## LACE TOP

A delicate lace and cable pattern in a more advanced knit.

#### GETTING STARTED

Use a stitch marker placed at the end of each round to identify next round. Slip stitch marker at the end of each round.

#### WORKING PATTERN

Sleeve edging (work both at same time).

Using 4.00mm needle cast on 51sts.

Row 1: edge - knit

Row 2: edge - knit

Row 3: edge eyelets – K2, (yo, K2tog) to last st, K1.

Row 4: edge – knit Leave sts on a holder.

#### MAIN BODY

Using 4.00mm needle cast on 230(276) sts.

Row 1: edging – knit, place stitch marker.

Row 2: edging – purl, slip stitch marker (ssm).

Row 3: edging eyelet – (yo, K2tog) to end.

Row 4: edging – purl. Change to 4.00mm needles and work 32 rounds in lace and rev st st patt as follows:

#### Lace rounds

Round 1: (P7, yo, K3, ssk, K6, K2tog, K3, yo) 10 (12) times. Round 2: (P7, K16) 10 (12)

times.

Round 3: (P7, K1, yo, K3, ssk, K4, K2tog, K3, yo, K1) 10 (12) times.

Round 4: (P7, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 5: (P7, K2, yo, K3, ssk,

K2, K2tog, K3, yo, K2) 10 (12) times.

Round 6: (P7, K16) 10 (12)

Round 7: (P7, K3, yo, K3, ssk, K2, K2tog, K3, yo, K3) 10 (12) times

Round 8: (P7, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 9: decrease – (P2tog, P3, P2tog, yo, K2, ssk, K6, K2tog, K3, yo) 10 (12) times. 210 (252) sts.

Round 10: (P5, K16) 10(12) times.

Round 11: (P5, K1, yo, K3, ssk, K4, K2tog, K3, yo, K1) 10 (12) times.

Round 12: (P5, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 13: (P5, K2, yo, K3, ssk, K2, K2tog, K3, yo, K2) 10 (12) times.

Round 14: (P5, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 15: (P5, K3, yo, K3, ssk, K2tog, K3, yo, K3) 10 (12) times.

Round 16: (P5, K16) 10(12)

Round 17: decrease – (P2tog, P1, yo, K3, ssk, K6, K2tog, K3, yo) 10 (12) times. 190 (228) sts.

Round 18: (P3, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 19: (P3, K1, yo, K3, ssk, K4, K2tog, K3, yo, K1) 10 (12) times.

Round 20: (P3, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 21: (P3, K2, yo, K3, ssk, K2, K2tog, K3, yo, K2) 10 (12) times,

Round 22: (P3, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 23: (P3, K3, yo, K3, ssk, K2tog, K3, yo, K3) 10(12) times.

Round 24: (P3, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 25: decrease – (P3tog, yo, K3, ssk, K6, K2tog, K3, yo) 10 (12) times. Round 26: (P1, K16) 10 (12)

Round 27: (P1, K1, yo, K3, ssk, K4, K2tog, K3, yo, K1) 10 (12) times.

Round 28: (P1, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 29: (P1, K2, yo, K3, ssk, K2, K2tog, K3, yo, K2) 10 (12) times. Round 30: (P1, K16) 10 (12) times.

Round 31: (P1, K3, yo, K3, ssk, K2tog, K3, yo, K3) 10 (12) times.

Round 32: (P1, K16) 10 (12) times.

Change to 3.75mm needle and work 26 round in cable and rib patt setting st as follows:

#### Cable rounds

Round 1, 2, 3 and 4: (P1, K2, P2, K8, P2, K2) 10 (12) times. Round 5: (P1, K2, P2, C4B, C4F, P2, K2) 10 (12) times. Round 6, 7 and 8: (P1, K2, P2, K8, P2, K2) 10 (12) times. The last 4 round form the cable patt rep.





Round 6: (P1, K16) 14 (16)

Round 7: (P1, K3, yo, K3, ssk, K2tog, K3, yo, K3) 14 (16) times.

Round 8: purl.

Round 9: eyelets - (yo,

K2tog) to end. Round 10: purl.

These 10 rounds for the yoke

Work these 10 round 3 times more.

Work yoke decrease as follows:

Round 41: (P1, yo, ssk, K1, ssk, K6, K2tog, K1, K2tog, yo) 14 (16) times. 210 (240) sts. Round 42: (P1, K14) 14 (16) times

Round 43: decrease - (P1, K1, yo, ssk twice, K4, K2tog twice, yo, K1) 14 (16) times. 182 (208) sts.

Round 44: (P1, K12) 14 (16) times

Round 45: decrease - (P1, K2, yo, ssk twice, K2tog twice, yo, K2) 14 (16) times. 154 (176) sts.

Round 46: (P1, K10) 14 (16) times.

Round 47: decrease - (P1, ssk, K1, yo, ssk, K2tog, yo, K1, K2tog) 14 (16) times. 126 (144) sts.

Round 48: purl.

Next Round: discard stitch markers (yo, K2tog) 63 (72) times.

Next Round: knit. Change to 4.00mm needle. turn work and cast off knitwise on WS taking care not to pull stitches too tightly.

#### MAKING UP

Press or block to shape.

## OPEN MESH HAT AND SCARF

Design by Wendy Wools

#### STITCH GUIDE **OPEN MESH HAT**

Using 12.00mm needles cast on 30 sts.

Row 1: (K3. P3) 5 times. Rept this row 4 times more. Row 6: Keeping rib pattern correct, inc in every 5th st.

Row 7: RS - K4, \*(yon) twice, K4. rept from \* to end.

Row 8: P2, P2tog, \*(P1, K1) into 2 yon (P2tog) twice. Rept from \* to last 6 sts, (P1, K1) into 2 yon, P2tog, P2. Row 9: K2, yon, \*K4, (yon) twice. Rept from \* to last 6 sts, K4, yon, K2.

Row 10: P2, P1 into yon, \*(P2tog) twice, P1, K1 into 2 yon, rept from \* to last 7 sts, (P2tog) twice, P1 into von. P2.

Rept 7th to 10th rows twice. then 7th and 8th row once. Next Row: (K2tog) till end. Next Row: (P2tog) till end.

Draw yarn through rem sts, pull up and fasten off securely.

#### MAKING UP

Join back seam by top sewing.

#### SCARF

Using 15.00mm needles cast on 12 sts.

Row 1: P1, \* yon, P2tog, rept from \* to last st. P1. Rept this row until work measures approx 200cm. Cast off.

#### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Hat: 1 ball 100gm Wendy Pampas in shade 2255 Scarf: 3 balls 100gm Wendy Pampas in shade 2255

#### Needles

12.00mm knitting needles 15.00mm knitting needles

#### Tension

Hat: 7.5 sts by 11.5 rows over st st on 12.00mm needles to 10 cm. Scarf: tension is not important.

#### Special abbreviations

yon - yarn over needle

## STRIPE TEXTURE CARDIGAN

8ply design using Cleckheaton California

#### STITCH GUIDE

Note - This cardigan is worked on larger needles and at a looser tension than usually recommended for this yarn.

#### BACK

Using 5.50mm needles and C1, cast on 72 (80, 88, 96,

\*\* Work 3 rows garter st (first row is wrong side).

Change to 6.50mm needles.

#### Beg Patt

Note - Do not break off colour not in use, but carry loosely along side edge of work until needed again.

Using C2, work 2 rows stocking st.

Using C1, work 2 rows garter

Last 4 rows form patt. \*\* Work a further 90 rows patt.

#### Shape Armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast

off 5 (6, 8, 9, 10) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 62 (68, 72, 78, 84) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 52 (56, 58, 62, 66) sts rem.

Work 35 (37, 37, 37, 39) rows.

#### Shape Shoulders

Cast off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 4 rows, then 3 (4, 4, 4, 5) sts at beg of foll 2 rows. Cast off rem 30 (32, 34, 34, 36) sts.

#### LEFT FRONT

Using 5.50mm needles and C1, cast on 37 (41, 45, 49, 53)

Work as for Back from \*\* to

Work a further 90 rows patt.

#### Shape Armhole

Keeping patt correct, cast off 5 (6, 8, 9, 10) sts at beg of next row. 32 (35, 37, 40, 43)

Dec one st at beg of every foll alt row until 27 (29, 30, 32, 34) sts rem.

Work 20 (20, 18, 16, 14) rows.

#### Shape Neck

Row 1: Cast off 4 sts, patt to

Row 2: Patt to last 2 sts. work

Row 3: As 1st row. 18 (20, 21, 23, 25) sts.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 3 rows, then in every foll alt row 3 (4, 5, 4, 4) times. then in every foll 4th row 0 (0, 0, 1, 2) times, 12 (13, 13, 15, 16) sts.

Shape Shoulder

Work 3 rows.

Next row: Cast off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts, patt to last 2 sts, patt 2tog. Work 1 row.

Cast off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next row. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 3 (4, 4, 4, 5) sts.

#### RIGHT FRONT

Using 5.50mm needles and C1, cast on 37 (41, 45, 49, 53)

Work as for Back from \*\* to \*\*.

Next row: K2, K2tog, yfwd (buttonhole), knit to end.

Keeping patt correct, work 23 rows.

Rep last 24 rows twice. then buttonhole row once. 4 buttonholes. Work 18 rows.

#### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

#### Yarn

3, 4, 4, 4, 4 balls 100gm Cleckheaton California 8ply in Colour 1 (C1) 6756 Regal 3, 3, 4, 4, 4 balls 100gm Cleckheaton California 8ply in Colour 2 (C2) 8500 Forest

#### Needles and tools

5.50mm knitting needles 6.50mm knitting needles Wool sewing needle Plain yarn for sewing seams 6 buttons

#### Tension

15.5 sts by 26 rows over patt, on 6.50mm needles to 10cm

#### STRIPE TEXTURE CARDIGAN



#### Shape Armhole

Keeping patt correct, cast off 5 (6, 8, 9, 10) sts at beg of next row. 32 (35, 37, 40, 43) sts. Dec one st at end of next row and foll alt row once. 30 (33. 35, 38, 41) sts. Work 1 row.

Next Row: K2, K2tog, yfwd, patt to last 2 sts. K2tog. Dec one st at end of every foll alt row until 27 (29, 30, 32, 34) sts rem.

Work 21 (21, 19, 17, 15) rows, at same time work a buttonhole (as before) in 24th row from

previous buttonhole. 6 buttonholes in all.

#### Shape Neck

Row 1: Cast off 4 sts, patt to end

Row 2: Patt to last 2 sts. work 2top

Row 3: As 1st row. 18 (20, 21, 23, 25) sts.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 4 rows, then in every foll alt row 2 (3, 4, 3, 3) times. then in every foll 4th row 1 (1, 1, 2, 3) times. 11 (12, 12, 14, 15) sts.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next row and foll alt row. Work 1 row

Cast off rem 3 (4, 4, 4, 5) sts.

#### SLEEVES

Using 5.50mm needles and C1, cast on 34 (36, 38, 40, 42)

Work as for Back from \*\* to \*\*.

Keeping patt correct, inc one st at each end of next row. then in every foll 18th (18th, 10th, 10th, 8th) row until there are 40 (42, 42, 56, 58) sts. then in every foll 20th (20th, 12th, 12th, 10th) row until there are 46 (48, 56, 60, 66)

Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 45cm from beg, working last row on wrong side.

#### Shape Top

Keeping patt correct, cast off 3 (3, 4, 4, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 40 (42, 48, 52, 56) sts. Dec one st at each end of next row, then in foll 4th row once. then in every foll alt row until 26 (30, 32, 38, 38) sts rem, then in every row until 12 (12, 14, 16, 16) sts rem.

Cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Cast off rem 8 (8, 10, 12, 12)

#### FRONT EDGING

Note - We recommend using mattress stitch and plain yarn to sew up your cardigan.

Join shoulder seams. With right side facing, using 5.50mm needles and C1. knit up 82 sts evenly along one front edge.

Work 2 rows garter st. Cast off loosely on wrong side. Rep edging on other front edge.

#### COLLAR

Using 6.50mm needles and C1. cast on 72 (74, 78, 82, 88) sts. Work 3 rows garter st (first row is wrong side). Work 24 rows patt as for Back. Using C1, cast off loosely. With RS of Collar facing, using 5.50mm needles and C1, knit up 18 sts evenly along one side edge.

Work 2 rows garter st. Cast off loosely on wrong side. Rep along other side edge of collar.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Placing centre of collar to centre back neck and using a flat seam, sew cast off edge of collar to neck edge, beginning and ending 1cm inside front edge and easing any fullness into back neck. Placing centre of sleeve to shoulder seam, sew in sleeves evenly. Join side and sleeve seams, matching stripes. Sew on buttons.

## CABLE WRAP AND HAT

A comfortable cable wrap with tie belt and shawl collar; add a cable hat to match





#### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

#### Yarn

Cable Jacket Version 1 (rust coloured cardigan): 15, 17, 17, 18 balls 50gm Jo Sharp Silkroad Aran Tweed in 113 Russet or Dusk 118 Cable Jacket Version 2

(light coloured cardigan): 15, 17, 17, 18 balls 50gm Jo Sharp Silkroad Aran Tweed in 122 Beach

Hat: 1 ball 50gm Jo Sharp Silkroad Aran Tweed in 121 Brindle or Dusk 118

#### Needles

4.50mm knitting needles 5.00mm knitting needles Cable needle

#### Tension

18 sts by 24 rows of Stocking st on 5.00mm needles to 10cm. Cable Panel measures 10.5cm

#### Special abbreviations

T4L (Twist 4 Left) - slip next 3 sts onto cable needle and hold at front of work, purl next st from left hand needle. then knit sts from cable needle

T4R (Twist 4 Right) - slip next st onto cable needle and hold at back of work, knit next 3 sts from left hand needle, then purl st from cable needle.

C6F (Cable 6 Front) - slip next 3 sts onto cable needle and hold at front of work, knit next 3 sts from left hand needle, then knit sts from cable needle.

C6B (Cable 6 Back) - slip next 3 sts onto cable needle and hold at back of work, knit next 3 sts from left hand needle, then knit sts from cable needle.

C4B or C4F (Cable 4 Back or Front) - slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and hold at back (or front) of work. knit next 2 sts from left hand needle, then knit sts from cable needle.

Hat: C6B (Cable 6 Back) slip next 3 sts onto cable needle and hold at back of work, knit next 3 sts from left hand needle, then knit sts from cable needle

#### STITCH GUIDE

Cable 1 (4 sts)

Row 1: (RS) Knit.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: C4F

Row 4: Purl. Repeat these

4 rows.

Cable 2 (4 sts)

Row 1: RS - Knit.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: C4B.

Row 4: Purl. Repeat these

4 rows.

Cable 3 (36 sts)

Row 1: RS - P6, T4L, T4R, p8, T4L, T4R, p6.

Row 2: K7, p6, k10, p6, k7.

Row 3: P7, C6F, p10, C6F, p7.

Row 4: As row 2.

Row 5: P6, T4R, T4L, p8,

T4R, T4L, p6.

Row 6: K6, p3, k2, p3, k8, p3, k2, p3, k6.

Row 7: P5, T4R, p2, T4L, p6,

T4R, p2, T4L, p5.

Row 8: K5, p3, k4, p3, k6, p3,

k4, p3, k5.

Row 9: P5, k3, p4, T4L, p4,

T4R, p4, k3, p5.

Row 10: K5, p3, k5, p3, k4, p3, k5, p3, k5.

Row 11: P5, T4L, p4, T4L, p2,

Row 12: K6, p3, k5, p3, k2, p3, k5, p3, k6.

#### LEFT FRONT

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 58(60, 66, 72) sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 4cm, ending on a WS row and inc 1 st each end last row worked 58(62, 68, 74) sts. Change to 5.00mm needles.

#### Establishment rows:

Row 1: RS - P7 (9, 12, 15) sts, work row 1 Cable 1, work row 1 Cable 3, work row 1 Cable 2. p7 (9, 12, 15) sts.

Row 2: K7 (9, 12, 15) sts. work row 2 Cable 2, work row 2 Cable 3, work row 2 Cable 1, k7 (9, 12, 15) sts. These 2 rows set pattern. Cont. working in pattern as set until length measures 45(45, 47,47) cm (incl. band)\*, ending on a RS row. Shape Front Neck

Next Row: WS - Dec 1 st at beg next row, then 1 st every alt row 5 times, then 1 st at neck edge every 3rd row 14(14, 16, 16) times (38(42, 46, 52) sts, 53(53, 59, 59) shaping rows).

Work 7(7, 1, 1) rows straight. Cast off.

#### RIGHT FRONT

Work as for Left Front to \*. end on a WS row. Cont. as for Left Front to end. rev all shaping.

#### BACK

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 114(120, 132, 144) sts. Work in K2, p2 rib for 4cm, ending on a WS row and inc 4 sts on last row worked. 114(124, 136, 148) sts). Change to 5.00mm needles.

#### Establishment rows:

Row 1: RS

Size A - P7. row 1 Cable 1. row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 2. p4, row 1 Cable 2, p4, row 1 Cable 1, row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 1, p7.

Size B - P9, row 1 Cable 1. row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 2, p7, row 1 Cable 2, p7, row 1 Cable 1, row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 1, p9.

Size C - P12, row 1 Cable 1. row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 2, p6, row 1 Cable 1, p4, row 1 Cable 2, p6, row 1 Cable 2, row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 1. p12.

Size D - P15, row 1 Cable 1. row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 2, p9, row 1 Cable 1, p4, row 1 Cable 2, p9, row 1 Cable 2. row 1 Cable 3, row 1 Cable 1, p15.

Row 2: WS

Size A - K7, row 2 Cable 1. row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1. k4, row 2 Cable 2, k4, row 2 Cable 2, row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1, k7,

Size B - K9, row 2 Cable 1. row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1, k7, row 2 Cable 2, k7, row 2 Cable 2, row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1 k9

Size C - K12, row 2 Cable 1, row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 2, k6, row 2 Cable 2, k4, row 2 Cable 1, k6, row 2 Cable 2. row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1. k12.

Size D - K15, row 2 Cable 1. row 2

Cable 3, row 2 Cable 2, k9, row 2 Cable 2, k4, row 2 Cable 1, k9, row 2 Cable 2, row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1, k15.

These 2 rows set pattern. Cont working in pattern as set until length measures same as fronts. Cast off.

#### SLEEVES

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 48(48, 52, 52) sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 4cm, ending on C row.

Change to 5.00mm needles.

#### Establishment rows:

Row 1: RS - P2 (2, 4, 4), work

row 1 Cable 1, row 1 Cable 3. row 1 Cable 2, p2 (2, 4, 4). Row 2: K2 (2, 4, 4), work row 2 Cable 2, row 2 Cable 3, row 2 Cable 1, k2 (2, 4, 4). These 2 rows set pattern. Keeping pattern correct, at the same time shape sides as follows: inc 1 st each end every 3rd row 4(4, 13, 13) times, then 1 st each end every 4th row 20(20, 14, 14) times, 96(96, 106, 106) sts. 92(92, 95, 95) shaping rows). Work straight until Sleeve

(incl band) measures 44(44,

46, 46) cm. Cast off.

#### MAKING UP

Press all pieces gently, except ribs, on WS using a warm iron over a damp cloth. Using Backstitch join shoulder seams. Centre sleeves and join, join side & sleeve seams using Edge to Edge st on ribs.

Bands With RS facing, using 4.50mm needles, pick up and knit 94 sts along right front from base to neck shaping. Work in p2, k2 rib for 15 rows.

Cast off in rib. Work left side as for right side, picking up from neck shaping to base. Collar Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 150 sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 15 rows. Cast off 3 sts at beg foll 36 rows. Cast off rem 42 sts in rib.

Sew collar into position along cast off edge using Edge to Edge stitch.

Tie Belt Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 10 sts. Work in k1, p1 rib until length measures 170cm. Cast off.

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 100 sts, work in k2, p2 rib for 8 rows, inc 29 sts evenly across last WS row.

Change to 5.00mm needles.

Row 1: P9, (k6, p15) 5 times, k6, p9.

Row 2: K9, (p6, k15) 5 times, p6, k9,

Row 3: P9, (C6B, p15) 5 times, C6B, p9.

Row 4: as for row 2.

Rep these 4 rows until 13cm (incl. band) have been worked, ending on a WS row.

#### Shape crown

Row 1: P2, p2tog, p3, (p2tog, C6B (or k6), p2tog, p4, p2tog, p5) 5 times, p2tog, C6B (or k6), p2tog, p3, p2tog, p2. 110 sts.

Row 2: K7, (p6, k12) 5 times, p6, k7,

Row 3: P2, p2tog, p1, (p2tog, k6 (or C6B), p2tog, p3,

p2tog, p3) 5 times, p2tog, k6 (or C6B), p2tog, p1, p2tog, p2. 91 sts.

Row 4: K5, (p6, k9) 5 times, p6, k5,

Row 5: P1, p2tog, (p2tog, C6B (or k6), p2tog, p2, p2tog, p1) 5 times, p2tog, C6B (or k6), p2tog, p2tog, p1. 72 sts.

Row 6: K3, (p6, k6) 5 times, p6, k3,


Row 7: P1, (p2tog, k6 (or C6B), p2tog) 5 times, p2tog, k6 (or C6B), p2tog, p1. 60





#### Shape Crown

Next Round: \* K1, K2tog, K26 (28, 30, 30), sl 1, K1, psso, rep from \* to end. 116 (124, 132, 132) sts.

Work 1 round.

Next Round: \* K1, K2tog, K24 (26, 28, 28), sl 1, K1, psso, rep from \* to end. 108 (116, 124, 124) sts

Work 1 round.

Next Round: \* K1, K2tog, K22 (24, 26, 26), sl 1, K1, psso, rep from \* to end. 100 (108, 116, 116) sts.

Cont dec in this manner (working 2 less sts in centre of rep) in every foll alt round until 44 (44, 28, 28) sts rem, then in every round until 12 sts rem.

Break off yarn, thread end through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

#### MAKING UP

Do Not Press. Using C and a large pom-pom maker or two circles of cardboard 12cm in diameter with a 3cm hole. make pom-pom and attach securely to crown.



# BABY'S JUMPER AND HAT



#### Heart bobble jumper and hat in 8ply prints.

#### JUMPER BACK

Using 3.25mm needles and C, cast on 53 (57, 65, 69, 73) sts.

Row 1: RS - K1, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to end.

Rep last row for moss st. Work a further 3 rows moss st.

Row 5: K1 \* P1 MB P1 K1, rep from \* to end (if necessary, push bobbles onto right side of work).

Work a further 3 (3, 5, 5, 5) rows moss st, inc 0 (2, 0, 0, 0) sts evenly across last row. 53 (59, 65, 69, 73) sts. Change to 4.00mm needles.

#### Beg Stripe Patt

NOTE: 2 balls of M are used when working stripes. This allows M to be carried up at side edge without breaking off after each stripe.

Row 1: RS - Using M Purl.

Row 2: Knit.

Row 3: Using C, Purl.

Row 4: Using another ball of M. Knit.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: Using C. Knit. Last 6 rows form stripe patt for rem, noting to alternate balls of M (as before).

#### Shape Sides

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 8th (10th, 12th, 14th, 16th) row until 45 (51, 57, 61, 65) sts

Work 5 (7, 9, 11, 9) rows.

#### Shape Armholes

Keeping stripe patt correct, cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 41 (47, 53, 57, 61) sts. Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row 0 (1, 2, 2, 2) times. 39 (43, 47, 51, 55) sts. \*\*

Work 19 (21, 21, 25, 27) rows.

#### Shape Back Neck

Next Row: P11 (12, 14, 15, 17),

Cont on these 11 (12, 14, 15, 17) sts for right side of back

Next Row: K2tog, knit to end.

#### Shape Shoulder

Next Row: Cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 7) sts, purl to last 2 sts, P2tog. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 4 (5, 6, 7, 8) sts. Slip next 17 (19, 19, 21, 21) sts onto stitch-holder and leave for neckband.

With right side facing, join appropriate colour to rem 11 (12, 14, 15, 17) sts for left side of back neck and purl to end.

Next Row: Knit to last 2 sts, K2tog.

Next Row: P2tog, purl to end

Cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 7) sts at beg of next row. Work 1 row Cast off rem 4 (5, 6, 7, 8) sts.

Shape Shoulder

#### FRONT

Work as for Back to \*\*. Work 1 row

#### Divide for Front Opening

Next Row: P17 (19, 21, 23, 25), cast off next 5 sts, purl to end. Cont on these 17 (19, 21, 23, 25) sts for right side of front

Work 7 (9, 9, 11, 13) rows.

#### Shape Neck

Next Row: Cast off 3 (4, 4, 4, sts, purl to end. 14 (15, 17, 19, 21) sts.

Dec one st at neck edge in every foll alt row until 9 (10, 12, 13, 15) sts rem.

Work 2 rows.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 5 (5, 6, 6, 7) sts at beg of next row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 4 (5, 6, 7, 8) sts. With WS facing, join appropriate colour to rem 17 (19, 21, 23, 25) sts for left side of front opening.

#### Shape Neck

Next Row: WS - Cast off 3 (4, 4, 4, 4) sts, knit to end. 14 (15, 17, 19, 21) sts.

Work 8 (10, 10, 12, 14) rows.

Dec one st at neck edge in next row, then in every foll alt row until 9 (10, 12, 13, 15) sts

Work 1 row.

#### Beg Band Patt

Work 8 (8, 10, 10, 10) rows moss st as for Back, inc 0 (2, 2, 0, 0) sts evenly across last row. 29 (31, 31, 33, 33) sts. Change to 4.00mm needles.

#### Beg Stripe Patt

Work 4 rows stripe patt as for Back.

Keeping stripe patt correct,

inc one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 4th (6th, 6th, 8th, 8th) row until there are 37 (39, 41, 43, 45) sts.

Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 11 (13, 16, 19, 21) cm from beg, working last row on wrong side.

#### Shape Top

Keeping stripe patt correct, cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 33 (35, 37, 39, 41) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 25 sts rem, then in every row until 15 sts rem. Cast off rem sts.

#### NECKBAND

Join shoulder seams. NOTE - We suggest using a set of double-pointed needles for ease of working the neckband. Work backwards and forwards in rows.

With RS facing, using set of 3.25mm double-pointed needles and C. knit up 11 (12. 12, 13, 13) sts evenly along right side of front neck to shoulder seam, knit up 3 sts evenly along right side of back neck, knit across sts from back stitchholder, knit up 3 sts evenly along left side of back neck to shoulder seam, then knit up 11 (12, 12, 13, 13) sts evenly along left side of front neck. 45 (49. 49, 53, 53) sts.

Work 5 rows moss st as for Back.

Row 6: K1. \* P1. MB. P1. K1. rep from \* to end. Work 3 rows moss st. Cast off loosely in patt.

#### LEFT FRONT BAND

With RS facing, using 3,25mm needles and C, knit up 13 (13, 13, 17, 17) sts evenly along side edge of neckband and left side of front opening. Complete as for neckband.

#### RIGHT FRONT BAND

With RS facing, using 3,25mm needles and C, knit up 13 (13, 13, 17, 17) sts evenly along right side of front opening and side edge of neckband. Complete as for neckband.

#### HEART BOBBLES (OPTIONAL, MAKE 36)

Using 4.00mm needles and C, cast on one st and cont as folls for bobble - (K1, vfwd, K1, vfwd, K1) all into one st, turn, K5, turn, P5, turn, K5, turn, P5, turn, K2tog, K1, K2tog, turn, sl 1, P2tog, psso.

Fasten off securely, leaving a long end for attaching bobble.

#### MAKING UP

Join side and sleeve seams. Sew in sleeves. Sew end of right front band to 5 sts cast off at centre front. Slipstitch end of left front band in position underneath. If desired, using 18 bobbles for each heart and following diagram, sew bobbles in position to front as pictured.

#### HAT FIRST EAR FLAP

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 5 sts.

Row 1: RS - P1. (K1. P1) twice. Row 2: Inc in first st, K1, P1,

K1 inc in last st. 7 sts. Row 3: Inc in first st. (P1, K1) twice, P1, inc in last st. 9 sts.

Row 4: Inc in first st. (K1. P1) 3 times, K1, inc in last st. 11 sts. Row 5: Inc in first st. (P1. K1) 4 times. P1. inc in last st. 13 sts. Keeping moss st patt correct, inc (as before) in first and last st of every row until there are 31 (35) sts.

Work 0 (2) rows moss st patt \*\* Break off varn and leave sts on a spare needle.

#### SECOND EAR FLAP

Work as for First Ear Flap to \*\*. Do not break off yarn.

#### Beg Hat

Next Row: Patt across Second Ear Flap sts. turn, cast on 11

(13) sts, turn, with right side facing, patt across First Ear Flap sts. turn, cast on 7 sts. turn, 80 (90) sts. Rem of Hat is worked in

rounds. Slip sts onto set of 4.00mm double-pointed needles so that right side is facing, dividing sts as evenly as possible between 3 needles. Join to work in rounds, taking care not to twist cast on edges.

Round 1: \* K1. P1. rep from \* to end.

Round 2: \* P1, K1, rep from \* to end

Last 2 rounds form moss st patt for rem.

Cont in patt until work measures 10 (11) cm from Hat cast on (excluding ear flaps), ending with a 2nd round.

#### Shape Crown

Round 1: \* Patt 13 (15), P3tog, rep from \* to end. 70 (80) sts. Work 3 rounds.

Round 5: \* Patt 11 (13), P3tog, rep from \* to end. 60 (70) sts. Work 3 rounds.

Round 9: \* Patt 9 (11), P3tog. rep from \* to end, 50 (60) sts. Work 3 rounds.

Round 13: \* Patt 7 (9), P3tog, rep from \* to end. 40 (50) sts. Work 1 round.

Round 15: \* Patt 5 (7), P3tog, rep from \* to end. 30 (40) sts. Work 1 round.

Round 17: \* Patt 3 (5), P3tog. rep from \* to end. 20 (30) sts. Work 1 round.

Size 12 months only Round 19: \* Patt 3, P3tog, rep from \* to end, 20 sts. Work 1 round



Row 2: P1; \*k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows to 24 (25, 26, 27) sts. Leave on holder.

#### FRONT

Work as given for Back to 36 (37, 38, 39) sts, end with a WS row

#### Shape Neck

Next Row: RS - K1, k2tog, k9, turn, on these 11 sts only. Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at neck edge next 4 rows and at armhole edge every RS row 4 times, 3 sts. Next Row: RS - K1, k2tog. 2 sts.

Next Row: WS - P2. Next Row: RS - K2tog.

Fasten off.

With RS facing, return to sts on hold, rejoin yarn, k next 12 (13, 14, 15) sts and slip these to holder for centre front neck, work 2nd half to match, reversing shaping.

#### SLEEVES

With 3.75mm needles, cast on 34 (38, 38, 42) sts.

Row 1: RS - K2, \*p2, k2; rep

Row 2:	P2, *k2, p2; rep from

Work a further 6 rows in k2. p2 rib, inc 2 (0, 2, 2) sts evenly across last row. 36 (38, 40, 44) sts.

Change to 4.00mm needles. Starting with a knit (RS) row, work in Stst, inc 1 st each end of 7th and every following 8th (8th, 6th, 8th) row to 46 (50, 56, 60) sts.

Work even until sleeve measures 20.5 (21.5, 24, 28) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

#### Shape Raglan

Cast off 3 (3, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Next Row: RS - K1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, skp, k1. Work 3 (3, 3, 3) rows even. Rep last 4 rows 0 (1, 0, 0) times more.

Next Row: RS - K1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, skp, k1. Work 1 row even. Rep last 2 rows to 10 (10, 12, 12) sts. Leave on holder.

#### MAKING UP

Block pieces to measurements. Join raglan seams, leaving right back raglan open.

#### NECKBAND

With RS facing and 3.75mm needles, k the 24 (25, 26, 27) back neck holder sts, k the 10 (10, 12, 12) left sleeve holder

sts, pick up and k7 (8, 7, 8) sts down left front neck, k the 12 (13, 14, 15) front neck holder sts, pick up and k7 (8, 7, 8) sts up right front neck, k the 10 (10, 12, 12) right sleeve holder sts. 70 (74, 78, 82) sts. Knit 3 rows, end with a WS row.

#### Shape Neck

Cast off 6 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts beg of next WS row. Dec 1 st at neck edge next row, then every other row until 15 (17, 19, 21, 23) sts rem. Garter Stitch straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Cast off loosely.

#### RIGHT FRONT

With 4.00mm needles, cast on 24 (27, 29, 32, 35) sts.

Garter Stitch until front measures 5cm less than back. end with a WS row.

#### Shape Neck

Cast off 6 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts beg of next RS row. Dec 1 st at neck edge next row, then every other row until 15 (17, 19, 21, 23) sts rem. Garter Stitch straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a RS row. Cast off loosely.

Rep last two rows until 58 (66. 72, 80, 86) sts rem. Garter Stitch straight until work measures 11 (13, 14, 15, 16)cm from cast on edge.

#### Decrease For Back Neck

Cast off 3 sts beg of next 10 (10, 12, 12, 14) rows - 28 (36, 36, 44, 44) sts. Cast off loosely. Sew back seam of bood

#### TAB (MAKE 2 (2, 3, 3, 3))

With 4.00mm needles, cast on 5 sts

Garter Stitch for 3cm

Next Row: Make buttonhole: K2, yo, k2tog, k1.

Garter Stitch further 3 rows.

Work single rib 10 cm.

Change to stocking st and work 2 rows Mc, then work stripes.

#### ROUND NECK

When garment measures 38 (38, 39, 39, 40, 40) cm, divide into three sections for Left FRONT, Right FRONT and BACK to be worked separately. Dec for armholes as foll,

starting from RS: K 39 (42, 44, 47, 49, 52) cast off 10 (10, 12, 12, 14, 14) K 78(84, 88, 94, 98, 104) cast off 10 (10, 12, 12, 14, 14) K 39, 42, 44, 47, 49, 52.

#### LEFT FRONT

On size 4mm knitting needles P 39 (42, 44, 47, 49, 52) sts up to first cast off for armhole. Leave remaining sts on circ needle.

Cont to work stocking st and

When armhole measures 11(11, 12, 12, 13, 13) cm, dec for neck as foll:

On WS cast off first 10 (10, 11, 11, 12, 12) sts.

Then dec1, one st in from neckline, every other row 3 times.

#### BACK

shaping.

Work the remaining 78 (84. 88, 94, 98, 104) sts onto

4.00mm knitting needles. When armhole measures 21 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23) cm cast off.

#### MAKING UP

#### Shoulder Seams

Steam (DON'T PRESS) lightly with iron around armhole and neck to flatten the edges. Pin edges of armhole and neck alternately onto ironing board before steaming, if you find this easier. Using yarn in same colour as last stripe,

sew shoulder seams together from RS, in back loops of cast off sts with an overcast stitch (similar to hemming stitch). This makes a decorative and smooth seam.

#### SLEEVES

Work full sleeves from armhole down so there are no seams to sew together at the end With Mc pick up 104 (104, 110. 110. 116. 116) sts around armhole on size 4mm circ needle (40 cm).

Work stocking st (= only K sts on circ needle when knitting in the round) and stripes for sleeve. After 2 rows dec1 in beg and end of row as foll, starting from beg of row: K2, K2 tog, K 90 (90, 96, 96, 102, 102) K2 tog, K2. Rep this dec every 4th row 8 (8, 9, 9, 10, 10) more times and then every 6th row 8 times (70, 70, 74, 74, 78, 78 left). Make sure that you keep 4 sts between dec at underarm of sleeve, and that dec are kept straight under each other all the way down.

When sleeve measures 39 (39, 40, 40, 42, 42) cm, or desired length, dec 12 sts evenly distributed over row, so 58 (58, 62, 62, 66, 66) sts

Change to four 3.00mm double-ended needles and work 7 (7, 8, 8, 8, 8)cm in a firm single rib.

Cast off quite loosely, so edge stays elastic.

#### ROUND NECK AND FRONT **EDGES**

#### Left Front Edge

With Mc and size 4mm circ needle (80 cm) pick up 112 (112, 118, 118, 122, 122) sts. Work 9 rows firm single rib. Cast off quite firmly.

#### Right Front Edge

Work as Left Front edge. but on rows 4 and 5 make 7 buttonholes, evenly spaced (remember that an 8th buttonhole will be added on to Right side of neckband) Make first buttonhole 5 sts from bottom edge and last one placed so it will be evenly spaced from 8th buttonhole on neckline edge band, with the other 6 buttonholes distributed evenly in between.

#### ROUND NECK

With Mc and 3.00mm circ needle (60 cm) pick up around neck as foll: 10 (10, 11, 11, 12, 12) sts along Right Front edge, 30 (30, 32, 32, 34, 34) sts along Right neckline, 26 (26, 30, 30, 34, 34) sts along Back, 30(30, 32, 32, 34, 34) sts along Left neckline, 10 (10, 11, 11, 12, 12) sts along Left Front edge 106 (106, 114, 114, 126, 126) in all. Work 9 rows in a firm single rib On 4th and 5th row make one buttonhole over3 sts. 4 sts from Right Front edge. Cast off quite firmly.

#### BUTTONHOLE

Each buttonhole is worked over 3 sts, which are cast off on row 4 and then cast on again on row 5, straight over the sts that were cast off on the previous row for buttonhole.

#### MAKING UP

Fasten off all loose ends. On Left Front edge sew on 8 buttons.

Next Row: \*P1, k5, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 17cm from beg. end with a WS row.

#### Shape Top

Next Row: RS - \*K1, p2. p2tog, p1, k2, p5, k1; rep from \* to end. 130 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k5, p2, k4, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1, p4, k2, p1, p2tog, p2, k1; rep from \* to end. 120 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k4, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1, p1, p2tog, p1, k2, p4, k1; rep from \* to end. 110 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k4, p2, k3, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1, p3, k2,

p1, p2tog, p1, k1; rep from \* to end. 100 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k3, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1. p1. p2tog, k2, p3, k1; rep from \* to end. 90 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k3, p2, k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1. p2. k2. p2tog, p1, k1; rep from \* to end. 80 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1, p2tog. k2, p2, k1; rep from \* to end. 70 sts.

Next Row: \*P1, k2, p2, k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - \*K1, p1, k2, p2tog, k1; rep from \* to end. 60 sts

Next Row: \*P1, k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - K1, p1;

\*k2tog, p1; rep from \* to last st, k1. 41 sts.

Next Row: P1; \*k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

Next Row: RS - K2tog across row, end k1. 21 sts.

Row 10: \*P1, k5, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice more.

Row 15: \*K2, p4, k2, p4, k2; rep from \* to end.

Row 16: \*K6, p2, k6: rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows 3 times more.

Row 23: \*K1, p2, p2tog, p1, k2, p5, k1; rep from \* to end. 52 (65) sts.

Row 24: \*P1, k5, p2, k4, p1; rep from \* to end.

Row 25: \*K1, p4, k2, p1, p2tog, p2, k1; rep from \* to end. 48 (60) sts.

Row 26: \*P1, k4, p1; rep from \* to end.

Row 27: \*K1, p4, k1; rep from \* to end.

Row 28: \*P1, k4, p1; rep from \* to end.

Row 29: \*K1, p3, k4, p3, k1; rep from \* to end.

Row 30: \*P1, k10, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows 3 times more.

Row 37: \*K1, p4, k1; rep from \* to end.

Row 38: \*P1, k4, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice more. Next Row: RS - K1, M1, k22 (28), M1, k2, M1, k22 (28), M1, k1, 52 (64) sts.

Next Row: WS - Knit all sts. Stst straight until piece measures 22cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Next Row: WS - P4 (1); (p2tog, p10 (7)) 4 (7) times. 48 (57) sts.

Change to 3.00mm needles. K1, p1 rib for 10 rows. Cast off loosely in rib. Beg at cast-off edge, join

seam for approx 6cm. Place marker 4 (4.5)cm down each side

#### THUMB

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, beg at marker, pick up and k10 (12) sts from marker to seam and again 10 (12) sts from seam to 2nd marker - 20 (24) sts. Row (WS) - P.

Next Row: RS - K4, turn, slip first st firmly, p to end.

Next Row: K20 (24).

Next Row: WS - P4, turn, slip first st firmly, k to end. Next Row: P20 (24).

Next Row: RS - K6, turn, slip first st firmly, p to end.

Next Row: K20 (24).

Next Row: P6, turn, slip first st firmly, k to end.

Next Row: P20 (24).

Next Row: RS - K7 (8), turn, slip first st firmly, p to end.

Next Row: K20 (24).

Next Row: P7 (8), turn, slip first st firmly, k to end.

Next Row: P20 (24).

Next Row: RS - K8 (10), turn, slip first st firmly, p to end.

Work 13 rows rib as for lower band of Back and Front. Row 14: Inc purlways in each of next 2 sts. \* K2. inc

purlways in each of next 2 sts, rep from \* to end. 40 (40, 40, 40, 46) sts.

Change to 9.00mm needles. Work 4 rows stocking st.

Row 5: K2, M1, knit to last 2 sts, M1, K2. 42 (42, 42, 42, 48) sts.

Cont in stocking st, inc one st (as before) at each end of every foll 22nd (14th, 10th, 8th, 14th) row until there are 46 (48, 50, 52, 54) sts. Cont without shaping until Sleeve measures 54cm from beg, ending with a purl row. Tie a coloured thread at each end of last row to mark end of sleeve seam

Work a further 12 (14, 16, 18, 20) rows.

Cast off loosely.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join shoulder seams, leaving 24 (25, 25, 26, 26) cm at centre of back and front unsewn for neck opening. Join side and sleeve

seams to coloured threads. Sew in sleeves, placing centre of sleeve to shoulder seam and rows above coloured threads to sts cast off at armholes on back and front.

With RS facing and 4.00m needles, slip the right front holder 3 sts to needle as if they have already been worked, pick up and k39 (40, 41, 42, 43, 43) sts up from neck edge to shoulder. 8 sts down back neck, k the back neck holder 21 (21, 23, 23, 25, 27) sts, pick up and k 8 sts up back neck to shoulder, 39 (40, 41, 42, 43, 43) sts down front neck edge to holder, k the 3 holder sts. 121 (123, 127, 129, 133, 135) sts.

Next Row: WS - Knit. Next Row: Knit. Knit 1 more row. Cast off loosely in k. Join sides and armhole bands. Sew on buttons.

7.5cm.

Next Round: K1, K2tog, knit to last 3 sts, slip 1, knit 1,

psso, k1.

3 x 25g balls Jo Sharp Mohair in 601 Clove

#### Needles

4.50mm double pointed needles. (USA 7) (UK 7)

P8, p2tog, p1, turn. K9, k2tog, k1, turn. P10, p2tog, p1, turn. K11, k2tog, k1, turn. Cont as set until all sts are worked onto one needle (15sts), Purl 1 row, dec 1 st at each end (13 sts). Knit back 6 sts (heel is completed).

Slip all instep sts onto one needle again.

Using another needle, knit rem 6 sts of heel, then knit up 12 sts along side of heel. With

a second needle, knit across, instep sts. Using a third needle, knit up 12 sts along other side of heel, then rem 7 heel sts (59sts).

Dec for instep as follows;

Round 1: Knit

Round 2: First needle, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Second needle, knit.

Third needle, K2, sl1, k1, psso, knit to end.

Rep rounds 1 and 2 until 11sts rem on first and third needles. Cont without shaping until foot measures 22cm (or length required) from the side of heel where sts were knitted up.

#### Shape toe


Round 1: First needle, knit to last 3 sts. k2tog. k1. Second needle, k1, sl1, k1, psso, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Third needle, k1.

With RS facing, 3.75mm circular needle and B, pick up and k 61 (67, 77, 87) sts evenly up right front edge to start of hood, 43 (46, 52, 56) sts along side of hood, k the 24 (26, 30, 30) sts from holder, pick up and k 43 (46, 52, 56) sts down side of hood, 61 (67, 77, 87) sts evenly down left front edge. 232 (252, 288, 316) sts. Do not join.

Rows 1 and 3: WS - K1, \*p2, k2; rep from \* to last 3 sts,

Row 2: K3. \*p2. k2: rep from \* to last st. k1. Cast off all sts in rib.

Fold sleeves in half, placing fold at shoulder seams and sew sleeves in position.

Sew side and sleeve seams. Sew zip under zip edging; beg at lower edge and ending at start of neck shaping.

#### STITCH GUIDE

Moss Stitch

Row 1: K1. P1 to end of row. Row 2: K1, P1 to end of row.

#### HAT

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 85 sts. Work in Moss st for 3cm.

ending on a WS row. Change to 5.00mm needles.

Work 10cm in st st, beg with a RS row and ending on a WS row.

#### Shape top

Row 1: RS - K2, k2tog, (k17, k3tog tbl) 3 times, k17, k2tog tbl. k2. 77 sts. Purl 1 row.

Row 3: K2, k2tog, (k15, k3tog tbl) 3 times, k15, k2tog tbl,

k2. 69 sts.

Purl 1 row. Row 5: K2, k2tog, (k13, k3tog

k2. 61 sts. Purl 1 row.

Cont to dec 8 sts every RS row until 37 sts rem.



#### STITCH GUIDE CARDIGAN (WORKED IN ONE PIECE TO ARMHOLES)

Using 3.00mm circular needle, cast on 211 (231, 251, 271) sts.

NOTE - A circular needle has been used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work backwards and forwards in rows not rounds. If desired, change to pair of needles after dividing for Back and Fronts. Row 1: K2, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to last st, K1.

Row 2: K1, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to end.

Rep 1st and 2nd rows 4 times. 10 rows rib in all.

Change to 3.75mm circular needle.

Row 1: Knit.

Row 2 and foll alt: Purl.

Row 3: K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K2tog, yfwd, rep from \* to last 9 sts, K1, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K3.

Row 5: K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, knit to last 8 sts, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K3.

Row 7: As 3rd row.

Row 9. 11 and 13: As 5th row. Row 15 and 17: K3. K2tog. yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso,

\* K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K5, rep from \* to last 13 sts, (K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso) twice, K3.

Row 19, 21 and 23: As 5th row. Row 25 and 27: K3, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, \* K5, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, rep from \* to last 13 sts, K5, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sl 1, K1, psso, K3.

Row 28: As 2nd row. Rows 9 to 28 incl form patt for rem.

Cont in patt until work measures 36cm from beg, working last row on wrong side.

Divide for Back and Fronts NOTE - Care must be taken when shaping in this lacy patt. Do not work a K2tog or sl 1, K1, psso, unless the corresponding vfwd can be worked and vice versa.

Next Row: Patt 8, sl 1, K1, psso (Right Front edge dec), patt 37 (41, 44, 47), cast off next 12 (14, 18, 22) sts, patt 93 (101, 107, 113) incl st rem on righthand needle after casting off, cast off next 12 (14, 18, 22) sts, patt to last 10 sts, K2tog (Left Front edge dec), patt to end. Cont on last 46 (50, 53, 56) sts for Left Front. Keeping patt correct, dec one st at armhole edge in

every foll alt row 6 (8, 10, 11)

times, at same time dec one st (inside 8 sts as before) at front edge in every foll 4th row 11 (9, 10, 11) times, then in every foll 6th row until 26 (28, 28, 29) sts rem. Work 5 rows.

Keeping patt correct, dec one st at armhole edge in every foll alt row 6 (8, 10, 11) times, at same time dec one st (inside 8 sts as before) at front edge in every foll 4th row 11 (9, 10, 11) times, then in every foll 6th row until 26 (28, 28, 29) sts rem. Work 6 rows.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 9 (9, 9, 10) sts at beg of next row and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 8 (10. 10, 9) sts.

#### SLEEVES

Using 3.00mm needles, cast on 51 (51, 53, 53) sts. Work 8 rows rib as for Back. Change to 3.75mm needles.

Beg Patt

Row 1: Knit.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: \* K2tog, vfwd, rep from \* to last st, K1.

Row 4: Purl.

Rep rows 1 to 4 incl once.

Next Row: K2, M1, knit to last 2 sts, M1, K2. 53 (53, 55,

55) sts.

Working in stocking st for rem, inc one st (as before) at each end of every foll 12th (8th, 6th, 6th) row until there are 69 (71, 57, 85) sts, then in every foll 14th (10th, 8th, 8th) row until there are 71 (79, 83, 91) sts.

Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 43cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Top

Cast off 3 (4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 65 (71, 73, 81) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 15 (23, 23, 35) sts rem, then in every row until 13 sts rem. Cast off.

#### FRONT BAND

Join shoulder seams. Using 3.00mm needles, cast on 9 sts.

Work 2 rows rib as for Back.

Row 3: Rib 4. cast off 2 sts. rib 3.

Row 4: Rib 3, turn, cast on 2 sts. turn, rib 4, buttonhole. Work 16 rows rib.

Rep last 18 rows 5 times. then buttonhole rows once. 7 buttonholes.

Cont in rib until front band is length required to fit (slightly stretched) evenly along front edges and across back neck. Cast off in rib.

#### MAKING UP

With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Join sleeve seams. Sew in sleeves evenly. Sew front band in position, placing buttonholes to right front edge. Sew on buttons.

Next Row: WS - K43 (44, 46, 48) sts (leave the upper rem 38 sts unworked for now). Garter Stitch over these 43 (44, 46, 48) sts for 3 more rows.

Next Row: WS - K43 (44. 46, 48) sts; cast on 33 (35, 36, 37) sts, k rem 38 sts. 114 (117, 120, 123) sts. Garter Stitch straight until piece measures 46 (51, 56. 61)cm from marker, end with a WS row.

#### Shape 2nd Armhole

Next Row: RS - K38 sts. cast off loosely 33 (35, 36, 37) sts, k to end.

Next Row: WS - K43 (44, 46, 48) sts (leave the upper rem 38 sts unworked for now). Garter Stitch over these 43 (44, 46, 48) sts for 3 more rows.

Next Row: WS - K43 (44,



## SOMERVILLE SWEATER

A loose fitting sweater with an elegantly classic shaped sleeve top and neckline. Worked in Jo Sharp's Desert Garden Aran Cotton.

#### WORKING PATTERN FRONT

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 86(92, 102, 110)sts. Work 3cm st st, ending on a WS row.

Change to 5.00mm needles. Cont working in st st until bodice length (incl band) measures 34cm, ending on a WS row.

#### Shape armholes

RS - Cast off 3 sts at beg next 2 rows

Next Row: RS dec - K2. k3tog, k to last 5 sts, k3tog tbl, k2. This row sets patt for decreasing. Cont working in st st, dec 2 sts at each end of foll 4th rows, 3 times. Work 11 rows.

Next Row: RS - K3tog. work to last 3 sts, k3tog tbl (60(66,76,84)sts, 27 shaping rows).

Cont working straight until bodice length (incl band) measures 46.5(46.5, 48.5, 48.5)cm, ending on a WS row.

#### Shape neck

RS - Work 13(16, 20, 24) sts, turn, leave rem sts on a holder.

WS - P2, p2tog, p to end. RS - K to last 4 sts, k2tog,

Rep these 2 rows once more, then WS row again. 8(11,15,19)sts.

Work 12 rows straight. Cast off.

With RS facing, leave 34(34, 36, 36)sts on holder, rejoin varn to rem sts. k to end. Next Row: WS - P to last 4 sts, p2tog tbl, p2.

Next Row: RS - K2, skpsso, k to end. Rep these 2 rows once more, then WS row again. 8(11, 15, 19)sts]. Work 12 rows straight. Cast off.

#### BACK

Work back to match front incorporating back neck shaping into last 6 rows as follows:

RS - Work 13(16, 20, 24) sts, turn, leave rem sts on a holder. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows. 8(11, 15, 19) sts]. Cast off.

With RS facing, leave 34(34, 36, 36)sts on holder, rejoin yarn to rem sts, k to end. Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows. 8(11, 15, 19)sts. Cast off.

#### SLEEVES

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 36(36, 40, 40)sts. Work 3cm st st, ending on a WS row

Change to 5.00mm needles. Cont working in st st at the same time shape sides as follows: inc 1 st each end every 8th row, 10 times, then on foll 10th rows, twice. 60(60, 64, 64)sts, 100 shaping rows.

Cont working straight until length (incl band) measures 44(44, 46, 46)cm, ending on a WS row.

#### Shape top

Cast off 3 sts at beg next 2 rows. 54(54, 58, 58)sts. Next Row: RS dec - K2. k3tog, k to last 5 sts, k3tog tbl, k2. Dec as set in last row. Dec 2 sts each end every 4th row. 6 times. Work 1 row. Next Row: RS dec - K2. k3tog, k to last 5 sts, k3tog tbl, k2. Work 1 row. Rep last 2 rows once more. 18(18,22,22)sts. Cast off 4 sts at beg next 2 rows. Cast off rem 10(10, 14, 14)sts.

#### MAKING UP

Press all pieces gently, except ribs, on WS using a warm iron over a damp cloth. Using backstitch join shoulder seams. Centre sleeves and join, join side and sleeve seams using edge to edge st on ribs.

#### COLLAR

Using 4.00mm circular needle, with RS facing, pick up and knit 16 sts down left front, 34(34, 36, 36)sts from holder at centre front, 16 sts up right front, 6 sts down back shaping, 34(34, 36, 36) sts from holder at back neck and 6 sts up rem back neck shaping, 112(112, 116, 116)sts. Work in rounds of st st until collar measures 6cm. Cast off. Press seams.

purl sts as they appear.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Using a medium pom-pom maker or 2 circles of cardboard 10cm in diameter with a 3cm hole in the centre, make a pompom and attach securely to crown

A unisex sweater with simple drop shoulder shaping and V-neck with a partridge scarf



## STITCH GUIDE FRONT

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 94(104, 116, 130)sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 4cm, ending on a WS row.

Change to 5.00mm needles. Cont working in Stocking st until bodice length (incl band) measures 40(40, 41, 41)cm, ending on a WS row.

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED

#### Yarn

Juniper Sweater 10, 10, 13, 14 Jo Sharp Silkroad Aran Tweed Russet 113 or Dusk 118 or Licorice 119 Partridge scarf 4 balls 50gm Jo Sharp Silkroad Aran Tweed in Vermouth 114

#### Needles

4.50mm knitting needles 5.00mm knitting needles

#### Tension

18 sts by 24 rows over Stocking st on 5.00mm needles to 10cm

#### Shape armholes

Cast off 4 sts at beg next 2

Next Row: RS - Dec 1st each end every row 6 times\*. 74(84, 96, 110)sts. Cont straight until bodice length (incl band) measures 49(49, 52, 52)cm, ending on a WS row.

#### Shape neck

Work 37(42, 48, 55)sts, turn, leave rem 37(42, 48, 55)sts on a holder

Work each side of neck separately.

Dec 1 st at neck edge of every row 4 times, then 1 st at neck edge every alt row 14 times. 19(24, 30, 37)sts, 32 shaping rows

Work 1 row.

#### Shape shoulders

Next Row: RS - Cast off 6(8, 10, 12)sts at beg next and foll alt rows, once. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 7(8, 10, 13)sts. With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts

Work second side to match first side, rev all shaping.

#### BACK

Work as for front to \*. Cont working straight until bodice length matches front bodice to shoulder shaping (omitting front neck shaping).

#### Shape shoulders and back neck

Next Row: RS - Cast off 6(8, 10, 12)sts, work 25(28, 30, 35) sts. turn, leave rem 43(48, 56, 63)sts on a holder.

Next Row: WS - Cast off 6(6. 5, 5)sts, p to end.

Next Row: RS - Cast off 6(8, 10, 12)sts, k to end.

Next Row: WS - Cast off 6(6,

5, 5)sts, p to end.

Next Row: RS - Cast off rem

#### SLEEVES

Using 4.50mm needles, cast on 48(48, 52, 52)sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 4cm, ending on a WS row. Change to 5.00 mm needles. Cont. working in Stocking st, shaping sides as follows; inc 1 st each end next row. then 1 st at each end foll 5th rows 0(0, 20, 20) times, then foll 6th rows 16(16, 0, times. 82(82, 94, 94)sts, 97(97,101,101) shaping rows. Work straight until length (incl. band) measures 47(47, 49, 49)cm, ending on a WS row.

#### Shape top


RS - Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Next Row: RS - Dec 1 st at each end every row 6 times. 62(62, 74, 74)sts. Cast off.

#### MAKING UP

Press all pieces gently on WS using a warm iron over a damp cloth.

Using Backstitch join right shoulder seam.



#### NECKBAND

With RS facing, using 4.50mm needles, pick up and knit 32(32, 34, 34) sts down left side of neck, place marker on right needle, pick up and knit 32(32, 34, 34) sts up right side of neck, then 12(12, 10, 10) sts across back neck, then 12(12, 16, 16) sts from holder, then 12(12, 10, 10) sts across remainder of back neck. 100(100, 104, 104) sts. Row 1: WS - (P2, k2) rep to within 2 sts of marker, P2tog tbl, slip marker to right needle, P2tog tbl, (p2, k2) rep to end. This row sets rib. Decreasing 1 st each side of marker as set. work 6 rows rib. Cast off rem sts, still decreasing at centre front. Join left shoulder and neckband seam. Set in sleeves, join side and sleeve seams.

#### PARTRIDGE SCARF SCARF

Using 5.00mm needles, cast on 45 sts. Work in Garter st (knit all rows) until length measures 120cm. Cast off.

#### FRINGE

Cut strands of yarn 10cm in length. Using 4 strands together, fold in half. Insert crochet hook just above cast on (or off) edge of scarf from back to front, catch the folded strands of yarn with hook and pull it through the knitting. Insert the ends of yarn into loop and pull through to tighten. Cont in this way until edge is sufficiently covered with fringe. Trim ends to even lengths. Repeat at other end of scarf.

3.25mm set of double pointed needles 3.00mm knitting needles 3.25mm knitting needles

#### Tension

28 sts by 36 rows over Stocking Stitch on 3.25mm needles to 10cm.

#### Special abbreviations

psso - pass slipped stitch over; skp - slip 1 stitch, knit 1 stitch, pass the slipped stitch over; M1 - k into back of strand between stitch just worked and next stitch. togtbl - knit or purl stated number of stitches together through back of loops.

#### GETTING STARTED HAT (WORKED FROM TOP DOWN)

Starting out with double pointed needles due to small amount of stitches; however change to straight needles when enough stitches on needle to do so.

#### WORKING PATTERN

With 3.25mm double-pointed needles, cast on 7 sts and divide over 2 or 3 needles. Row 1: RS - \*K1, M1; rep from \* to last st, k1. 13 sts.

Row 2 and all other WS

rows: Purl.

Row 3: RS - \*K2, M1; rep from \* to last st, k1. 19 sts. Row 5: \*K3, M1; rep from

Row 7: \*K4, M1; rep from \* to last st, k1. 31 sts.

Row 9: \*K5, M1; rep from \* to last st, k1. 37 sts.

Row 11: \*K6, M1; rep from

\* to last st, k1. 49 sts.

Row 15: \*K8, M1; rep from \* to last st, k1. 55 sts.

#### Shape Tip and Place Buttonholes

Row 2: using 8.00mm needle \*k1tbl, P1, rep from \* to end. Rep rows 1 and 2 throughout.

#### WORKING PATTERN

Using 8.00mm needles cast on 70sts

Work in rib pattern until work measures 180cm ending with a WS row. Cast off.

# **GLOSSARY**

#### **BEGINNER'S TOOL KIT**

#### PINS

Plastic-head pins are useful for checking tension and blocking out



items. Pins with coloured heads are best because they do not get lost in your work.

#### **ROW COUNTER**

worked, particularly where



#### KNITTING NEEDLES

Knitting needles are made from plastic, aluminium or wood and come in varying lengths and widths. Straight needles come in pairs and doublepointed needles come in sets of four.

#### KNITTING BAG

A knitting bag is essential for those who like to knit 'on the go'. Not only is it a practical way to keep all your knitting paraphenalia together, it also helps keep the yarn clean and tangle-free.



A row counter is helpful for keeping track of rows increases, decreases or other kinds of patterning occur.



#### CIRCULAR KNITTING NEEDLES

Circular needles have two working ends joined by a thin nylon wire. They are more balanced than straight needles and allow the weight of your work to rest in your lap.



#### KNITTING IN ELASTIC

Elastic yarn prevents sagging in cuffs, collars and waists. You can work it in with knitting yarn on knitted or crocheted garments.



#### TAPE MEASURE

A basic tape measure is essential for checking your garment measurements.



#### KNITTER'S NEEDLES

Knitter's needles need to have a large eye and a blunt point so they do not split stitches when sewing up your knitting.




#### STITCH GAUGE

A stitch gauge is a flat piece of metal or plastic with a ruler marked on one side and/or a window

cut out in the centre. It allows you to mark and measure easily and accurately.

#### STITCH HOLDER

A stitch holder is used to secure stitches not in use. You can also use safety pins for holding a small number of stitches.



#### CASTING ON


Casting on is creating a row of loops on a knitting needle to form the base row for your knitting. One of the most popular methods of casting on is the cable cast on. Form a slipknot about 25cm away from the end of the varn.

Place the slipknot on a knitting needle and pull gently to secure. Hold this needle in your left hand. Insert the right-hand needle through the slip knot. Pass the yarn over the point of the right-hand needle (see Diagram 1).

Pull a loop through the slip knot with the right-hand needle (see Diagram 2). Place this loop on the lefthand needle and gently pull the yarn to secure the stitch. For the remaining cast on stitches, insert the right-hand needle between the slip knot and the first stitch on the left-hand needle. Wind the yarn around the point of the right-hand needle. Draw a loop through and place this loop on the left-hand needle. Continue in this manner until you have cast on the desired number of stitches.



#### KNIT STITCH



Once you have cast on, you then knit into the stitches you have made to form the knitted fabric. Hold the needle with the cast on stitches in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the back of your work. Insert the right-hand needle from left to right through the front of the first stitch on the left-hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from left to right over the point of the right-hand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the yarn through the stitch to form a new stitch on the right-hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left-hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right-hand needle. To knit a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left-hand needle to the righthand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

#### PURL STITCH



The purl stitch is basically the reverse of the knit stitch. Hold the needle with the stitches on


in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the front of your work. Insert the right-hand needle from right to left into the front of the first stitch on the lefthand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from right to left over the point of the righthand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the yarn through the

stitch to form a new stitch on the right-hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left-hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right-hand needle. To purl a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left-hand needle to the righthand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

#### **CASTING OFF**

#### KNITWISE


Knit two stitches. Use the point of the left-hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right-hand needle over the second, and drop if off the needle. Knit the next. stitch on the left-hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right-hand needle again, and repeat. Continue in this manner



until all the stitches have been worked off the left-hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right-hand needle. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail and thread the yarn through the loop and pull it firmly to fasten off.

#### **PURLWISE**

Purl two stitches. Use the point of the left-hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right-hand needle over the second, and drop it off the needle. Purl the next stitch on the left-hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right-hand needle again, and



repeat. Continue in this manner until all the stitches have been worked off the left-hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right-hand needle. Secure this last stitch as described in casting off knitwise.

#### SUBSTITUTING YARNS

If you substitute or spin a yarn for a project, you can compare the weight of the yarn to the project yarn by comparing wraps per inch. Wrap your yarn around a ruler for one inch and count the number of wraps. If you have more wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thin; if you have fewer wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thick.



#### KNITTING TENSION


Checking your knitting tension, that is, the tightness or looseness of your knitting, is important. To check your tension, cast on 30 stitches using the recommended needle size. Work in the pattern until your work measures 10cm from the cast on edge then cast off. You now have a "swatch". Measure your tension by placing a ruler over your swatch and counting the number of stitches


across and rows down (including fractions of stitches and rows) in 10cm. Repeat these measurements two to three times on a different parts of the swatch to check your measurements. If you have more stitches and rows than called for in the instructions, you should use larger needles; if you have fewer, use smaller needles. Check your tension again before starting your project.

#### PROVISIONAL CAST ON (INVISIBLE CAST ON)

Place a loose slipknot on the needle in your right hand. Hold the waste yarn next to the slipknot and around your left thumb. Hold your working yarn over your left index finger. \*Bring the needle forward under the waste yarn, over the working yarn, grab a loop of working yarn (Diagram

1), then bring the needle to the front, over both yarns, and grab a second loop (Diagram 2). Repeat from \* until you have the desired number of stitches on your needle. When you're ready to work in the opposite direction, pick out the waste yarn to expose the live stitches.





#### **BACKSTITCH**

This is the stitch most commonly used for joining knitted garments. With the right sides of your work together, pin the knitted fabric together with the edges even. The seam should be sewn one full stitch from the end of the row. One stitch should be worked over every row. Thread the yarn needle. Insert the needle through both layers and sew two stitches to the left then one stitch back to the right. Keep stitches at an even distance. Continue working from right to left in this circular motion. (Diagram 1)

#### **TASSELS**


Cut yarn twice the length of your desired tassel plus a bit extra for the knot. According to the desired thickness of the tassel, select a number of lengths of yarn. Fold the lengths of yarn in half over a crochet hook. On the wrong side, insert the crochet hook from the front to the back through the edge of the work. Grab the yarn and pull through and tighten. Trim the ends to the same length.

#### KNOTTED FRINGE

After working a tassel, take one half of the strands from each tassel and knot them with half the strands from the neighbouring tassel. Trim.




#### **CROCHET CHAIN**




Make a slip knot on your hook. Pass the yarn over the hook and catch it with the hook and draw it through the loop on the hook. Repeat, drawing yarn through the last loop formed.


#### DOUBLE CROCHET (DC) (US SINGLE CROCHET SC)



Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch. Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have two loops on the hook (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw through both loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).

#### HALF TREBLE CROCHET (HTR) (US HALF DOUBLE CROCHET HDC)






Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that there are three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Draw through all three loops on the hook (Diagram 3).





#### TREBLE CROCHET (TR) (US DOUBLE CROCHET DC)







Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw it through the first two loops on the hook, pass the yarn over the hook and draw through the remaining two loops. Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).




#### SLIP STITCH CROCHET (SL ST)

Insert your hook into the stitch. Yarn over the hook and draw the loop through the stitch and loop onto the hook.

#### **I-CORD**

With double-pointed needles, cast on the desired number of stitches. \*Without turning the needle, slide the stitches to the other end of the needle, pull the yarn around the back and knit the stitches as usual. Repeat from \* until your work measures the desired length



#### PICKING UP DROPPED STITCHES

A dropped stitch can be picked up using a crochet hook and don't be put off by stitches that have unraveled several rows down into the work. To pick up knit stitches, insert the crochet hook into the dropped stitch, draw through the bar lying above the dropped stitch and pull it through the loop of the dropped stitch.

P1 - Purl one stitch

P2tog - Purl two stitches together

Patt - pattern

Psso - Pass slipped stitch over previous stitch

Pb - Purl through the back of the stitch

Pwise - Purlwise

Rem - Remaining

Rep - Repeat

SI 1 - Slip one stitch across from left needle to right needle without knitting it.

SI 1 Purlwise - Slip next stitch off left needle onto right as if to purl the stitch.

Sts - Stitches

St st - Stocking stitch. If knitting back and forth, one row knit, next row purl. If knitting circularly, knit each round.

SSK - Slip, slip knit. Makes a left slanting decrease. Slip two stitches knitwise, on at a time from the left to the right needle, then knit them together through their backs.

Tog - Together

WS - Wrong side

Ybk - Yarn back

Y fwd - Yarn forward - bring yarn under the needle, then over to the knitting position again, creating a new stitch.

Yo - Yarn over.
