch, 17sts.

Row 17: K4. P9. K4.

Row 18: Knit.

Row 19: K4, P9, K4.

Slip stitches onto a holder.

#### HAT

Row 1: Using B cast on 10 (10. 12, 13, 15) sts, K across 17 sts of ear flap (right side facing), cast on 20 (22, 25, 27, 30) sts, K across 17 sts on 2nd ear flap, cast on 10 (10, 12, 13, 15) sts. 74 (76, 83, 87, 94) sts.

Row 2: Knit.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Knit.

Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: Knit.

Row 7: Change to A, K.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: Knit.

Row 10: Purl.

Row 11: Change to B. K. Continue in st st changing colour after every fourth row until hat measures 7 (7.8. 9. 9) cm. from cast on edge. ending on a P row. 74 (76, 83, 87. 94) sts.

#### Shape Top

(Continue to keep stripe sequence correct)

Row 1: K1 (2, 1, 3, 2), \*K2tog, K6 (6, 7, 7, 8), \* repeat from \* to \* 8 times, K1 (2, 1, 3, 2). 65, (67, 74, 78, 85) sts.

Row 2 and every alternate

row: Purl to end.

Row 3: K1 (2, 1, 3, 2), \*K2tog, K5 (5, 6, 6, 7), \* repeat from \* to \* 8 times, K1 (2, 1, 3, 2). 56 (58, 65, 69, 76) sts.

Row 5: K1 (2, 1, 3, 2), \*K2tog, K4 (4, 5, 5, 6), \* repeat from \* to \* 8 times, K1 (2, 1, 3, 2). 47 (49, 56, 60, 67) sts.

Row 7: K1 (2, 1, 3, 2), \*K2tog, K3 (3, 4, 4, 5), \* repeat from \* to \* 8 times, K1 (2, 1, 3, 2). 38 (40, 47, 51, 58) sts.

Row 9: K1 (2, 1, 3, 2), \*K2tog, K2 (2, 3, 3, 4), \* repeat from \* to \* 8 times, K1 (2, 1, 3, 2). 29 (31, 38, 42, 49) sts.

Row 11: K1 (2, 1, 3, 2), \*K2tog, K1 (1, 2, 2, 3), \* repeat from \* to \* 8 times, K1 (2, 1, 3, 2). 20 (22, 29, 33, 40) sts.

Row 13: K0 (0, 1, 1, 0), K2tog to end. 10 (11, 15, 17, 20) sts.

Row 14: Purl 0 (1, 1, 1, 0). P2tog to end. 5 (6, 8, 9, 10) sts.

Break yarn leaving long end and pull this end through the remaining stitches. Pull tight and fasten off.

Work in loose ends. Join centre back seam by topsewing.

#### **OUTER EARS (MAKE 2)**

Row 1 to 4: Using B. cast on 40 sts and K 4 rows

Row 5: Purl

Row 6: \*K2, K2tog, rept from \* to end. 30sts.

Row 7: Purl.

Row 8: \*K1, K2tog, rept from \* to end 20sts

Row 9: Purl

Row 10: K2tog to end. 10sts.

Row 11: P2tog to end. 5sts. Leave a long end and pull this through all 5 sts, pull tight then use to sew row ends together forming a circle. Fasten off.

#### **INNER EARS (MAKE 2)**

Row 1 and 2: Cast on 30 sts and knit 2 rows.

Row 3: Purl.

Row 4: \* K1, K2tog, rept from \* to end. 20sts.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: K2tog to end. 10sts.

Row 7: P2tog to end. 5sts. Leave a long end and pull this through all 5 sts. pull tight then use end to sew row ends together forming a circle. Fasten off

Stitch inner and outer ears together (wrong sides together using an over stitch). Sew in place on top of hat.

#### **BRAIDS (MAKE 2)**

Using 2 strands, one from each colour, wrap 15 times around a piece of card approx. 21cm. Cut along one end then fold strands in half and pull through the end of the earflap pieces. Split into three equal sections then plait, tie off ends and trim.

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# PRINTED CROCHET **AFGHAN**

Design by Gitta Schrade for Naturally Yarns

#### **GETTING STARTED**

### NOTE: Work all Loval Pattern Prints balls either from the inside of the ball or the outside.

Each ball of Loyal Pattern Prints will make 12 circles. This afghan has been made by working all 12 circles of one ball and keeping them in that order on a spare end of yarn (or a pin or in a bag); then I have moved on to the next ball of yarn and done the same. When all 9 balls of Loyal Pattern Prints are used up and picot round has been completed, the 12 circles of

each ball are laid out in one row and joined.

The Loyal Pattern Prints balls have been used in the following order: 3002, 3000. 3004, 3003, 3002, 3001. 3005, 3000, 3002. As each ball makes 12 circles there is a total of 108 circles in this afghan plus 88 filler flowers.

#### WORKING PATTERN BASE CIRCLE

(make 12 per each ball of Loyal Pattern Prints) Ch 2.

Round 1: RS - Work 8 dc into 2nd ch from hook: join round with sl st into first dc.

Round 2: RS - Ch 1; work 2 dc into each st of previous round: ioin round with sl st into first dc. 16 dc.

Round 3: Ch 1: 2 dc into first st: \*dc 1 into next st, 2 dc into next st; rep from \* to last st, end 1 dc into last st: join round with sl st into first dc. 24 dc.

Round 4: Ch 1; 1 dc into first st; \*dc 2 into next st, 1 dc into each of next 2 sts; rep from \* to last 2 sts, end 2 dc into next st, 1 dc into last st; join round with sl st into first dc. 32 dc.


Round 5: Ch 1. 2 dc into first st: \*1 dc into each of next 3 sts. 2 dc into next st: rep from \* to last 3 sts, end 1 dc into each of next 3 sts; join round with sl st into first dc. 40 dc. Round 6: Ch 1. 2 dc into first st. 1 dc each into next 19 sts. 2 dc onto next st, 1 dc each into last 19 sts; join round with sl st into first dc. 42 dc.

#### PICOT ROUND

Fasten off.

With RS facing, join Loyal Tweed to circle.

Round 7: RS - Ch 4, 1 dc into same space as joining, 1 dc



into each of next 2 sts; (ch 3, slip st to last dc, 1 dc into each of next 3 sts) 3 times, \*ch 5. slip st to last dc, 1 dc into each of next 3 sts: ch 3, slip st to last dc, 1 dc into each of next 3 sts; ch 5, slip st to last dc, 1 dc into each of next 3 sts\*; (ch 3. slip st to last dc. 1 dc into each of next 3 sts) 4 times; rep from \* to \* once, join with sl to round.

Fasten off.

Mark the four 5-chain loops with spare ends of yarn (these 5-chain loops will be joined

up with same loops of other circles).

#### FILLER FLOWERS (MAKE 88)

Made of Loyal DK. Ch 5.1 dtr into 4th chain from hook: ch 4. sl st into same space. \*ch 4. dtr into same space, ch 4, sl st into same space\* rep from \* to \* twice more. Fasten off.

#### MAKING UP

With RS facing lay out the completed circles with

5-chain loops meeting; join together the 5-chain loops plus the 3-chain loop between them on sides of circle and the top and bottom two 3-chain loops. Join the Filler Flowers into the large openings between the circles.

Block to measurements.

Keeping already existing 7 sts of fronts Moss Stitch correct. patt 6 (6, 8, 8) rows. Cast off loosely in pattern.

Insert sleeves, join side and sleeve seams. Sew on button.

Next Row: WS - Patt 5 (5. 6. 6). p3; (patt 8 (9, 10, 12), p3) 4 times; patt 5 (5, 6, 6).

Next Row: Patt 4 (4, 5, 5), skp. k1, k2tog; (patt 6 (7, 8, 10). skp, k1, k2tog) 4 times; patt 4 (4, 5, 5). 47 (51, 57, 65) sts.

Next Row: Patt 4 (4, 5, 5), p3; (patt 6 (7, 8, 10), p3) 4 times; patt 4 (4, 5, 5).

Next Row: Patt 3 (3, 4, 4), skp. k1, k2tog; (patt 4 (5, 6, 8), skp, k1, k2tog) 4 times; patt 3 (3, 4, 4). 37 (41, 47, 55) sts.

Next Row: Patt 3 (3, 4, 4), p3;

(patt 4 (5, 6, 8), p3) 4 times: patt 3 (3, 4, 4).

Next Row: Patt 2 (2, 3, 3), skp, k1, k2tog; (patt 2 (3, 4, 6), skp, k1, k2tog) 4 times; patt 2 (2, 3, 3). 27 (31, 37, 45) sts.

Next Row: Patt 2 (2, 3, 3), p3; (patt 2 (3, 4, 6), p3) 4 times; patt 2 (2, 3, 3).

Next Row: Patt 1 (1, 2, 2), skp, k1, k2tog; (patt 0 (1, 2, 4), skp, k1, k2tog) 4 times; patt 1 (1, 2, 2). 17 (21, 27, 35) sts.

Next Row: Patt 1 (1, 2, 2), p3; (patt 0 (1, 2, 4), p3) 4 times; patt 1 (1, 2, 2).

# Sizes 6-9 (12-18) months

Next Row: Patt 1 (1), skp, k1, k2tog; (patt 0 (2), skp, k1, k2tog) 4 times; patt 1 (1). 17 (25) sts.

Next Row: Patt 1(1), p3; (patt 0 (2), p3) 4 times; patt 1 (1).

Size 12-18 months only

Next Row: (Skp, k1, k2tog) 5

times, 15 sts. Next Row: Purl.

#### All Sizes

Next Row: RS - K2tog across row, end k1. 9 (11. 9. 8) sts. Next Row: P all sts.

Break yarn, leaving longer end.

#### MAKING UP



Row 1 to 6: \* - Knit.

Row 7: K, wrapping yarn 3 times around needle for each

Row 8: K, dropping extra loops for each st. These 8 rows form patt \*. Cont in patt until Back measures 31(33, 35) cm. Work Rows 1 to 6 once.

#### Change to rib pattern.

Row 1: \*K3, P3, rept from \* to last 3 sts, K3.

Row 2: \* P3, K3, rept from \* to last 3 sts. P3.

These 2 rows form rib patt. Work 6 more rows in rib patt. Place markers at both ends of last row.

MEASUREMENTS

#### Shape For Sleeves

Keeping rib patt as now set cast on 3 sts at beg of next 12 rows. 117 (129, 135) sts. Cont in rib patt throughout until work measures 15cm from marker.

#### SHAPE NECK

#### Dividing Row

Rib 45 (48, 51) cast off 27 (33, 33) rib 45 (48, 51) sts. Work on this last set of 45 (48, 51) sts for left side of neck.

#### LEFT SIDE NECK

Dec 1 st at end of next row and at the same edge on next 5 rows 39 (42, 45) sts. Rib another 6 (6, 8) rows. Inc 1 st at the end of the next row and at the same edge on next 5 rows 45 (48, 51) sts. Rib 1 row. Leave these sts on a st holder.

#### RIGHT SIDE NECK

With WS facing, rejoin yarn to remaining 45 (48, 51) sts. Dec 1 st at beg of next row and at the same edge on next 5 rows 39 (42, 45) sts. Rib another 6 (6, 8) rows. Inc 1 st at beg of next row and at the same edge on next 5 rows. 45 (48, 51) sts. Rib 1 row.

#### Joining Row

Rib 45 (48, 51) sts of Right Side Neck, turn, cast on 27 (33, 33) sts, turn, then rib 45 (48, 51) sts of Left Side Neck, 117 (129,135) sts. Place 2nd marker

Cont in rib patt until work measures 17cm from 2nd marker.

#### SHAPE FOR SLEEVES

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 12 rows 81 (93, 99) sts. Work 8 more rows in rib patt. Change to drop st patt. Complete using drop st patt from \* to \* until Front measures same as Back ending with a 6th row. Cast off.

#### MAKING UP

Join side and underarm seams by top sewing.

Row 1: P2, \* K2, P2, rep from \* to last st. P1.

Row 2: K3, \* P2, K2, rep from \* to end

Row 3: As 1st row.

Row 4: Rib 3. \* cast off 3 sts. rib 17 (incl st rem on righthand needle after casting off). rep from \* 4 more times, rib to end. 5 buttonholes.

Row 5: Rib to first buttonhole. \* turn, cast on 3 sts (bringing yarn to front between needles before slipping 3rd st onto left-hand needle), turn \*\*. rib to next buttonhole \*, rep

from \* to \* 3 times, then rep from \* to \*\* once rib to end 5 buttonholes

Work 4 rows rib. 9 rows in all. Cast off loosely in rib.

#### LEFT FRONT BAND

With RS facing and using 3.75mm circular needle. knit up 20 (22, 24, 24, 24) sts evenly across rem half of back neck, knit up 27 sts evenly across top of left sleeve, knit up 48 (50, 52, 56, 60) sts evenly along front slope to beg of shaping, then knit up 88 sts evenly along straight front edge to lower edge. 183 (187, 191, 195, 199) sts.

Row 1: P3, \* K2, P2, rep from \* to end.

Row 2: K2, \* P2, K2, rep from \* to last st K1 Work a further 7 rows rib. 9 rows rib in all. Cast off loosely in rib.





#### WORKING PATTERN BACK

Using 3.75mm needles, cast on 85 (89, 95, 99, 105, 109)

Row 1: RS - K1, \*P1, K1, repeat from \* to end.

Row 2: P1, \*K1, P1, repeat from \* to end.

These 2 rows form rib. Work in rib for a further 6 rows, ending with a WS row. Row 9: RS - rib 27 (29, 32, 34, 37, 39), (M1, rib 6) twice, M1, rib 2, M1, rib 3, M1, rib 2, M1, (rib 6, M1) twice, rib 27 (29, 32, 34, 37, 39). 93 (97, 103, 107, 113, 117) sts.

Change to 4.50mm needles. Now work in patt as follows:-Counting in from both ends of last row, place markers after 24th (26th, 29th, 31st, 34th, 36th) sts in from both ends of row - there should be 45 sts between markers.

Row 1 and every foll alt row:

WS - P24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36), slip marker onto right needle, K1, (P4, K3) twice, P15, (K3, P4) twice, K1, slip marker onto right needle. P24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36).

Row 2: K2 (1, 1, 3, 3, 2), \*yfwd, knot 3, rep \* to within 1 st of marker, K1. slip marker onto right needle, P1, (K4, P1, yrn, P2tog) twice, K15, (P2tog tbl, yrn, P1, K4) twice, P1, slip marker onto right needle, K2, \*yfwd, knot 3, rept from \* to last 1 (3, 3, 2, 2, 1) sts, K1 (3, 3, 2, 2, 1).

Row 4: K1 (3, 3, 2, 2, 1). \*knot 3, yfwd, rept from \* to within 2 sts of marker, K2, slip marker onto right needle, P1, (C4B, P3) twice, K5, C10B, (P3, C4F) twice, P1, slip marker onto right needle, K1, \*knot 3, yfwd, repeat from \* to last 2 (1, 1, 3, 3, 2) sts, K2 (1, 1, 3, 3, 2). These 4 rows form mesh patt on 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts either side of markers. Keeping mesh patt correct,

Row 6: patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts, slip marker onto right needle, P1, (K4, P1, yrn, P2tog) twice, K15, (P2tog tbl, vrn, P1, K4) twice, P1, slip marker onto right needle. patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36)

cont as follows:-

Row 8: patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts, slip marker onto right needle, P1, (C4B, P3) twice, K15, (P3, C4F) twice,

needle, patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts.

Row 10: patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts, slip marker onto right needle, P1, (K4, P1, yrn, P2tog) twice, C10F, K5, (P2tog tbl, yrn, P1, K4) twice, P1, slip marker onto right needle, patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts.

Row 12: patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts, slip marker onto right needle, P1, (C4B, P3) twice, K15, (P3, C4F) twice, P1, slip marker onto right needle, patt 24 (26, 29, 31, 34, 36) sts.

These 12 rows form patt for 45 sts of cable panel between markers. Keeping mesh patt and cable panel correct as now set, cont straight until back measures 63 (64, 65, 66, 67,68)cm, ending with a WS row.

#### Shape shoulders and back neck

Next Row: RS - cast off 8 (9, 10, 10, 11, 12) sts, patt until there are 23 (23, 25, 26, 28, 29) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder. Work on this set of sts only for first side of neck.

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next row, 8 (9, 10, 10, 11, 12) sts at beg of foll row, then 3 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 9 (8, 9, 10, 11, 11)sts. Return to sts left on holder, rejoin yarn with RS facing, cast off centre 31 (33, 33, 35, 35, 35)sts, patt to end.

Cast off 8 (9, 10, 10, 11, 12) sts at beg of next row, then 3 sts at beg of foll row. Repeat last 2 rows once more. Cast off rem 9 (8, 9, 10, 11, 11)sts.



#### MESH AND CABLE SWEATER



#### FRONT

Work as given for back until 18 (18, 18, 20, 20, 20) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a RS row.

#### Shape front neck

Next Row: RS - patt 36 (37, 40, 42, 45, 47) sts and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder. Work on this set of sts only for first side of neck. Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge of next 8 rows, then on foll 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) alt rows. 25 (26, 29, 30, 33, 35) sts. Work 3 rows, ending with a

# Shape shoulder

WS row.

Cast off 8 (9, 10, 10, 11, 12) sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 9 (8, 9, 10, 11, 11)sts.

Return to sts left on stitch holder, rejoin yarn with rs facing, cast off centre 21 (23, 23, 23, 23, 23)sts, patt to end. 36 (37, 40, 42, 45, 47) sts.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge of next 8 rows, then on foll 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) alt rows. 25 (26, 29, 30, 33, 35) sts.

Work 4 rows, ending with a RS row.

#### Shape shoulder

Cast off 8 (9, 10, 10, 11, 12) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row. Cast off rem 9 (8, 9, 10, 11, 11) sts.

#### LEFT SLEEVE

Using 3.75mm needles, cast on 39 (39, 41, 43, 43, 45) sts. Work in rib as given for back for 8 rows, ending with a ws

Row 9: RS - rib 14 (14, 15, 16, 16, 17), (M1, rib 6) twice, M1, rib 13 (13, 14, 15, 15, 16). 42 (42, 44, 46, 46, 48) sts.
Change to 4.50mm needles.

Row 1: WS - P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14), K1, (P4, K3) twice, P4, K1, P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14). Row 2: K1 (1, 2, 3, 3, 1). (vfwd. knot 3) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K1, P1, (K4, P1, yrn, P2tog) twice, K4, P1, K2, (yfwd, knot 3) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K0 (0, 1, 2, 2, 0). Row 3: P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14). K1, (P4, K3) twice, P4, K1, P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14). Row 4: K0 (0, 1, 2, 2, 0). (knot 3, yfwd) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, times, K2, P1, (C4B, P3) twice, C4B, P1, K1, (knot 3, yfwd) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K1 (1, 2, 2, 3, 1).

These 4 rows form sleeve patt.

\*\*\*Cont in patt, shaping sides by inc 1st at each end of 2nd and every foll 4th row to 60 (60, 66, 62, 74, 66) sts, then on every foll 6th row until there are 78 (78, 82, 82, 86, 86) sts taking inc sts into mesh patt.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 45 (45, 46, 46, 46, 47)cm, ending with a WS row. Cast off.

#### RIGHT SLEEVE

Work as given for left sleeve to \*\*

Row 1: WS - P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14), K1, (P4, K3) twice, P4, Row 2: K1, P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14), K1 (1, 2, 3, 3, 1), (yfwd,

knot 3) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K1, P1, (K4, P2tog tbl, yrn, P1) twice, K4, P1, K2, (yfwd, knot 3) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K0 (0, 1, 2, 2, 0).

Row 3: P11 (11, 12, 13, 13,14), K1, (P4, K3) twice, P4, K1, P11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 14).

Row 4: K0 (0, 1, 2, 2, 0), (knot 3, yfwd) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K2, P1, (C4F, P3) twice, C4F, P1, K1, (knot 3, yfwd) 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times, K1 (1, 2, 2, 3, 1). These 4 rows form sleeve patt. Complete as given for left sleeve from \*\*\*.

#### NECKBAND

Join right shoulder seam by top sewing.

With RS facing and using 3.75mm needles, pick up and knit 18(18, 18, 20, 20, 20) sts down left side of neck, 17 (19, 19, 19, 19, 19) sts from front, 18 (18, 18, 20, 20, 20) sts up right side of neck, and 38 (40, 40, 42, 42, 42) sts from back: 91 (95, 95, 101, 101, 101) sts. Starting with row 2, work in rib as given for back for 5 rows, ending with a WS row. Cast off in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Join left shoulder and neckband seam by top sewing. Mark points along side seam edges 21 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23)cm, either side of shoulder seams and sew cast-off edge of sleeves to body between these points. Join side and sleeve seams by top sewing.

#### SHAPE ARMHOLES

Cast off 9 (10, 10, 11, 11) sts beg next 2 rows. Dec 1 st each end next 6 (6. 7, 7, 8) rows.

Dec 1 st each end every RS row 4 times. 75 (87, 101, 113, 125) sts.

Stocking st straight until piece measures 59 (64, 66, 67, 69) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

#### SHAPE NECK AND SHOULDERS

Next Row: RS - K29 (33, 40, 44, 49) sts, turn, on these sts only.

Cast off 4 (4, 5, 5, 5) sts beg next 3 WS rows.

Next Row: RS - Cast off 8 (10. 12, 14, 17) sts for shoulder, k to end.

Cast off rem 9 (11, 13, 15, 17) sts for shoulder. Return to sts on hold, slip

next 17 (21, 21, 25, 27) sts to holder for centre back neck. rejoin yarn, work 2nd half to match, reversing shapings.

#### FRONT

Work as for back, shape armholes as for back, and at same time, when front measures 45 (49, 51, 52, 53) cm from beg, end with a WS row and mark centre front

Next Row: K to 2 sts before marked st, k2tog, slip centre front st to holder, join new ball of yarn, skp, k to end. Complete both sides at same time, dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 16 (18. 25, 27, 28) times, then every other RS row 4 (4, 0, 0, 0) times. 17 (21, 25, 29, 34) sts

Cont straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, shape shoulders as for back.

Join left shoulder seam.







#### Shape Neck

Keeping patt correct, cast off 7 (7, 7, 8, 8, 8) sts at beg of next row. 15 (18, 21, 22, 24, 25) sts.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 5 (7, 8, 3, 3, 5) rows, then in every foll alt row 1 (0, 0, 4, 4, 3) times. 9 (11, 13, 15, 17, 17) sts.

Work 1 (1, 0, 1, 1, 1) rows.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 5 (6, 7, 8, 9, 9) sts at beg of next row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 4 (5, 6, 7, 8, 8)

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join side and shoulder seams. With right side facing and using 3.00mm hook (beg at lower edge of right front), work 1 row dc evenly along right front edge and neck shaping, evenly across back neck, then along left front neck shaping and front edge to lower edge, fasten off. Work same edging around each armhole edge (beg at side seam).

Make 2 ties: Using 3.00mm hook, make a length of ch 19cm long.

Row 1: Miss 1ch, 1dc in each ch to end. Fasten off. Attach a tie to each front as pictured.

Row 8: As 4th row. Rows 1 to 8 incl form patt. Cont in patt until beanie measures 15 (17, 18) cm from beg, ending with patt row 2, 4 or 8.

#### Shape Crown

Row 1: P2tog, \* patt 6, P2tog, patt 5, P2tog, rep from \* to end. 105 (118, 131) sts.

Row 2: \* K1, patt 5, K1, P6, rep from \* to last st, K1. Row 3: P1, \* patt 6, P1, patt

5, P1, rep from \* to end. Row 4: As 2nd row.

Row 5: P1, \* K2tog, K2, K2tog tbl, P1, patt 5, P1, rep from \* to end. 89 (100, 111) sts. Row 6: \* K1, patt 5, K1, P4, rep from \* to last st, K1. NOTE: When working cable in foll rows, work C4B in place of C6B.

Row 7: P1, \* patt 4, P1, patt 5, P1. rep from \* to end.

Row 8: As 6th row.

Row 9: P1, \* patt 4, P2tog, patt 3, P2tog tbl, rep from \* to end. 73 (82, 91) sts.

Row 10: \* K1, patt 3, K1, P4, rep from \* to last st, K1.

Row 11: P1, \* patt 4, P1, patt 3, P1, rep from \* to end.

Row 12: As 10th row.

Row 13: P1, \* K2tog, K2tog tbl, P1, patt 3, P1, rep from \* to end. 57 (64, 71) sts.

Row 14: \* K1, patt 3, K1, P2, rep from \* to last st, K1. Row 15: P1, \* K2, P2tog, patt

1, P2tog tbl, rep from \* to end. 41 (46, 51) sts. Row 16: \* K1, patt 1, K1, P2,

rep from \* to last st, K1. Row 17: P1, \* K2tog, P1, patt 1, P1, rep from \* to end. 33 (37, 41) sts.

Row 18: \* K1, patt 1, K1, P1, rep from \* to last st, K1. Row 19: P1, \* P2tog, rep from \* to end. 17 (19, 21) sts. Break off yarn, thread end

through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join back seam, reversing seam for 3/4 of rib band for brim. Fold rib band in half onto right side. Make a small pom-pom and attach securely to top of beanie.

Row 4: K1 (4, 2, 0); \*k4, p4, k3; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, k1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 5: P1 (4, 2, 0); \*p3, slip 3 sts onto cn and hold at front of work, p1, k3 from cn, k3, p1; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, p1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 6: K1 (4, 2, 0); \*k1, p6, k4; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, k1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 7: P1 (4, 2, 0); \*p4, k2, slip 1 st onto cn and hold at back of work, k3, p1 from cn, p1; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, p1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 8: K1 (4, 2, 0); \*k2, p5, k4; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, k1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 9: P1 (4, 2, 0); \*p4, k1, slip 1 st onto cn and hold at back of work, k3, p1 from cn, p2; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, p1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 10: K1 (4, 2, 0); \*k3, p4, k4; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, k1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 11: P1 (4, 2, 0): \*p1, k3, slip 1 st onto cn and hold at back of work, k3, p1 from cn, p3; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, p1 (4, 2, 0).

Row 12: K1 (4, 2, 0); \*k4, p6, k1; rep from \* to last 1 (4, 2, 0) sts, k1 (4, 2, 0). Rep these 12 rows for main patt throughout.

Pattern until work measures 19 (21, 25, 28) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

#### SHAPE ARMHOLES

Keeping patt correct, cast off 3 sts beg next 2 rows. Dec 1 st each end next 2 (2, 3, 4) rows, then every RS row 3 (4, 4, 4) times more. 63 (67, 72, 77) sts. Patt straight until piece measures 32 (35, 40, 44) cm

from beg, end with a WS row.

Row 5: K4. (6, 8, 2, 4, 6, 8). yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, psso, repeat from \* to last 4 sts, K2, K2tog.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: K8 (2, 4, 6, 8, 2, 4), yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 7 sts. K5. K2tog.

Row 10: Purl.

Row 11: K6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2), \* K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K3, repeat from \* to last 2 sts. K2.

Row 12: Purl.

Row 13: K8 (2, 4, 6, 8, 2, 4), yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 6 sts, K4, K2tog.

Row 14: Purl

Row 15: Knit

Row 16: Purl.

Continue in patt as set, dec 1 st at Front edge on the next and every following 4th row until 37 (39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49) sts remain.

Work 3 rows, finishing on an 8th patt row.

Work should measures 33.5cm from commencement. Mark end of last row with a coloured thread to indicate start of armhole.

SLEEVE LENGTH	40.5	40.5	41	41	42.5	42.5	42.5CM

Row 9: K2tog, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 7 (1, 3, 5, 7, 1, 3) sts, K to end. Row 10: Purl.

Row 11: K2, \* K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2) sts, K6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2).

Row 12: Purl.

Row 13: K2tog, \* K5, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K1, repeat from \* to last 6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2) sts, K6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2).

Row 14: Purl. Row 15: Knit. Row 16: Purl.

Continue in patt as set, dec 1 st at Front edge on the next and every following 4th row until 37 (39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49) sts remain.

Work 3 rows finishing on an 8th patt row.

Work should measure same as Left Front to armhole. Mark beg of last row with a coloured thread to indicate start of armhole.

Work from \*\* to \*\* of Left Front.

#### BACK

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 67 (71, 75, 79, 83, 87, 91)

Work 17 rows in rib as given for Left Front finishing on a 1st row.

Next Row: inc row - Rib 3 (2, 2, 1, 3, 3, 5), inc in next st, \* rib 11(12, 13, 14, 14, 15, 15), inc in next st, rept from \* to last 3 (3, 2, 2, 4, 3, 5) sts, rib to end. 73 (77, 81, 85, 89, 93, 97) sts.





Change to 5.50mm needles. Commence Patt

Row 1: RS - K4, (6, 8, 2, 4, 6, 8), yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 3 (5, 7, 1, 3, 5, 7) sts, K to end.

Row 2 and alt rows: Purl. Row 3: K2 (4, 6, 0, 2, 4, 6), K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 2 (4, 6, 0, 2, 4, 6) sts. K2 (4, 6, 0, 2, 4, 6).

Row 5: As 1st row.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 9: K8 (2, 4, 6, 8, 2, 4), yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 7 (1, 3, 5, 7, 1, 3) sts, K to end.

Row 11: K6 (0 2, 4, 6, 0, 2), K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2) sts, K6 (0, 2, 4, 6, 0, 2). Row 13: As 9th Row.

Row 15: Knit.

Row 16: Purl.

These 16 rows form the patt Continue in patt until Back measures same as Left Front to armhole finishing on an 8th patt row. (Mark each end of last row with a coloured thread to indicate start of armholes.) Continue in patt until armholes measure same as Left Front to shoulder finishing on a wrong side row.

#### Shape Shoulders

Cast off 11(12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts at beg of next 2 rows and 12 (13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18) sts at beg of following 2 rows. Cast off remaining 27 sts.

SLEEVES (BOTH ALIKE) Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 31(33, 33, 35, 35, 37, 37) sts. Work 5 (5, 6.5, 6.5, 7.5, 7.5, 7.5)cm, in rib as given for Left Front, finishing on a 1st row.

Next Row: inc row - Rib 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 4, 4), inc in next st, \* rib 4 (3, 3, 5, 2, 3, 2), inc in next st, rept from \* to last 3 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 5) sts, rib to end. 37 (41, 41, 41, 45, 45, 47) sts.

Row 1: RS - K2 (4, 4, 4, 6, 6, 7), yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 1 (3, 3, 3, 5, 5, 6) sts, K to end.

Change to 5.50mm needles.

Row 2: Purl.

Commence Patt

Row 3: K0 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 5), K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 0 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 5) sts, K0 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 5).

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: Inc in first st, K1 (3, 3, 3, 5, 5, 6), yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K6, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, repeat from \* to last 1 (3, 3, 3, 5, 5, 6) sts, K0 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 5) inc in last st.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

Continue in 16 row patt as set and working all inc sts into patt, inc 1 st at each end of the needle on the 1st (3rd, 1st, 1st, 1st, 1st, 1st, 1st) and every following 4 (6, 4, 4, 4, 4, 4)th row until 47 (63, 51, 63, 67, 67, 75) sts are on the needle.

#### 76 (86, 91, 97, 102, 107)cm sizes only

Inc 1 st at each end of the needle on every following 6th row until 63 (67, 71, 75, 75, 79) sts are on the needle.

#### All Sizes

Continue without further inc until Sleeve measures 45.5 (45.5, 47, 47, 48, 48, 48) cm, from commencement finishing on an 8th patt row. Cast off loosely.

#### MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams by top sewing. Mark centre of back neck with

Mark centre of back neck with a coloured thread.

#### Left Front Band

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 7 sts.

Work in rib as given for Left Front until band is long enough when slightly stretched to fit up Left Front and across back neck to marker finishing on a 2nd row.

#### Right Front Band

Cast off in rib.

Work as instructions given for Left Front Band working buttonholes on the 3rd and 15th rows as follows:Next Row: Buttonhole Row-Rib 3, yfwd, K2tog, rib 2.
Join side seams to markers and sleeve seams by top sewing.

Pin sleeves into position, sew in by top sewing.
Pin front bands into position, sew on by top sewing.
SI st front bands together at back neck.
Sew on buttons.



Row 2: P1, \* K1, P1; rept from \* to end.

These 2 rows form rib. Work in rib for a further 6 rows.

Next Row: K. Next Row: P.

Cont in st st for a further 21 rows, ending on a RS row. Commence Lace Panel

\*\* Row 1: WS - Knit.

Row 2: P1, \*vrn, P2tog; rept from \* to end.

Row 3 and 4: Knit

Row 5 and every wrong side row to 15: Purl.

Row 6: \*K4, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso; repeat from \* to last 3 sts. K3.

Row 8: K2, \*K2tog, yfwd, K1,

yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K1; rept from \* to last st, K1.

Row 10: K1, K2tog, yfwd, \* K3, yfwd, sl 1, K2tog, psso, yfwd; rept from \* to last 6 sts, K3, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso,

Row 12: K3, \*vfwd, sl 1, K2tog, psso, yfwd, K3; rept from \* to end.

Row 14: As 6th row.

Row 16: Knit.

Rept 1st to 16th row once. then 1st to 4th rows, once. \*\*

Next Row: WS - P. Next Row: RS - K. Cont in st st until work measures 40cm.

#### Shape Sleeves

Cont working in st st shaping sleeves as follows:-Inc 1 st at both ends of next row

Work 3 rows.

\*\*\*Inc 1 st at both ends of next row. Work 1 row. \*\*\* Repeat from \*\*\* to \*\*\* once more

Inc 1 st at both ends of next 8 rows

Next Row: Cast on 10 sts. work to end.

Next Row: Cast on 10 sts. work to end. 153 (159, 165, 171, 177, 183) sts.

#### PLACE LACE PANEL

Work 36 rows of lace panel from \*\* to \*\*.

Next Row: WS - P. Next Row: RS - K.

Cont straight in st st for a further 20 (24, 26, 30, 32, 36) rows.

#### Shape Shoulders and Back Neck

Cont in st st, shape shoulders as follows:-Cast off 8 (9, 9, 9, 10, 10) sts at beg of next 4 (8, 6, 2, 8, 2) rows, then 9 (0, 10, 10, 0, 11) sts at beg of foll 4 (0, 2, 6, 0, 6) rows. 85 (87, 91, 93, 97, 97) sts.

Next Row: Cast off 9 (9, 10, 10, 11, 11) sts, work until there are 12 (12, 13, 13, 14, 14) sts on right needle and turn, leave rem sts on a st holder. Work on this set of sts only for first side of neck. Cast off 3 sts at beg of next

Cast off rem 9 (9, 10, 10, 11, 11) sts.

With RS facing rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 43 (45, 45, 47, 47, 47) sts, patt

Cast off 9 (9, 10, 10, 11, 11) sts at beg of next row, then 3 sts at beg of foll row. Cast off rem 9 (9, 10, 10, 11, 11) sts.

#### ARMHOLE BORDERS (BOTH ALIKE)

With RS facing, using 4.00mm needles, pick up and K97 (103, 105, 111, 115, 121) sts evenly along straight row-end edges of armhole openings, starting and ending at cast on sts at end of sleeve shaping. Starting with row 2, work in rib as given for back for 5 rows, ending with a WS row. Cast off in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams by top sewing; join side and armhole border seams by top sewing.

Arm warnmers: 3 balls 100gm Panda B.I.G in colour 1025 Plain matching yarn Scarf: 3 balls 100gm Panda B.I.G in colour 1033

#### Needles and tools

Arm warmers: 10mm knitting needles Wool sewing needle Scarf: 15mm knitting needles Wool sewing needle

#### Tension

Arm warmers: 9 sts by 12 rows over rib pattern on 10mm needles to 10cm Scarf: Correct tension is not essential for this scarf.



#### WORKING PATTERN ARM WARMERS (MAKE 2)

Using 10mm needles, cast on 18 sts.

#### Beg Rib Patt

Row 1: K2, \* P2, K2 rep from \* to end.

Row 2: P2, \* K2, P2 rep from \* to end.

Last 2 rows form rib. Cont in rib until panel measures approx 35cm from beg, ending with a 2nd row. Cast off loosely in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Fold panel in half lengthways. Using plain yarn and a flat seam, join

sides, leaving a 4cm opening for thumb, positioned 2cm from one end. Sew in ends.

#### KNOTTED SCARF

NOTE - To keep the scarf edges neat, when starting new balls of yarn, join new ball 2 sts in from the edge. The ends can then be sewn in vertically along the rib line.

#### WORKING PATTERN

Using 15mm needles, cast on 11 sts

#### Beg Rib Patt

Row 1: K1, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to end.

Row 2: P1, \* K1, P1, rep from \* to end.

Last 2 rows form rib. Cont in rib until scarf measures approx 180cm from beg.

Cast off loosely in rib.

#### MAKING UP


Do not press. Sew in ends. Tie a knot at each end of scarf and tighten, as pictured.

Row 5: K1, P1, K2, P16, K1, P1, K1. P1.

Row 6: P1, K1, P2, C8B, C8F, P1. K1. P1. K1.

Row 7: K1. P1. K2. P16. K1. P1.

Row 8: P1, K1, P2, K16, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 9: K1, P1, K2, P16, K1, P1,

Row 10: P1, K1, P2, K16, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 11: K1, P1, K2, P16, K1, P1. K1. P1.

Row 12: P1. K1. P2. K16. P1. K1, P1, K1.

Repeat last 12 rows until work measures "" from beginning (missing measurement) Work 6 rows in 2 x 2 rib. Cast off loosely in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Sew buttons down right hand side of cable panel close to side moss st edging, placing them in line with button holes.

Row 12: RS - \*Purl 1, drop yarn over\* repeat from \* to \* until last stitch, purl 1.

Design note: if you are planning to use a different colour yarn for the back, change colour now. On the next row knit 52 stitches, turn work and cast on 46 stitches, knit 52 stitches.

Continue pattern until same length as first 'side'. Cast off all stitches

#### MAKING UP

Fold in half with neck hole at top and hems at the bottom, with right sides facing. Use your darning needle and some extra yarn to stitch each side from 'cuff' in towards centre approx. 15cm. This forms the sleeves

# **GLOSSARY**

#### **BEGINNER'S TOOL KIT**

#### PINS

Plastic-head pins are useful for checking tension and blocking out



items. Pins with coloured heads are best because they do not get lost in your work.

#### **ROW COUNTER**

A row counter is helpful worked, particularly where



#### KNITTING NEEDLES

Knitting needles are made from plastic, aluminium or wood and come in varying lengths and widths. Straight needles come in pairs and doublepointed needles come in sets of four.

#### KNITTING BAG

A knitting bag is essential for those who like to knit 'on the go'. Not only is it a practical way to keep all your knitting paraphenalia together, it also helps keep the yarn clean and tangle-free.



for keeping track of rows increases, decreases or other kinds of patterning occur.



#### CIRCULAR KNITTING NEEDLES

Circular needles have two working ends joined by a thin nylon wire. They are more balanced than straight needles and allow the weight of your work to rest in your lap.



#### KNITTING IN ELASTIC

Elastic yarn prevents sagging in cuffs, collars and waists. You can work it in with knitting yarn on knitted or crocheted garments.



#### TAPE MEASURE

A basic tape measure is essential for checking your garment measurements.



#### KNITTER'S NEEDLES

Knitter's needles need to have a large eye and a blunt point so they do not split stitches when sewing up your knitting.




#### STITCH GAUGE

A stitch gauge is a flat piece of metal or plastic with a ruler marked on one side and/or a window

cut out in the centre. It allows you to mark and measure easily and accurately.

#### STITCH HOLDER

A stitch holder is used to secure stitches not in use. You can also use safety pins for holding a small number of stitches.




#### **CASTING ON**

Casting on is creating a row of loops on a knitting needle to form the base row for your knitting. One of the most popular methods of casting on is the cable cast on. Form a slipknot about 25cm away from the end of the varn.

Place the slipknot on a knitting needle and pull gently to secure. Hold this needle in your left hand. Insert the right-hand needle through the slip knot. Pass the yarn over the point of the right-hand needle (see Diagram 1).


Pull a loop through the slip knot with the right-hand needle (see Diagram 2). Place this loop on the lefthand needle and gently pull the yarn to secure the stitch. For the remaining cast-on stitches, insert the right hand needle between the slip knot and the first stitch on the left-hand needle. Wind the yarn around the point of the right-hand needle. Draw a loop through and place this loop on the left-hand needle. Continue in this manner until you have cast on the desired number of stitches.

#### KNIT STITCH



Once you have cast on, you then knit into the stitches you have made to form the knitted fabric. Hold the needle with the cast on stitches in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the back of your work. Insert the right-hand needle from left to right through the front of the first stitch on the left-hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from left to right over the point of the right-hand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the yarn through the stitch to form a new stitch on the right-hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left-hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right-hand needle. To knit a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left-hand needle to the righthand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

#### **PURL STITCH**



The purl stitch is basically the reverse of the knit stitch. Hold the needle with the stitches on in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the front of your work. Insert the right-hand needle from right to left into the front of the first stitch on the left hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from right to left over the point of the righthand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the yarn through the

stitch to form a new stitch on the right-hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left-hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right-hand needle. To purl a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left-hand needle to the righthand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

#### **CASTING OFF**

#### KNITWISE


Knit two stitches. Use the point of the left-hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right-hand needle over the second, and drop if off the needle. Knit the next stitch on the left-hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right-hand needle again, and repeat. Continue in this manner

Diagram 1

until all the stitches have been worked off the left-hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right-hand needle. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail and thread the yarn through the loop and pull it firmly to fasten off.

#### PURLWISE

Purl two stitches. Use the point of the left-hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right-hand needle over the second, and drop it off the needle. Purl the next stitch on the left-hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right-hand needle again, and



repeat. Continue in this manner until all the stitches have been worked off the left-hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right-hand needle. Secure this last stitch as described in casting off knitwise.

#### SUBSTITUTING YARNS

If you substitute or spin a yarn for a project, you can compare the weight of the yarn to the project yarn by comparing wraps per inch. Wrap your yarn around a ruler for one inch and count the number of wraps. If you have more wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thin; if you have fewer wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thick



#### KNITTING TENSION


Checking your knitting tension, that is, the tightness or looseness of your knitting, is important. To check your tension, cast on 30 stitches using the recommended needle size. Work in the pattern until your work measures 10cm from the cast on edge then cast off. You now have a "swatch". Measure your tension by placing a ruler over your swatch and counting the number of stitches


across and rows down (including fractions of stitches and rows) in 10cm. Repeat these measurements two to three times on a different parts of the swatch to check your measurements. If you have more stitches and rows than called for in the instructions, you should use larger needles; if you have fewer, use smaller needles. Check your tension again before starting your project.

#### PROVISIONAL CAST ON (INVISIBLE CAST ON)

Place a loose slipknot on the needle in your right hand. Hold the waste yarn next to the slipknot and around your left thumb. Hold your working yarn over your left index finger. \*Bring the needle forward under the waste yarn, over the working yarn, grab a loop of working yarn (Diagram

1), then bring the needle to the front, over both yarns, and grab a second loop (Diagram 2). Repeat from \* until you have the desired number of stitches on your needle. When you're ready to work in the opposite direction, pick out the waste yarn to expose the live stitches.





#### BACKSTITCH

This is the stitch most commonly used for joining knitted garments. With the right sides of your work together, pin the knitted fabric together with the edges even. The seam should be sewn one full stitch from the end of the row. One stitch should be worked over every row. Thread the yarn needle. Insert the needle through both layers and sew two stitches to the left then one stitch back to the right. Keep stitches at an even distance. Continue working from right to left in this circular motion. (Diagram 1)

#### **TASSELS**


Cut yarn twice the length of your desired tassel plus a bit extra for the knot. According to the desired thickness of the tassel, select a number of lengths of yarn. Fold the lengths of yarn in half over a crochet hook. On the wrong side, insert the crochet hook from the front to the back through the edge of the work. Grab the yarn and pull through and tighten. Trim the ends to the same length.

#### KNOTTED FRINGE

After working a tassel, take one half of the strands from each tassel and knot them with half the strands from the neighbouring tassel. Trim.




#### CROCHET CHAIN




Make a slip knot on your hook. Pass the yarn over the hook and catch it with the hook and draw it through the loop on the hook. Repeat, drawing yarn through the last loop formed.


#### DOUBLE CROCHET (DC) (US SINGLE CROCHET SC)



Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch. Pass the varn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have two loops on the hook (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw through both loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).


#### HALF TREBLE CROCHET (HTR) (US HALF DOUBLE CROCHET HDC)






Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that there are three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Draw through all three loops on the hook (Diagram 3).





#### TREBLE CROCHET (TR) (US DOUBLE CROCHET DC)

Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw it through the first two loops on the hook, pass the yarn over the hook and draw through the remaining two loops. Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).




#### SLIP STITCH CROCHET (SL ST)

Insert your hook into the stitch. Yarn over the hook and draw the loop through the stitch and loop onto the hook.

#### I-CORD

With double-pointed needles, cast on the desired number of stitches. \*Without turning the needle, slide the stitches to the other end of the needle, pull the yarn around the back and knit the stitches as usual. Repeat from \* until your work measures the desired length



#### **PICKING UP DROPPED STITCHES**

A dropped stitch can be picked up using a crochet hook and don't be put off by stitches that have unraveled several rows down into the work. To pick up knit stitches, insert the crochet hook into the dropped stitch, draw through the bar lying above the dropped stitch and pull it through the loop of the dropped stitch.

Ybk - Yarn back

Y fwd - Yarn forward - bring yarn under the needle, then over to the knitting position again, creating a new stitch.

Yo - Yarn over.
