## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

### Yarn

3, 3, 4 balls 50gm  
Filatura Di Crosa Zara  
Plus in shade 50 – hat  
4, 5, 6 balls 50gm  
Filatura Di Crosa Zara  
Plus in shade 53 – scarf

### Needles

4.00mm knitting  
needles  
5.00mm knitting  
needles

### Tension

18 sts by 24 rows over  
Stst on 5.00mm needles  
to 10cm

### Special abbreviations

Mlp – purl into back of  
strand between last st  
worked and next st on  
left hand needle

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## STITCH GUIDE SLOUCHY HAT

With 4.00mm needles, cast  
on 90 (96, 102) sts.

K1, p1 rib for 11 rows.

**Next Row:** WS - P5 (4, 2),  
Mlp: (p10 (8, 7), Mlp) 8 (11,  
14) times; p5 (4, 2). 99 (108,  
117) sts.

Change to 5.00mm needles.

### Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - \*K1, p1, k3, p4;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** WS - \*K4, p3, k1, p1;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 3:** RS - \*P1, k1, p1, k3,  
p3; rep from \* to end.

**Row 4:** WS - \*K3, p3, k1, p1,  
k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 5:** \*P2, k1, p1, k3, p2;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 6:** \*K2, p3, k1, p1, k2;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 7:** \*P3, k1, p1, k3, p1; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 8:** \*K1, p3, k1, p1, k3; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 9:** \*P4, k1, p1, k3; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 10:** \*P3, k1, p1, k4; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 11:** \*K1, p4, k1, p1, k2;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 12:** \*P2, k1, p1, k4, p1;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 13:** \*K2, p4, k1, p1, k1;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 14:** \*P1, k1, p1, k4, p2;  
rep from \* to end.

**Row 15:** \*K3, p4, k1, p1; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 16:** \*K1, p1, k4, p3; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 17:** \*P1, k3, p4, k1; rep  
from \* to end.

**Row 18:** \*P1, k4, p3, k1; rep  
from \* to end.

Rep these 18 rows twice  
more, and then rows 1 - 8  
once.

### Shape Top

**Next Row:** RS - \*P1, p2tog,  
p1, k1, p1, k3; rep from \* to  
end. 88 (96, 104) sts.

**Next Row:** WS - \*P3, k1, p1,  
k3; rep from \* to end.

**Next Row:** RS - \*P3, k1, p1,  
k2tog, k1; rep from \* to end.  
77 (84, 91) sts.

**Next Row:** WS - \*P2, k1, p1,  
k3; rep from \* to end.

**Next Row:** \*P2tog, p1, k1, p1,  
k2; rep from \* to end. 66 (72,  
78) sts.

**Next Row:** \*P2, k1, p1, k2;  
rep from \* to end.

**Next Row:** \*P2, k1, p1, k2tog;  
rep from \* to end. 55 (60,  
65) sts.

**Next Row:** \*P1, k1, p1, k2; rep  
from \* to end.

**Next Row:** \*P2tog, k1, p1, k1;  
rep from \* to end. 44 (48,  
52) sts.

**Next Row:** \*P1, k1; rep from  
\* to end.

**Next Row:** \*P1, k1, k2tog;  
rep from \* to end. 33 (36,  
39) sts.

**Next Row:** \*P2, k1; rep from  
\* to end.

**Next Row:** K1 (0, 1); \*k2tog;  
rep from \* to end. 17 (18,  
20) sts.

With WS facing, break yarn,  
leaving longer end, thread  
end through rem sts and pull  
closed, secure end.

## MAKING UP

Join back seam.

## SCARF

With 5.00mm needles, cast  
on 40 sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K2; (k1, p1) 18  
times; k2.

**Row 2:** WS - K2; (k1, p1) 18  
times; k2.

Rep last 2 rows once more.

### Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - K2; (k1, p1, k3,  
p4) 4 times; k2.

**Row 2:** WS - K2; (k4, p3, k1,  
p1) 4 times; k2.

**Row 3:** RS - K2, (p1, k1, p1,  
k3, p3) 4 times; k2.

**Row 4:** WS - K2; (k3, p3, k1, p1, k1) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 5:** K2; (p2, k1, p1, k3, p2) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 6:** K2; (k2, p3, k1, p1, k2) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 7:** K2; (p3, k1, p1, k3, p1) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 8:** K2; (k1, p3, k1, p1, k3) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 9:** K2; (p4, k1, p1, k3) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 10:** K2; (p3, k1, p1, k4) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 11:** K2; (k1, p4, k1, p1, k2) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 12:** K2; (p2, k1, p1, k4, p1) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 13:** K2; (k2, p4, k1, p1, k1) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 14:** K2; (p1, k1, p1, k4, p2) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 15:** K2; (k3, p4, k1, p1) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 16:** K2; (k1, p1, k4, p3) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 17:** K2; (p1, k3, p4, k1) 4 times; k2.  
**Row 18:** K2; (p1, k4, p3, k1) 4 times; k2.  
 Rep these 18 rows until piece measures approx 125cm (150, 170) cm from beg, end with a WS row.  
**Row 1:** RS - K2; (k1, p1) 18 times; k2.  
**Row 2:** WS - K2; (k1, p1) 18 times; k2.  
 Rep last 2 rows once more.  
 Cast off loosely in patt.

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

### Yarn

Cowl  
2 Hanks 50gm Amuri DK  
8ply in shade #2038  
Fingerless gloves  
1 Hank 50gm Amuri DK  
8ply in shade #2038

### Needles And Tools

Cowl  
4.50mm knitting needles  
or longer circular needle  
Fingerless gloves  
3.25mm knitting needles  
3.75mm knitting needles  
2 markers

### Special Abbreviations

skp – slip 1 stitch, knit 1  
stitch, pass the slipped  
stitch over;  
yo – yarn over needle to  
make new stitch.

### Tension

22 sts over Pattern on  
4.50mm needles to 10cm  
Cowl  
23 sts over Stst on  
3.75mm needles to 10cm  
Fingerless gloves

## WORKING PATTERN

### COWL

With 4.50mm needles, cast on  
171 sts.

**Row 1:** RS - Knit all sts.

**Row 2:** Knit all sts.

Rep last 2 rows once more.

### Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*skp, k9,  
k2tog; rep from \* to last st, k1.  
145 sts.

**Row 2:** WS - Purl.

**Row 3:** RS - K1; \*skp, k7,  
k2tog; rep from \* to last st, k1.  
119 sts.

**Row 4:** WS - Purl.

**Row 5:** RS - K1; \*skp, yo, [k1,  
yo] 5 times, k2tog; rep from \*  
to last st, k1. 171 sts.

**Row 6:** WS - Knit.

Rep these 6 rows until piece  
measures 32cm from beg, end  
with a row 6 of patt.

**Next Row:** RS - Knit all sts.

**Next Row:** Knit all sts.

**Next Row:** Knit all sts.

Cast off loosely in k on WS.

## MAKING UP

Join back seam.

## FINGERLESS GLOVES (MAKE 2)

Using 3.75mm needles, cast  
on 54 sts.

**Row 1:** RS - Knit all sts.

**Row 2:** Knit all sts.

Rep last 2 rows once more.

### Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*skp, k9,  
k2tog; rep from \* to last st, k1.  
46 sts.

**Row 2:** WS - Purl.

**Row 3:** RS - K1; \*skp, k7,  
k2tog; rep from \* to last st, k1.  
38 sts.

**Row 4:** WS - Purl.

**Row 5:** RS - K1; \*skp, yo, [k1,  
yo] 5 times, k2tog; rep from \*  
to last st, k1. 54 sts.

**Row 6:** WS - Knit.

Rep these 6 rows 5 times  
more.

**Next Row:** RS - \*K3, k2tog;  
rep from \* to last 4 sts, k4.  
44 sts.

**Next Row:** WS - Purl.

Change to 3.25mm needles.  
Stst until piece measures  
15cm from beg, end with a WS  
row.

Change to 3.75mm needles.  
Stst until piece measures  
21cm from beg, end with a row  
WS row.

Change to 3.25mm needles.  
K1, p1 rib for 6 rows. Cast off  
loosely in rib.

Beg at cast-off edge, join  
seam for approx 6cm. Place  
marker 4.5cm down each side.

### THUMB

With RS facing and 3.75mm  
needles, beg at marker, pick  
up and k 10 sts from marker

to seam 1 stitch at seam and  
10sts to 2nd marker. 21 sts.

**Row 1:** WS - Purl.

**Next Row:** RS - K3, turn, slip  
first st firmly, p to end.

**Next Row:** K21.

**Next Row:** P3, turn, slip first st  
firmly, k to end.

**Next Row:** P21.

**Next Row:** RS - K5, turn, slip  
first st firmly, p to end.

**Next Row:** K21.

**Next Row:** P5, turn, slip first st  
firmly, k to end.

**Next Row:** P21.

**Next Row:** RS - K7, turn, slip  
first st firmly, p to end.

**Next Row:** K21.

**Next Row:** P7, turn, slip first st  
firmly, k to end.

**Next Row:** P21.

**Next Row:** RS - K9, turn, slip  
first st firmly, p to end.

**Next Row:** K21.

**Next Row:** P9, turn, slip first st  
firmly, k to end.

**Next Row:** P21.

Change to 3.25mm needles.  
K1, p1 rib for 2 rows. Cast off  
loosely in rib.

## MAKING UP

Join thumb and rem side  
seam.

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# TEXTURED HI LO HEM JUMPER

## STITCH GUIDE

**NOTE** – If sleeve length is altered, yarn quantity may need to be adjusted.

## FRONT

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 63 (69, 75, 79, 85) sts.

### Beg Rib

**Row 1:** K2, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to last st, K1.

**Row 2:** K1, \* P1, K1, rep from \* to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice, then 1st row once.

**Row 8:** Cast on one st (seam st), P1, rib 11 (13, 15, 17), \* P2tog, K2tog, rib 14 (16, 18, 18, 20), rep from \* once, P2tog, K2tog, rib to end. 58 (64, 70, 74, 80) sts.

### Beg Moss St

**Row 1:** Cast on one st (seam st), \* P1, K1, rep from \* to last st, P1. 59 (65, 71, 75, 81) sts.

**Row 2:** \* P1, K1, rep from \* to last st, P1.

Rep last row for moss st for rem.

## Beg Short Row Turnings and Shape First Side

**NOTE** – When pattern specifies turn, proceed as folls to avoid holes in work. Take yarn under needle and onto other side of work, slip next st onto right-hand needle, take yarn under needle and back to original position, slip st back onto left-hand needle, then turn and proceed as instructed in pattern.

Work extra sts into patt at side edges.

**Row 1:** Inc in first st, patt 19 (21, 23, 24, 26), turn.

**Row 2 and foll alt rows:** Patt to end.

**Row 3:** Patt 18 (20, 21, 22, 24), turn.

**Row 5:** Inc in first st, patt 14 (16, 16, 17, 19), turn.

**Row 7:** Patt 13 (15, 14, 15, 17), turn.

**Row 9:** Inc in first st, patt 9 (11, 9, 10, 12), turn.

**Row 11:** Patt 8 (10, 7, 8, 10), turn.

**Row 13:** Inc in first st, patt 4 (6, 2, 3, 5), turn.

**Row 14:** Patt to end. 63 (69, 75, 79, 85) sts.

## Shape Second Side

**Row 1:** Patt across all sts to last st, inc in last st.

**Row 2:** WS – Patt 21 (23, 25, 26, 28), turn.

**Row 3:** Patt to end.

**Row 4:** Patt 18 (20, 21, 22, 24), turn.

**Row 5:** Patt to last st, inc in last st.

**Row 6:** Patt 16 (18, 18, 19, 21), turn.

**Row 7:** Patt to end.

**Row 8:** Patt 13 (15, 14, 15, 17), turn.

**Row 9:** Patt to last st, inc in last st.

**Row 10:** Patt 11 (13, 11, 12, 14), turn.

**Row 11:** Patt to end.

**Row 12:** Patt 8 (10, 7, 8, 10), turn.

**Row 13:** Patt to last st, inc in last st.

**Row 14:** Patt 6 (8, 4, 5, 7), turn.

**Row 15:** Patt to end.

**Row 16:** Patt across all sts to end. 67 (73, 79, 83, 89) sts.

Keeping patt correct, inc one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 6th (4th, 4th, 4th, 4th) row until there are 95 (81, 99, 125,

139) sts, then in every foll 8th (6th, 6th, 6th, 6th) row until there are 101 (111, 121, 131, 141) sts.

Cont without further shaping until Front measures 36cm at centre, working last row on WS.

## Shape Armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast off 7 (8, 10, 11, 13) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 87 (95, 101, 109, 115) sts.

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

### Yarn

13, 15, 17, 18, 20 balls 50g Cleckheaton Country Merino 8 ply in Cameo 2336

### Needles

4.00mm knitting needles  
3.25mm set double-pointed knitting needles  
Wool sewing needle

### Tension

22 sts by 30 rows over stocking st, on 4.00mm needles to 10cm.

## MEASUREMENTS

Dec one st at each end of next 3 (3, 5, 5, 7) rows, then in every foll alt row 5 (7, 6, 7, 6) times. 71 (75, 79, 85, 89) sts. Work 35 (33, 35, 35, 37) rows.

#### Shape Front Neck

**Next Row:** Patt 26 (28, 30, 32, 34), cast off next 19 (19, 19, 21, 21) sts, patt to end.

Cont on last 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts for right side of front neck.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 2 rows, then in every foll alt row 3 (2, 3, 4, 3) times, then in every foll 4th row 5 (6, 6, 6, 7) times. 16 (18, 19, 20, 22) sts.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 8 (9, 9, 10, 11) sts at beg of next row. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 8 (9, 10, 10, 11) sts. With WS facing, join yarn to rem 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts for left side of front neck.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 2 rows, then in every foll alt row 3 (2, 3, 4, 3) times, then in every foll 4th row 4 (5, 5, 5, 6) times. 17 (19, 20, 21, 23) sts. Work 3 rows.

#### Shape Shoulder

**Next Row:** Cast off 8 (9, 9, 10, 11) sts, patt to last 2 sts, patt 2tog. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 8 (9, 10, 10, 11) sts.

#### BACK

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 205 (225, 243, 265, 285) sts.

#### Beg Rib

Work 7 rows rib as for Front.

**Row 8:** Cast on one st (seam st), P1, rib 13 (15, 20, 19, 21). \* rib 2tog, rib 2, rep from \* to last 16 (18, 23, 22, 24) sts, rib 2tog, rib to end. 161 (177, 193, 209, 225) sts.

#### Beg Stocking St

**Row 1:** Cast on one st (seam st), knit to end. 162 (178, 194, 210, 226) sts.

**Row 2:** Purl. Work in stocking st for rem.

#### Beg Turnings

**Row 1:** K131 (143, 157, 172, 188), turn.

**Row 2:** P100 (108, 120, 134, 150), turn.

**Row 3:** K103 (112, 124, 138, 154), turn.

**Row 4:** P106 (116, 128, 142, 158), turn.

**Row 5:** K109 (120, 132, 146, 162), turn.

**Row 6:** P112 (124, 136, 150, 166), turn.

**Row 7:** K115 (128, 140, 154, 170), turn.

**Row 8:** P118 (132, 144, 158, 174), turn.

**Row 9:** K121 (136, 148, 162, 178), turn.

**Row 10:** P124 (140, 152, 166, 182), turn.

**Row 11:** K127 (144, 156, 170, 186), turn.

**Row 12:** P130 (148, 160, 174, 190), turn.

**Row 13:** K133 (152, 164, 178, 194), turn.

**Row 14:** P136 (156, 168, 182, 198), turn.

**Row 15:** K139 (160, 172, 186, 202), turn.

**Row 16:** P142 (164, 176, 190, 206), turn.

**Row 17:** K145 (168, 180, 194, 210), turn.

**Row 18:** P148 (172, 184, 198, 214), turn.

**Row 19:** Knit to end.

**Row 20:** Purl across all sts to end.

#### Shape Sides

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 3rd (3rd, 2nd, 2nd, 2nd) row until 132 (124, 188, 186, 190) sts rem, then in every foll 4th (4th, 3rd, 3rd, 3rd) row until 106 (116, 128, 138, 150) sts rem.

Cont without further shaping until Back measures 46cm at centre, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Armholes

Cast off 7 (8, 10, 11, 13) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 92 (100, 108, 116, 124) sts.

**Row 3:** K1, K2tog, knit to last 3 sts, sl 1, K1, pssso, K1.

**Row 4:** P1, P2tog tbl, purl to last 3 sts, P2tog, P1.

Rep last 2 rows 0 (0, 1, 2, 2) times, then 3rd row once.

86 (94, 98, 102, 110) sts.

Dec one st (as before) at each end of every foll alt row 6 (7, 7, 7, 8) times. 74 (80, 84, 88, 94) sts.

Cont without further shaping until Back armhole measures 2cm less than Front armhole to beg of shoulder shaping, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Back Neck

**Next Row:** K20 (22, 23, 24, 26), cast off next 34 (36, 38, 40, 42) sts, knit to end.

Cont on last 20 (22, 23, 24, 26) sts for left side of back neck.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 2 rows, then in every foll alt row twice. 16 (18, 19, 20, 22) sts.

#### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 8 (9, 9, 10, 11) sts at beg of next row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 8 (9, 10, 10, 11) sts.



With WS facing, join yarn to rem 20 (22, 23, 24, 26) sts for right side of back neck. Dec one st at neck edge in next 2 rows, then in foll alt row once. 17 (19, 20, 21, 23) sts. Work 1 row.

### Shape Shoulder

**Next Row:** Cast off 8 (9, 9, 10, 11) sts, knit to last 2 sts, K2tog.  
Work 1 row.  
Cast off rem 8 (9, 10, 10, 11) sts.

### SLEEVES

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 45 (47, 49, 51, 53) sts. Work 10 rows rib as for Front. Work 4 rows stocking st. **Next Row:** K2, M1, knit to last 2 sts, M1, K2. 47 (49, 51, 53, 55) sts. Cont in stocking st, inc one st (as before) at each end

of every foll 10th (10th, 6th, 6th, 4th) row until there are 49 (63, 57, 75, 69) sts, then in every foll 12th (12th, 8th, 8th, 6th) row until there are 65 (69, 79, 85, 95) sts. Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 46cm from beg (or length desired), ending with a purl row.

### Shape Top

Cast off 3 (4, 5, 6, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 59 (61, 69, 73, 81) sts.  
**Row 3:** K1, K2tog, knit to last 3 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K1. Dec one st (as before) at each end of every foll alt row until 21 (21, 29, 33, 45) sts rem. Work 1 (1, 0, 0, 0) rows.  
**Sizes M, L and XL only**  
**Next Row:** P1, P2tog tbl, purl to last 3 sts, P2tog, P1.

Dec one st (as before) at each end of every row until 23 sts rem.

### All sizes

21 (21, 23, 23, 23) sts.  
**Next Row:** Cast off 3 sts, knit to last 2 sts, K2tog.  
**Next Row:** Cast off 3 sts, purl to last 2 sts, P2tog.  
Cast off rem 13 (13, 15, 15, 15) sts.

### NECKBAND

Join shoulder seams. With RS facing, using set of 3.25mm double-pointed needles and beg at left shoulder seam, knit up 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts evenly along left side of front neck, knit up 19 (19, 19, 21, 21) sts across cast-off sts on front, knit up 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts evenly along right side of front neck, knit up 7 sts

evenly along right side of back neck, knit up 33 (35, 37, 39, 41) sts across cast-off sts on back, then knit up 7 sts evenly along left side of back neck. 118 (124, 130, 138, 144) sts.  
**Round 1:** \* K1, P1, rep from \* to end.  
Rep last round 14 times.  
Cast off loosely in rib.

### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join side seams from top of lower band to form side split, noting that there will be more rows on front due to the different stitches used. Join sleeve seams. Sew in sleeves. Fold neckband in half to WS and slip-stitch loosely in position.

shade #2039

### Needles and Tools

4.00mm knitting needles  
3.75mm knitting needles  
for straps  
11 markers

### Special Abbreviations

skp - slip 1 st, knit 1 st,  
pass slipped st over;  
W&T - wrap and turn  
(slip next st to right-hand  
needle, bring yarn around  
it and transfer back to  
left-hand needle, turn  
piece ready to work in  
opposite direction with  
yarn ready to k or p as  
established).

### Tension

22 sts by 30 rows over  
Stst on 4.00mm needles  
to 10cm.

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# DROP SHOULDER VEST

## WORKING PATTERN

### BACK

With 4.00mm needles, cast on  
94 (100, 106, 112, 118, 124) sts.

**Row 1:** RS - \*K4, p2; rep from

**Row 3:** (P2, k2) 4 times; k4 (1, 4, 1, 4, 1), (p2, k4) 5 (6, 6, 7, 7, 8) times.

**Row 4:** (P4, k2) 5 (6, 6, 7, 7, 8) times; p4 (1, 4, 1, 4, 1); (p2, k2) 4 times.

Rep last 4 rows twice more.

**Row 1:** RS - (K2, p2) 4 times; k to last 12 sts, (p2, k4) twice.

**Row 2:** (P4, k2) twice; p to last 16 sts, (k2, p2) 4 times.

**Next Row:** WS - (P1, k1) twice, p to last 16 sts, patt 16. Keeping the front edge 16 sts and last 4 rib sts correct, rep last 2 rows twice more. 47 (50, 53, 56, 59, 62) sts.

Keeping the 4 rib sts at armhole edge and the 16 sts at front edge correct, cont straight (without further dec's) until piece measures 60 (61, 62, 63, 64, 65)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

## Shape Armhole/Shoulder

**Next Row:** RS - Patt 16, k to last 10 sts, W&T (leave rem 9 sts unworked).

**Next Row:** WS - P to last 16 sts, patt 16.

**Next Row:** RS - Patt 16, k to wrapped st, lift wrap up onto needle and k together with wrapped st, k to last 4 sts, rib 4.

**Next Row:** WS - Rib 4, p to last 16 sts, patt 16.

Rep these last 4 rows 3 times more.

**Next Row:** RS - Patt 16, k to last 4, rib 4.

**Next Row:** WS - Rib 4, p to last 16 sts, patt 16.

Place marker each end (2nd set of markers to meet with back).

(Piece now measures 66 (67, 68, 69, 70, 71)cm at front edge (not the short row edge).

**Next Row:** RS - (No more rib from here on) patt 16, k to end.

**Next Row:** WS - P to last 16 sts, patt 16.

Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 18.5 (20, 21.5, 23.5,

24, 25)cm from last marker, but take measurement at front edge, ensure to end with same RS row as first front. Leave sts on hold for 3 needle cast-off.

## MAKING UP

Join sts of fronts on WS by working 3 needle-cast-off. With RS facing of back and fronts, lay the Back out on the floor or bed, lay the now joined Fronts section across the top of Back with the 3-needle-cast-off-point meeting the centre Back marker; pin this point together.

Pin the 2nd set of marker points of Fronts and Back together and join top of Back evenly in place to markers. Meet 1st set of markers of Fronts and Back and join side seams downwards from markers omitting lower 7.5cm (leave rib extensions open for slit).

## STRAPS (MAKE 2)

With 3.75mm needles, cast on 121 sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** WS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

Rep these 2 rows 4 times more.

Cast off loosely in patt.

With RS facing of garment, pin strap to left front patterned edge, 5cm below begin of underarm. Carefully sew in place. Repeat for 2nd front.

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# HOOD ON HER

*Wear as a hood or a cowl. Design by Rare Yarns*

## STITCH GUIDE

**Note - This garment is knitted in rounds not rows.**

With 4.00mm Circular needle cast on 196 sts for neck edge. Place a stitch holder on the needle to keep track of rounds for counting. Beg with a K row, knit 6 rounds.

## PATTERN

**Next Round:** Purl 2 rounds  
Next Knit 2 rounds.  
These four rows form the pattern and are repeated throughout the garment. Pattern for 8 more rounds finishing on a knit round.

## Shaping for hood

Decrease rounds  
\*P5, P2 tog; repeat from \* to end of round. 168 sts

**Next Round:** Pattern for 11 rounds

**Next Round:** decrease \*P4, P2 tog; repeat from \* to end of round. 140sts

**Next Rounds:** Pattern for another 169 rounds ending on a purl round.

**Next Rounds:** Knit 6 rounds to create border. Cast off for top edge.

## MAKING UP

Do not press. Fold back knit borders in half to wrong side

and sl st into place. Sew in ends.

## MAKING ON STANDARD NEEDLES

**Note: For those who want to use a pair of needles, not circulars**

The 6 border rows at beginning and end are stocking stitch (K a row, P a Row)  
And the 4 pattern rows are as follows

**Row 1:** Purl

**Round 20:** Inc - \*k3, kfb, rep from \* around. 225 (235, 245, 255) sts.

**Round 21:** Purl.

**Round 22 to 26:** rep rounds 1-5.

**Round 27:** Inc - \*k8 (5, 4, 4) kfb, rep from \* around, end k 0 (1, 0, 0) sts. 250 (274, 294, 306) sts.

**Round 28:** Purl.

**Round 29 to 33:** rep rounds 1-5.

### For Sizes Medium only

Beg with a knit round, work 4 rounds in garter st.

### For Sizes Large and Xlarge only

**Round 34:** \*k48 (13) kfb, rep from \* around, end k0 (12) sts. 300 (327) sts.

**Round 35:** Purl.

**Round 36 to 40:** rep rounds 1-5.

Beg with a knit round, work 4 (8) rounds in garter st.

### All Sizes divide body and sleeves

**Next Round:** K83 (93, 103, 111) for front, place side marker, place next 47 (49, 52, 57) sts on st holder or scrap yarn for sleeve, k73 (83, 93, 102) for back, place next 47 (49, 52, 57) sts on st holder or scrap yarn for sleeve. 156 (176, 196, 213) sts for body.

Work in Stocking st for 5 (6.5, 7.5, 7.5) cm

### Beg Waist Shaping

**Round Decrease:** (k2tog, k to sts before marker, ssk sl marker) twice. 4 sts decreased.

Cont in stocking st, rep dec round every 5th round twice more. 144 (164, 184, 201) sts. Work even in stocking st for 9 (9, 10, 10) cm from last dec round.

**Round Increase:** (kbf, k 1st before marker, kbf, sl marker) twice. 4sts increased. Cont in stocking st, rep inc round every 5th round twice more. 156 (176, 196, 213) sts. Work in stocking st until body measures 28 (30.5, 33, 33) cm from underarm. Beg with a purl round, work 8 rounds in garter st. Cast off all stitches purlwise.

## SLEEVES

Place 47 (49, 52, 57) sts on dpn. Join yarn to underarm and pm for beg of round. Beg with a purl round, work 8 rounds in garter st. Cast off all purlwise.

## MAKING UP

Sew underarm seams.

## STRIPED COLOUR VERSION (WORKED IN 2 NON-IDENTICAL PIECES)

### First Piece

Using 5.00mm needles and C1 cast on 150 sts.

#### Row 1: Knit

**Row 2:** P1, \*K2 together, repeat from \* to last st, P1

**Row 3:** K1, \*knit into front and back of next st, repeat from \* to last st, K1.

**Row 4:** Purl to last 2sts, P2 together.

**Row 5:** \*\* Using C2, K2 together, knit to end.

**Row 6:** same as 2nd row.

**Row 7:** same as 3rd row.

**Row 8:** Purl to last 2 sts, P2 together.

Using C3, repeat rows 5 to 8 inclusive once.

Using C1 repeat rows 5 to 8 inclusive once\*\* Repeat from \*\* to \*\* twice more = 131sts.

Using C1, cast off knitways.

### Second Piece

Using 5.00mm needles and C1 cast on 150 sts.

#### Row 1: Knit

**Row 2:** P1, \*K2 together, repeat from \* to last st, P1

**Row 3:** K1, \*knit into front and back of next st, repeat from \* to last st, K1

**Row 4:** P2 together, purl to end.

**Row 5:** \*\* Using C2, Knit to last 2 sts, K2 together.

**Row 6:** same as 2nd row.

**Row 7:** same as 3rd row.

**Row 8:** P2together, purl to end.

Using (C3) repeats rows 5 to 8 inclusive once.

Using (C1) repeats rows 5 to 8 inclusive once\*\*

Repeat from \*\* to \*\* twice

more = 131sts. Using C1 cast off knitways.

Using C1 and a backstitch, join straight edges together.

## SPIRAL TASSELS

Using 5.00mm needles and C1 cast on 28sts.

**Row 1:** \*(K1, yarn forward, K1) all into one st, repeat from\*

for every stitch on needle until you reach the end.

Cast off knitways taking care to leave approx 6cm of yarn before breaking thread to allow enough yarn to use for attaching spirals to scarf. Curl the stitches round to form a spiral.

Make 7 more spirals in C1 and 6 spirals in each of C2 and C3. 20 spirals in total.

Stitch 10 spirals to each end of shaped edge of scarf in following order: C1, C2 and C3 repeat this order 3 times in total and finish with C1 spiral, matching the spirals to stripes.

## SOLID COLOUR VERSION

Follow same instructions as for Striped Version, working in one colour only throughout.

## JOSS HAT CROWN (TOP SECTION OF HAT)

Both the Striped and Single colour version are as follows: Using 4.00mm needles and C1 cast on 127 sts.

**Row 1:** K2, \*P1, K1, repeat from \* to last st. K1

**Row 2:** K1, \*P1, K1, repeat from \* to end.

Repeat 1st and 2nd rows twice, increasing one st in centre of last row. 128 sts. 6 rows rib in all.

Work 20 rows stocking st.

### Shape Crown

**Row 1:** K1, \*slip1, K1, pass slip st over, K19, repeat from \* to last st, K1. 122sts

**Row 2:** P1, \* P18, P2 together, repeat from \* to last st, P1. 116sts

**Row 3:** K1, \*slip1, K1, pass slip st over, K17 repeat from \* to last st, K1. 110sts

**Row 4:** P1, \* P16, P2 together, repeat from \* to last st, P1. 104sts.

**Row 5:** K1, \*slip1, K1, pass slip st over, K15, repeat from \* to last st, K1. 98sts.

**Row 6:** P1, \* P14, P2 together, repeat from \* to last st, P1. 92sts.

Continue decreasing in this manner for every row (which means working 1 st less each time between decreasing and noting that this will give 6sts less after each row) do



this until 20 sts remain.  
(This should occur by the end of the 18th row.)

**Next Row:** \*K2 together, repeat from \* to end. 10 sts. Break off yarn leaving 10cm of yarn, using a wool sewing needle, run yarn end through remaining sts, remove these sts from knitting needle and draw up and fasten off securely.

With RS of crown facing each other backstitch the cast on and cast off edges to form crown (top) of Hat.

To achieve correct tension for BRIM of Hat, follow 5.00mm needle tension using C2.

### BRIM (BASE OF HAT) STRIPED VERSION

Using 5.00mm Needles and C1 cast on 36 sts.

**Row 1:** \*\* Using C1, Knit.

**Row 2:** P1, \* K2 together, repeat from \* to last st, P1.

**Row 3:** K1, \* knit into front and back of next st, repeat from \* to last st, K1.

**Row 4:** Purl.

Using C2 repeat Rows 1 to 4 inclusive once.

Using C3, repeat Rows 1 to 4 inclusive once. \*\*

Repeat from \*\* to \*\* until Brim fits (slightly stretched) evenly around cast on edge of Hat, ending with 4 Rows of C3.

Using C3, cast off knitways.

Using a flat seam, join cast on and cast off edges of Brim together to form a circle.

With right side of crown facing, sew side edge of wrong side of brim to cast on edge of crown, using C1, and a flat seam. Fold brim in half onto right side and catch in position.

### BRIM (BASE OF HAT) SOLID COLOUR VERSION

Follow instructions as for Striped Version, work in one colour only throughout.

### SPIRAL TASSELS FOR HAT Striped Version

Using 4mm Needles and C1, cast on 24sts. (These spirals are designed to be shorter and tighter than those made for the Scarf).

**Row 1:** \*(K1, yarn forward, K1) all into first st, repeat from \* each st to end.  
Cast off to Scarf.

Curl the stitches round to form a spiral.

Make 2 more spirals in C1( ) and 3 spirals in both C2 and C3 = 9 spirals in total. Group spirals together to form a tassel by collecting together the long yarn threads that were left at ends of every spiral. Pull these grouped ends of yarn through the centre hole at top of crown and knot

securely inside crown, cut off excess yarn threads.

### Solid Colour Version

Follow same instructions as for Striped Version of Tassels, work all 9 tassels in one colour only throughout.

**DESIGN FEATURE – This Jumper has been designed with raglan armhole shaping on the Back, but the Front features saddle shoulder shaping.**

## BACK

Using 3.25mm needles, cast on 114 (122, 126, 130, 138, 142) sts.

**Row 1:** K2, \* P2, K2, rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** P2, \* K2, P2, rep from \* to end.

Last 2 rows form rib.

Work a further 20 rows rib, inc 2 (0, 2, 2, 0, 2) sts evenly in last row. 116 (122, 128, 132, 138, 144) sts.

Change to 4.00mm needles. Work in stocking st until Back measures 42cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

## Shape Armholes

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 110 (116, 122, 126, 132, 138) sts. \*\*

**Row 3:** K3, K2tog, knit to last 5 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K3.

**Row 4:** P3, P2tog tbl, purl to last 5 sts, P2tog, P3.

**Row 5:** As 3rd row. 104 (110, 116, 120, 126, 132) sts.

**Row 6:** Purl.

Rep last 4 rows 1 (2, 5, 5, 6, 8) times. 98 (98, 86, 90, 90, 84) sts.

Dec one st (as before) at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 30 (32, 32, 34, 36, 36) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Leave rem sts on a stitch-holder.

## FRONT

Work as for Back to \*\*.

**Row 3:** K3, K2tog, knit to last 5 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K3. 108 (114, 120, 124, 130, 136) sts.

Dec one st (as before) at each end of every foll alt row 0 (0, 0, 0, 1, 4) times, then in every foll 4th row until 100 (106, 112, 116, 120, 122) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

## Divide for Neck

**Next Row:** K39 (42, 45, 47, 49, 50), cast off next 22 sts, knit to end.

Cont on last 39 (42, 45, 47, 49, 50) sts for right side of neck.

Work 1 row.

**Next Row:** K2tog, knit to last 5 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K3.

\*\*\* Dec one st at neck edge in every foll 4th row 8 (9, 9, 9, 9, 9) times, at same time dec one st (as before) at armhole edge in every foll 4th row 0 (2, 7, 6, 9, 9) times, then in every foll 6th row 5 (4, 1, 2, 0, 0) times. 24 (25, 26, 28, 29, 30) sts.

Work 4 (2, 2, 4, 4, 4) rows.

## Shape Shoulder

Cast off 6 (6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts at beg of next row, then in every foll alt row twice. 6 (7, 8, 7, 8, 9) sts.

Work 1 row. Cast off. \*\*\*

With WS facing, join yarn to rem 39 (42, 45, 47, 49, 50) sts for left side of neck and purl to end.

**Next Row:** K3, K2tog, knit to last 2 sts, sl 1, K1, psso.

Rep from \*\*\* to \*\*\*, working 1 row less before shoulder shaping.

## LEFT SLEEVE

Using 3.25mm needles, cast on 66 (70, 70, 74, 74, 74) sts.

**Row 1:** K0 (2, 2, 0, 0, 0), \* P2, K2, rep from \* to last 2 (0, 0, 2, 2, 2) sts, P2 (0, 0, 2, 2, 2).

**Row 2:** P0 (2, 2, 0, 0, 0), \* K2, P2, rep from \* to last 2 (0, 0, 2, 2, 2) sts, K2 (0, 0, 2, 2, 2).

Last 2 rows form rib for Sleeves.

Work a further 20 rows rib.

Change to 4.00mm needles.

**Row 5:** K2, M1, patt to last 2 sts, M1, K2. 68 (72, 72, 76, 76, 76) sts.

Keeping patt correct, inc one st (as before) at each end of every foll 10th (12th, 10th, 12th, 8th, 8th) row until there are 78 (84, 82, 88, 78, 86) sts, then in every foll 12th (14th, 12th, 14th, 10th, 10th) row until there are 86 (88, 90, 92, 96, 98) sts.

Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 50cm (or length desired) from beg, working last row on WS.

#### Shape Top

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 80 (82, 84, 86, 90, 92) sts.

#### Sizes 24 and 26 only

**Row 3:** K3, K2tog, patt to last 5 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K3.

**Row 4:** P3, P2tog tbl, patt to last 5 sts, P2tog, P3.

**Row 5:** As 3rd row. (84, 86) sts. Work 1 row without shaping. Rep last 4 rows (0, 1) times.

#### All sizes

80 (82, 84, 86, 84, 80) sts.

**Next Row:** K3, K2tog, patt to last 5 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K3. Dec one st (as before) at each end of every foll 4th row 2 (2, 0, 0, 0, 0) times, then in every foll alt row until 40 (42, 42, 44, 44, 44) sts rem.

Work 1 row. \*\*\*\*

#### Beg Saddle

Dec one st (as before) at beg only in next row, then in every foll alt row until 24 (25, 24, 25, 25, 24) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Leave sts on a stitch-holder.

#### RIGHT SLEEVE

Work as for Left Sleeve to \*\*\*\*.

#### Beg Saddle

Dec one st (as before) at end only in next row, then in every foll alt row until 24 (25, 24, 25, 25, 24) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Leave sts on a stitch-holder.

#### SHAWL COLLAR

Join back raglan seams.

Sew in front edge of sleeves, placing cast-off shoulder sts to straight saddle section of sleeves and noting that tops of sleeves form part of neckline.

With RS facing, using 3.25mm circular needle and beg at side of centre front cast-off sts, knit up 45 (45, 46, 46, 47, 48) sts evenly along right side edge of neck to seam, knit across sts from right sleeve stitch-holder, knit across sts from back stitch-holder, knit across sts from left sleeve stitch-holder, then knit up 45 (45, 46, 46, 47, 48) sts evenly along left side edge of neck. 168 (172, 172, 176, 180, 180) sts.

**NOTE – Do not join to work in rounds, but work backwards and forwards in rows.**

**Row 1:** P3, \* K2, P2, rep from \* to last st, P1.

**Row 2:** K3, \* P2, K2, rep from \* to last st, K1.

Last 2 rows form rib for shawl collar.

**NOTE – When pattern specifies turn, proceed as folls to avoid holes in your work. Take yarn under needle and onto other side of work, slip next st onto right-hand needle, take yarn back to original position,**

**slip st back onto left-hand needle, then turn and proceed as instructed in the pattern.**

**Row 3:** Rib 108 (112, 112, 116, 120, 120), turn.

**Row 4:** Rib 48 (52, 52, 56, 60, 60), turn.

**NOTE – When knitting a wrapped st, insert right-hand needle through wrap as well as through the st it wraps, then knit wrap and st tog. When purling a wrapped st, using right-hand needle, pick up back loop of the wrap, place on left-hand needle, then purl wrap and st tog.**

**Row 5:** Rib 52 (56, 56, 60, 64, 64), turn.

**Row 6:** Rib 56 (60, 60, 64, 68, 68), turn.

**Row 7:** Rib 60 (64, 64, 68, 72, 72), turn.

Cont in this manner (working 4 sts extra each time) until the row "Rib 100 (104, 104, 108, 112, 112), turn" has been worked.

**Next Row:** Rib to end.

**Next Row:** Rib across all sts to end. 168 (172, 172, 176, 180, 180) sts.

Work 25 rows.

Cast off very loosely in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join side and sleeve seams. Sew left side edge of shawl collar to stitches cast off at centre front. On WS, slip-stitch other side edge of shawl collar in position.

Work 8 (10, 12, 14, 16, 18) rows Stripe Patt (above).

## Shape Raglan Armholes

**Row 1:** Using M for rem, sl st

in first tr, (1dc, 1ch) in next tr, dDec, 1tr in each tr to last 5 sts, dDec, 1tr in next tr, turn, leaving last st unworked. 27 (30, 35, 39, 41, 43) sts.

**Row 2:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, Dec, 1tr in each tr to last 3 sts, Dec, 1tr in last st. 25 (28, 33, 37, 39, 41) sts. \*\*

Rep last row 5 (6, 5, 4, 5, 5) times. 15 (16, 23, 29, 29, 31) sts.

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, dDec, 1tr in each tr to last 4 sts, dDec, 1tr in last tr. 11 (12, 19, 25, 25, 27) sts.

Rep last 2 rows 0 (0, 1, 2, 2, 2) times. 11 (12, 13, 13, 13, 15) sts.  
Fasten off.

## FRONT

Work as for Back to \*\*.

Rep last row 3 (4, 5, 4, 5, 5) times. 19 (20, 23, 29, 29, 31) sts.

## Sizes 9, 12 and 18 months only

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, dDec, 1tr in each tr to last 4 sts, dDec, 1tr in last st. (25, 25, 27) sts.

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, Dec, 1tr in each tr to last 3 sts, Dec, 1tr in last st. (23, 23, 25) sts.

## All sizes

19 (20, 23, 23, 23, 25) sts.

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, (Dec) 1 (1, 0, 0, 0, 0) times, (dDec) 0 (0, 1, 1, 1, 1) times, 1tr in each of next 2tr, Dec, turn. Cont on these 5 sts for side of neck.

**Next Row:** 2ch, miss first tr, 1tr in next st, Dec, 1tr in last st. 3 sts.

**Next Row:** 2ch, miss first tr, Dec.

Fasten off.

Miss 5 (6, 7, 7, 7, 9) tr and join M with a sl st in next tr for other side of neck.

**Next Row:** 2ch, 1tr in each of next 3tr, (Dec) 1 (1, 0, 0, 0, 0) times, (dDec) 0 (0, 1, 1, 1, 1) times, 1tr in last tr.

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, (Dec) twice. 3 sts.

**Next Row:** 2ch, miss first st, Dec.

Fasten off.

## SLEEVES

Using 4.00mm hook and C1, loosely make 20 (22, 22, 24, 24, 24) ch.

**Row 1:** Miss 3ch (counts as one tr), 1tr in each ch to end. 18 (20, 20, 22, 22, 22) sts.

**Row 2:** (1dc, 1ch) in first tr, 1tr in each tr to end.

Using C2 (C2, C1, C1, C1, C1), cont as folls –

**Row 3:** (1dc, 1ch) in first tr, 2tr in next tr, 1tr in each tr to last 2 sts, 2tr in next tr, 1tr in last st. 20 (22, 22, 24, 24, 24) sts. Keeping Stripes correct as for Back, inc one st (as before) at

**Row 2:** (1dc, 1ch) in first st, Dec, 1tr in each tr to last 3 sts,

Dec, 1tr in last st. 20 (22, 24, 26, 28, 28) sts.

Rep last row until 8 sts rem. Fasten off.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press.

Join back and right front raglan seams. Join side and sleeve seams, matching stripes.

Rib 8 (8, 8, 10, 10) more rows. Change to 3.25mm needles.

### Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

**Row 2:** WS - \*K2, p2; rep from

\* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

Cont in Main patt until work measures 23 (25, 28, 31, 35) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Cast off loosely all sts, place marker 22 (23, 24, 25, 28) sts in from each end to denote shoulders.

## FRONT

With 2.75mm needles, cast on 71 (75, 79, 83, 91) sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** WS - \*P1, k1; rep from \* to last st, p1.

Rib 8 (8, 8, 10, 10) more rows.

Change to 3.25mm needles.

### Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

**Row 2:** WS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

Cont in Main patt until work measures 16 (18, 20, 22, 25) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

## Shape Neck

**Next Row:** RS - Patt 28 (30, 31, 32, 36) sts, turn, on these sts only (leave rem sts on hold).

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row 4 (5, 5, 5, 6) times, then every other RS row twice. 22 (23, 24, 25, 28) sts.

Patt straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Cast off loosely.

With RS facing return to sts



on hold, slip next 15 (15, 17, 19, 19) sts to holder, rejoin yarn, patt to end.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row 4 (5, 5, 5, 6) times, then every other RS row twice. 22 (23, 24, 25, 28) sts.

Patt straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a RS row. Cast off loosely.

## SLEEVES

With 2.75mm needles, cast on 43 (47, 51, 51, 55) sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** WS - \*P1, k1; rep from \* to last st, p1.

Rib 6 (6, 6, 8, 8) more rows. Change to 3.25mm needles.

## Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

**Row 2:** WS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

Cont in Main patt and inc 1 st each end every 8th (9th, 10th, 8th, 8th) row 5 (5, 5, 7, 7) times to 53 (57, 61, 65, 69) sts.

Patt straight until piece measures 16 (18, 20, 21, 24) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Cast off loosely.

## MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams.

## COLLAR

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, slip the front holder 15 (15, 17, 19, 19) sts onto needle, ensure next row will be a RS row.

Garter Stitch (k every row) and inc 1 st at end of every 4th RS row (every 8th row at neck edge) until piece fits easily along front neck edge to shoulder seam (do not stretch when measuring otherwise collar will pull forward later).

Place marker at neck edge side of collar.

Garter Stitch until collar fits along back neck to next shoulder seam (do not stretch when measuring).

Place marker at neck edge side of collar.

Now dec 1 st at neck edge every 4th RS row until 15 (15, 17, 19, 19) sts rem on needle. With both markers meeting up with the shoulder seams, ensure collar fits easily down front neck edge; work some extra rows if required (do not stretch when measuring). Cast off loosely.

Sew collar in place, ensure markers are meeting; slipstitch collar cast off edge in behind beg of collar. Place markers 10.5 (11, 11.5, 12.5, 13) cm down from shoulder seams on back and front.

Sew sleeves between markers. Join side and sleeve seams.

## HAT

With 2.75mm needles, cast on 107 (115, 123) sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** WS - \*P1, k1; rep from \* to last st, p1.

Rib 8 (8, 8, 10, 10) more rows. Change to 3.25mm needles.

## Beg Main Pattern

**Row 1:** RS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

**Row 2:** WS - \*K2, p2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

Main patt until hat measures 13 (15, 17) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

## Shape Top

**Row 1:** RS - (K2, p2, k2, p2tog) 13 (14, 15) times; k2, p1. 94 (101, 108) sts.

**Row 2:** WS - (K2, p1, k2, p2) 13 (14, 15) times; k2, p1.

**Row 3:** RS - (K2, p2tog, k2, p1) 13 (14, 15) times; k2, p1. 81 (87, 93) sts.

**Row 4:** WS - \*K2, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 5:** (K1, p2, k1, p2tog) 13 (14, 15) times; k1, p2. 68 (73, 78) sts.

**Row 6:** K2, p1; (k1, p1, k2, p1) 13 (14, 15) times.

**Row 7:** (K1, p2tog, k1, p1) 13 (14, 15) times; k1, p2tog. 54 (58, 62) sts.

**Row 8:** \*K1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 9:** K2tog across row - 27 (29, 31) sts.

**Row 10:** Purl.

**Row 11:** K1; \*k2tog; rep from \* to end. 14 (15, 16) sts.

**Row 12:** Purl.

## MEASUREMENTS

SMALL 130CM X 140CM

LARGE 157CM X 160CM



## STITCH GUIDE

Notes: Blanket is worked flat, not in the round. Circular needle is required to fit the stitches required for the width of the blanket.

Using 12mm needles Cast on loose 107(125) sts.

## BOTTOM EDGE

**Row 1:** RS - Sl1, p1, work (k1, p1) ribbing to end of row, ending k1.

**Row 2:** WS - Sl1, work in ribbing to end of row. Rep these 2 rows another 2 times, for 6 rows of ribbing.

## PATTERN SET-UP

**Row 1:** RS - Sl1, p1, k1, p1. K1, m1, k1. K to 4 sts from end of row, (p1, k1) twice. (1 st inc, 108(126) sts total.)

**Row 2:** WS - Sl1, k1, p1, k1, p to 4 sts from end of row, (k1, p1) twice.

**Row 3:** Sl1, p1, k1, p1. K to 4 sts from end of row, (p1, k1) twice.

**Row 4:** Sl1, k1, p1, k1, p to 4 sts from end of row, (k1, p1) twice.

## BLANKET PATTERN

**Row 1:** (RS) Sl1, p1, k1, p1, k3. (K1, p3) 11(13) times. K 6(8) sts. (p3, k1) 11(13) times. K3. (p1, k1) twice.

**Row 2:** WS - Sl1, work all rem sts as they appear.

**Row 3:** Sl1, p1, k1, p1. K to 4 sts from end of row, (p1, k1) twice.

**Row 4:** Sl1, work all rem sts as they appear.

**Rows 5 and 6:** Repeat Rows 3 & 4.

As desired, use stitch markers to note pattern repeats.



Repeat these last 6 rows 10(12) times more, work Rows 1 - 2 once more. Blanket measures approximately 63.5 (73.5)cm in length. (Establishes 2 panels of textured stitch pattern, with ribbing at each edge of blanket).

**Next Row:** RS - Sl1, p1, k1, p1. K to 4 sts from end of row, (p1, k1) twice.

**Next Row:** WS - Sl1, work all rem sts as they appear. Rep these last 2 rows another 4(5) times. Creates 10(12) rows of plain knitting, with ribbing continuing at each edge.

## Continue Blanket Pattern

Rows 1 - 6 as established above to work the 6-row pattern a total of 11(13) times, work Rows 1 - 2 once more. Blanket measures approximately 134.5(155)cm in length.

**Next Row:** RS - Sl1, p1, k1, p1. K to 4 sts from end of row, (p1, k1) twice.

**Next Row:** WS - Sl1, k1, p1, k1, p to 4 sts from end of row, (k1, p1) twice. Rep these 2 rows once more.

## TOP EDGE

**Row 1:** RS - Sl1, p1, k2tog. (p1, k1) to end of row. 1 st dec. 107 (125) sts.

**Row 2:** WS - Sl1, work in ribbing to end of row. Rep these 2 rows another 2 times, for 6 rows of ribbing.

Cast off all sts in ribbing.

## MAKING UP

Weave in any remaining ends. Wash finished blanket according to fibre content/ yarn label instructions. Squeeze dry over a basin and/ or wrapped inside of several towels to remove water as well as possible. Lay flat to dry.

**Next Row:** \*P1, k2; rep from \* to last st, p1.

**Next Row:** P1; \*k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Next Row:** RS - \*P1, k2tog, rep from \* to last st, p1. 31 (33, 35) sts.

**Next Row:** P1; \*k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Next Row:** RS - K1, \*k2tog; rep from \* to end. 16 (17, 18) sts.

**Next Row:** P2tog across, end p0 (1, 0). 8 (9, 9) sts.

Break yarn, leaving longer end, thread end through rem sts and pull closed, secure end.

Work 55 (57, 57, 59, 59, 61) rows.

### Shape Shoulders

Cast off 7 (7, 7, 8, 9, 9) sts at beg of next 4 rows, then 6 (7, 8, 9, 8, 9) sts at beg of foll 2 rows.

Leave rem 31 (33, 35, 37, 39, 41) sts on stitch-holder for neckband.

### FRONT

Work as for Back to \*\*.

Work 31 (29, 29, 29, 29, 27) rows.

### Shape Neck

**Next Row:** K29 (31, 32, 36, 37, 39), turn.

\*\*\* Cont on these 29 (31, 32, 36, 37, 39) sts for left side of neck.

Dec one st at neck edge in next 2 rows, then in every foll alt row 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) times, then in every foll 4th row 3 (4, 4, 4, 4, 5) times. 20 (21, 22, 25, 26, 27) sts.

Work 1 row.

### Shape Shoulder

Cast off 7 (7, 7, 8, 9, 9) sts at beg of next row and foll alt row. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 6 (7, 8, 9, 8, 9) sts. \*\*\*

Slip next 13 (13, 15, 15, 17, 17) sts onto stitch-holder and leave for neckband.

With RS facing, join yarn to rem 29 (31, 32, 36, 37, 39) sts for right side of neck and knit to end.

Rep from \*\*\* to \*\*\*, working 2 rows instead of 1 before shoulder shaping.

### NECKBAND

Join right shoulder seam.

With RS facing and using

3.25mm needles, knit up 24 (26, 28, 30, 30, 32) sts evenly along left side of neck, knit across sts from front stitch-holder, knit up 24 (26, 28, 30, 30, 32) sts evenly along right side of neck, then knit across sts from back stitch-holder – dec one st in centre. 91 (97, 105, 111, 115, 121) sts.

Work 9 rows rib as for Back, beg with a 2nd row. Cast off loosely in rib.

### ARMHOLE BANDS

Join left shoulder and neckband seam. With RS facing and using 3.25mm needles, knit up 113 (125, 133, 143, 149, 161) sts evenly along armhole edge.

Work 9 rows rib as for Back, beg with a 2nd row. Cast off loosely in rib.

### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join side and armhole band seams. Sew in ends.

**Next Row:** WS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Next Row:** RS - K1; \*k2tog; rep from \* to end. 14 (15, 16) sts.

**Next Row:** Purl.

Break yarn, leaving longer end, thread through rem sts and pull together, secure end. Join back seam.

### RIGHT FRONT

Using 10mm needles cast on 43sts

Work in moss st as for back until work measures 22cm from beg, working last row on WS.

#### Beg shaping

**Next Row:** moss 12, turn.

Cont in moss st on these 12 sts for collar until work measures 31cm from beg cast on edge, working last row on WS.

Cast off in moss st.

With RS facing, join yarn to rem 31sts.

**Next Row:** K3, moss 2tog, moss to last 2 sts, moss 2 tog.

**Next Row:** moss to last 3 sts P3.

Rep last 2 rows 8 times more. 13 armhole opening sts.

Cont without shaping until work measures 38cm from beg working last row on WS. Cast off rem sts in moss st.

### MAKING UP

Do not press. Using yarn needle and half mattress stitch join back and fronts together at shoulder seams. Using a flat

**Round 2:** 3ch, 2tr in same ch sp, (1ch, group) 4 times, 1ch, \* Inc, (1ch, group) 7 times, 1ch, rep from \* once, Inc, (1ch, group) 1 (2, 3, 4, 4) times, 1ch, sl st in 3rd ch at beg, sl st in each of next 2tr, change to M, sl st in next ch sp. 26 (27, 28, 29, 29) groups.  
Break off C1.

**Round 3:** 3ch, 2tr in same ch sp, \* 1ch, group, rep from \* to end, 1ch, sl st in 3rd ch at beg, sl st in each of next 2tr, change to C2, sl st in next ch sp.

**Round 4:** 3ch, 2tr in same ch sp, (1ch, group) twice, 1ch, \* Inc, (1ch, group) 8 times, 1ch, rep from \* once, (Inc) 0 (1, 1, 1, 1) times, (1ch, group) in each ch sp to end, 1ch, sl st in 3rd ch at beg, sl st in each of next 2tr, change to M, sl st in next ch sp. 28 (30, 31, 32, 32) groups.  
Break off C2.

Using M, work 1 round, changing to C3 for final sl st. Using C3, work 1 round, inc 2 (2, 3, 3, 4) groups evenly around and changing to M for final sl st. 30 (32, 34, 35, 36) groups.  
Break off C3.

Using M, work 1 round, changing to C4 for final sl st at end of round.

Using C4, work 1 round, inc 2 (2, 2, 3, 4) groups evenly around and changing to M for final sl st. 32 (34, 36, 38, 40) groups.  
Break off C4.

**Round 9:** Using M for rem, 3ch, 2tr in same ch sp, \* 1ch, group, rep from \* to end, 1ch, sl st in 3rd ch at beg.

### Beg Armhole Edge

**\*\* Row 1:** 1ch, 1dc in same st as sl st, (1htr and 1tr) in next st, turn.

**Row 2:** (1dc, 1ch, 1tr) in first tr, 1tr in next st, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, turn. 7 sts.

### Sizes 4, 6, 8 and 10 years only

**Row 3:** 1ch, 1dc in each of first 2dc, 1htr in next st, 1tr in each of next 3 sts, 2tr in turning ch.

**Row 4:** (1dc, 1ch, 1tr) in first tr, 1tr in each of next 6 sts, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, turn. 12 sts.

### Size 10 years only

**Row 5:** 1ch, 1dc in each of first 2dc, 1htr in next st, 1tr in each of next 8 sts, 2tr in turning ch.

**Row 6:** (1dc, 1ch, 1tr) in first tr, 1tr in each of next 10 sts, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 3 sts, turn. 17 sts.

### All sizes

7 (12, 12, 12, 17) sts.

Fasten off. \*\*

With RS facing, miss next 20 (24, 24, 24, 28) sts along edge of yoke (for right cap sleeve) and join M with a sl st in next st for Front.

### Beg Armhole Edge

**\*\*\* Row 1:** (1dc, 1ch, 1tr) in same st as sl st, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 2 sts, turn.

**Row 2:** 1ch, 1dc in each of first 2dc, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1tr in next st, 2tr in turning ch. 7 sts.

### Sizes 4, 6, 8 and 10 years only

**Row 3:** (1dc, 1ch, 1tr) in first tr, 1tr in each of next 5sts, 1htr in next st, 1dc in each of next 3 sts, turn.

**Row 4:** 1ch, 1dc in each of first 2dc, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1tr in each of next 6 sts, 2tr in turning ch. 12 sts.

### Size 10 years only

**Row 5:** (1dc, 1ch, 1tr) in first tr, 1tr in each of next 8tr, 1htr in each of next 2 sts, 1dc in each of next 4 sts, turn.

**Row 6:** 1ch, 1dc in each of first 2dc, 1htr in next dc, 1tr in each of next 12 sts, 2tr in turning ch. 17 sts.

7 (12, 12, 12, 17) sts. \*\*\*

Do not break off yarn. Leave loop on a scrap of yarn or safety pin until needed.

\*\*\*\* **Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first tr, 1tr in each of next 6 (11, 11, 11, 16) sts, 1tr in each of next 34 (28, 32, 36, 30) sts along edge of yoke, 1tr in each of next 7 (12, 12, 12, 17) sts. 48 (52, 56, 60, 64) tr, counting turning ch as 1tr.

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first tr, 2tr in next tr, 1tr in each tr to last 2 sts, 2tr in next tr, 1tr in top of turning ch. 50 (54, 58, 62, 66) tr, counting turning ch as 1tr.

**Next Row:** (1dc, 1ch) in first tr, 1tr in each st to end.

Rep last row once.

Tie a coloured thread at each end of last row to mark beg of side seam.

Cont in tr fabric, inc one st (as before) at each end of every

full 3rd row until there are 66 (72, 68, 68, 68) tr, then in every full 4th row 0 (0, 4, 6, 8) times. 66 (72, 76, 80, 84) tr. Cont without further shaping until work measures 27 (33, 38, 40, 43) cm from coloured threads.

With RS facing, miss next 20 (24, 24, 24, 28) sts along edge of yoke (for left cap sleeve) and join M with a sl st in next st.

### Beg Armhole Edge

Rep from \*\*\* to \*\*\*.

### WORK BACK

Work as for Front from \*\*\*\* to \*\*\*\*.

### NECK EDGING

Using 4.00mm hook and M, work 1 round of dc evenly around neck edge of yoke, working over hat elastic, fasten off.

### MAKING UP

Do not press. Using a flat seam, join sides. Adjust hat elastic to fit, tie ends and secure.

**Row 1:** WS – Knit to last st, K1tbl.

**Row 2:** Sl 1, K22, K3tog, K22, K1tbl. 47 sts.

**Row 3 and foll alt rows:** Sl 1, knit to last st, K1tbl.

**Row 4:** Sl 1, K21, K3tog, K21, K1tbl. 45 sts.

**Row 6:** Sl 1, K20, K3tog, K20, K1tbl. 43 sts.

Cont dec 2 sts in this manner in every foll alt row until 5 sts rem, working last row on WS

**Row 46:** Sl 1, K3tog, K1tbl. 3 sts.

**Row 47:** Sl 1, K1, K1tbl.

#### Second Square

**\*\* Change to C4.**

**Next Row:** K3tog, do not turn, with RS facing, knit up 24 sts

along side of previous square, turn, cast on 24 sts. 49 sts.

Work rows 1 to 47 incl as for First Square. **\*\***

#### Remaining Squares

Working in colour order as shown in diagram, rep from **\*\*** to **\*\*** 3 (5) times. 3 sts.

**Next Row:** K3tog, fasten off. 5 (7) squares.

## SECOND STRIP

#### First Square

Using 10.00mm needles and 2 strands of C2 tog, cast on

24 sts, turn, with RS of First Strip facing and using needle holding these sts, knit up 25 sts along rows on rem side edge of First Square. 49 sts.

**Row 1 and foll alt rows:** WS – Sl 1, knit to last st, K1tbl.

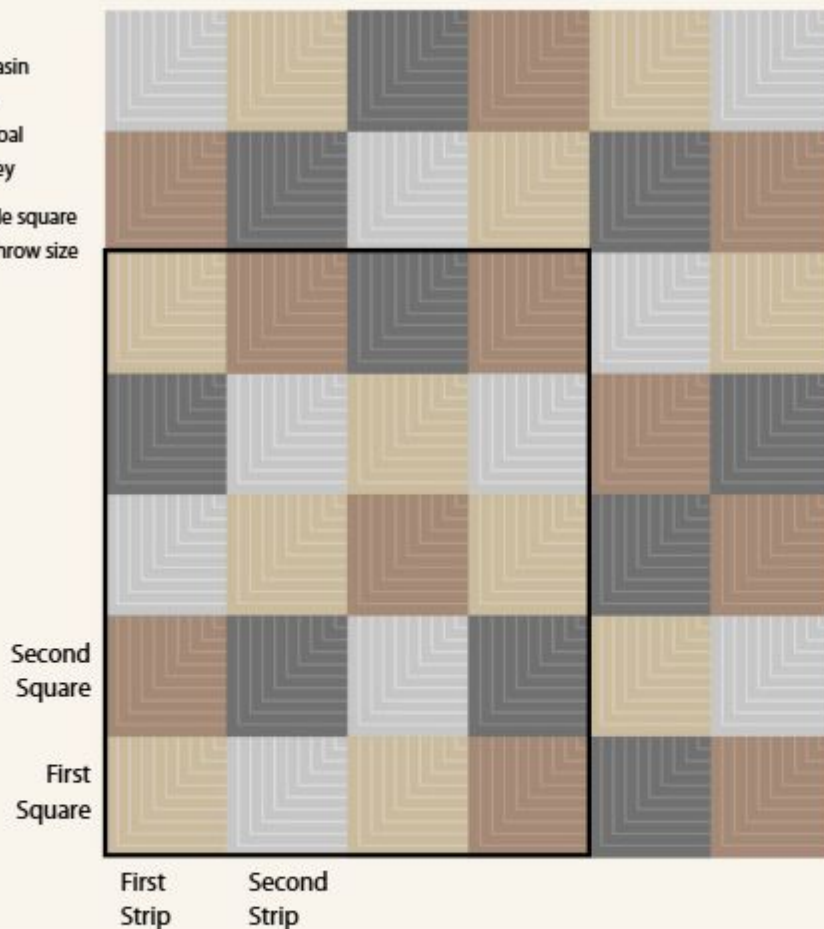

**Row 3:** Inc in first st, K1. 3 sts.

**Row 4:** Sl 1, K2.

**Row 5:** Inc in first st, K2. 4 sts.

**Row 6:** Sl 1, knit to end.

**Row 7:** Inc in first st, knit to end. 5 sts.

Rep last 2 rows twice. 7 sts.

#### Beg Side Border

**Row 1:** Sl 1, K6, then with RS of Throw facing, knit up one st from corner. 8 sts.

to next corner, ending with a 24th row ... 7 sts. \*\*\*\*

Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 2 (2, 2, 2, 3) RS rows. 50 (54, 58, 62, 66) sts.

Stst straight until piece measures 21 (23, 27, 29, 31) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

### Shape Neck

**Next Row:** (RS) - K17 (18, 19, 20, 21) sts, turn on these sts only (leave rem sts on hold).

Dec 1 st at neck edge next 4 rows.

Beg with a p row on WS, Stst 5 more rows.

Cast off loosely rem 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) shoulder sts.

With RS facing, return to sts on hold, slip next 16 (18, 20, 22, 24) sts to holder for centre back neck, rejoin yarn, k to end.

Dec 1 st at neck edge next 4 rows.

Beg with a p row on WS, Stst 4 more rows.

Cast off loosely rem 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) shoulder sts.

**Next Row:** Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (1, 1, 1, 2) times more. 21 (23, 25, 27, 28) sts.

**Next Row:** RS - K to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

**Next Row:** Purl.

Rep last 2 rows until 14 (15, 17, 18, 19) sts rem.

Now dec 1 st at neck edge as established every other RS row 1 (1, 2, 2, 2) times. 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

Stst straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Cast off loosely rem shoulder sts.

With RS facing, return to sts on hold, slip the 2 marked centre front sts to a stitch holder, rejoin yarn, k to end.

**Next Row:** WS - Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts, p to end.

**Next Row:** RS - K1, skp, k across and dec 1 st at end of row.

**Next Row:** WS - Dec 1 st at beg of row, p to end.

**Next Row:** RS - K1, skp, k across and dec 1 st at end of row.

**Next Row:** Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (1, 1, 1, 2) times more. 21 (23, 25, 27, 28) sts.

**Next Row:** RS - K1, skp, k to end.

**Next Row:** Purl.

Rep last 2 rows until 14 (15, 16, 18, 19) sts rem.

Now dec 1 st at neck edge as established every other RS row 1 (1, 1, 2, 2) times. 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

Stst straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a RS row. Cast off loosely rem shoulder sts.

## MAKING UP

Join left shoulder seam.

## NECKBAND

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, pick up and k6 sts down back neck, k the back neck holder 16 (18, 20, 22, 24) sts, pick up and k6 sts up back neck, 30 (32, 35, 39, 41) sts down front neck edge, k the 2 sts from holder, pick up and k30 (32, 35, 39, 41) sts up front neck edge. 90 (96, 104, 114, 120) sts.

**Next Row:** WS - P0 (0, 1, 1, 1); \*k1, p1; rep from \* to the 2 marked centre front sts, k these 2 sts; p1, k1 to end of row.

**Next Row:** RS - Rib to 2 sts before marked centre front sts, k2tog, k2, skp, rib to end.

**Next Row:** WS - Rib to 2 sts before marked centre front sts, p2tog-tbl, k2, p2tog, rib to end.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2) time(s) more.

Cast off loosely in patt.

Join right shoulder and neckband.

## ARMHOLE BANDS

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, beg at underarm edge, pick up and k34 (37, 40, 44, 47) sts up armhole edge to shoulder and 34 (37, 40, 44, 47) sts down armhole edge to side seam edge. 68 (74, 80, 88, 94) sts.

K1, p1 rib for 3 (3, 3, 5, 5, 5) rows.

Cast off loosely in patt.

Join side seams and armhole bands.

## SCOOP-NECK VEST BACK

Work as for V-Neck Vest.

## FRONT

With 3.00mm needles, cast on 67 (71, 75, 81, 89) sts.

K1, p1 rib for 6 (6, 8, 8, 8) rows and inc 1 st at centre of last row to 68 (72, 76, 82, 90) sts. Change to 3.25mm needles.

Cont in Stst until piece measures 14 (15, 18, 19, 20)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

## Shape Underarms

Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 2 rows. Dec 1 st each end next 2 (2, 2, 2, 3) RS rows. 50 (54, 58, 62, 66) sts.

Stst straight until piece measures 17 (19, 23, 24, 26)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

## Shape Neck

**Next Row:** RS - K19 (21, 23, 24, 26) sts, turn, on these sts only (leave rem sts on hold). Dec 1 st at neck edge next 6 (7, 8, 8, 9) rows. 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

Cont straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Cast off loosely rem shoulder sts.

With RS facing return to sts on hold, slip next 12 (12, 12, 14, 14) sts to holder; rejoin yarn, k to end.

Dec 1 st at neck edge next 6 (7, 8, 8, 9) rows - 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

Cont straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a RS row. Cast off loosely rem shoulder sts.

## MAKING UP

Join left shoulder seam.

## NECKBAND

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, pick up and k6 sts down back neck, k the back neck holder 16 (18, 20, 22, 24) sts, pick up and k6 sts up back neck, 23 (23, 24, 27, 28) sts down front neck edge, k the 12 (12, 12, 14, 14) sts from holder, pick up and k23 (23, 24, 27, 28) sts up front neck edge. 86 (88, 92, 102, 106) sts.

K1, p1 rib for 5 rows.

Cast off loosely in rib.

Join right shoulder and neckband.

## ARMHOLE BANDS

Work as for V-Neck Vest.

Join side seams and armhole bands.

**Round 5:** Ch 3, 1 tr in same sp as last sl st, 1 tr in each of next 3 tr, 2 tr in next tr, Ch 2, \*2 tr in next tr, 1 tr in each of next 3 tr, 2 tr in next tr, Ch 2, Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to first tr.

**Round 6:** Ch 3, 1 tr in same sp as last sl st, 1 tr in each of next 5 tr, 2 tr in next tr, Ch 2, \*2 tr in next tr, 1 tr in each of next 5 tr, 2 tr in next tr, Ch 2, Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to first tr.

**Round 7:** Ch 3, 1 tr in same sp as last sl st, 1 tr in each of next 7 tr, 2 tr in next tr, Ch 2, \*2 tr in next tr, 1 tr in each of next 7 tr, 2 tr in next tr, Ch 2, Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to first tr.

**Round 8:** Sl st in next tr. Ch 3, 1 tr in each of next 8





tr. Skip next tr. \*Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp. Ch 2. Skip next tr. 1 tr in each of next 9 tr. Skip next tr. Rep from \* around, ending with ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp. Ch 2. Join with sl st to first tr.

**Round 9:** Sl st in next tr, Ch 3, 1 tr in each of next 6 tr. Skip next tr. \*(Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp) twice. Ch 2, Skip next tr, 1 tr in each of next 7 tr, Skip next tr, Rep from \* around, ending with (Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp) twice, Ch 2, Join with sl st to first tr.

**Round 10:** Sl st in next tr, Ch 3, 1 tr in each of next 4 tr. Skip next tr. \*(Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp) 3 times, Ch 2, Skip next tr. 1 tr in each of next 5 tr, Skip next tr, Rep from \* around, ending with (Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp) 3 times, Ch 2, Join with sl st to first tr.

**Round 11:** Sl st in next tr, Ch 3, 1 tr in each of next 2 tr. Skip next tr. \*(Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp) 4 times. Ch 2, Skip next tr, 1 tr in each of next 3 tr. Skip next tr, Rep from \* around, ending with

(Ch 2. 2 tr in next ch-2 sp) 4 times, Ch 2, Join with sl st to first tr.

#### EDGE

**Round 12:** Change to mushroom Ch 1. \*1 dc in each tr and ch. Rep from \* around. Join with sl st to first dc. Fasten off.

**Next Row:** RS - \*Rib 2, M1, rib 3, M1; rep from \* to last 6

(5, 4) sts, rib 2 (2, 1), M1, rib 3 (2, 2), M1, rib 1. 106 (112, 118) sts.

P 1 row.

Change to 5.50mm needles.

**Next Row:** RS - K7 (8, 9), M1, k1, M1; (k17 (18, 19), M1, k1, M1) 5 times, k8. 118 (124, 130) sts.

Stocking st 3 rows.

**Next Row:** RS - K8 (9, 10), M1, k1, M1; (k19 (20, 21), M1, k1, M1) 5 times, k9. 130 (136, 142) sts.

Stocking st 9 rows.

### Shape Top

**Next Row:** K8 (9, 10), skp, k1, k2tog; (k17 (18, 19), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k7. 118 (124, 130) sts.

Stocking st 3 rows.

**Next Row:** K7 (8, 9), skp, k1, k2tog; (k15 (16, 17), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k6. 106 (112, 118) sts.

Stocking st 3 rows.

**Next Row:** K6 (7, 8), skp, k1, k2tog; (k13 (14, 15), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k5. 94 (100, 106) sts.

P 1 row.

**Next Row:** K5 (6, 7), skp, k1, k2tog; (k11 (12, 13), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k4. 82 (88, 94) sts.

Stocking st 3 rows.

**Next Row:** K4 (5, 6), skp, k1, k2tog; (k9 (10, 11), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k3. 70 (76, 82) sts.

P 1 row.

**Next Row:** K3 (4, 5), skp, k1, k2tog; (k7 (8, 9), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k2. 58 (64, 70) sts.

Stocking st 3 rows.

**Next Row:** K2 (3, 4), skp, k1, k2tog; (k5 (6, 7), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k1. 46 (52, 58) sts.

P 1 row.

### Sizes M & L only

**Next Row:** K2 (3), skp, k1, k2tog; (k4 (5), skp, k1, k2tog) 5 times, k1. 40 (46) sts.

P 1 row.

### All Sizes

**Next Row:** RS - K2 (0, 2); \*k2tog, k2; rep from \* to end. 35 (30, 35) sts.

P 1 row.

**Next Row:** K2tog across row, end k1 (0, 1). 18 (15, 18) sts.

P 1 row.

**Next Row:** K2tog across row, end k0 (1, 0). 9 (8, 9) sts.

P 1 row.

Break yarn, leaving longer end, thread through rem sts and pull together, secure end.

Join back seam.

Rep last 2 rows 3 times, inc 2 (0, 2, 2, 0) sts evenly across last row. 48 (54, 60, 64, 70) sts, 8 rows rib in all.

Change to 9.00mm needles. Cont in stocking st (1 row knit, 1 row purl) until work measures 38cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Armholes

Cast off 7 (9, 11, 12, 13) sts loosely at beg of next 2 rows. 34 (36, 38, 40, 44) sts.

Working in garter st (every row knit) for rem, cont until armholes measure 21 (22, 23, 24, 25) cm from cast off, working last row on RS. Cast off loosely.

### SLEEVES

Using 6.00mm needles, cast on 26 (26, 26, 26, 30) sts.

#### Beg Cuff

Work 7 rows rib as for lower band of Back and Front.

**Row 8:** P4 (3, 2, 1, 3), inc purlways in each st to last 4 (3, 2, 1, 3) sts, P4 (3, 2, 1, 3). 44 (46, 48, 50, 54) sts.

Change to 9.00mm needles. Work in stocking st until Sleeve measures 45cm (or length desired) from beg, working last row on WS.

Tie a coloured thread at each end of last row to mark end of Sleeve seam.

Work 14 (18, 22, 24, 26) rows garter st.

Cast off loosely.

### MAKING UP

Do not press.

Join shoulder seams, leaving 24 (25, 25, 26, 26) cm at

centre of back and front unsewn for neck opening.

Join side and sleeve seams to coloured threads.

Sew in sleeves, placing centre of sleeve to shoulder seam and rows above coloured threads to sts cast off at armholes on back and front. Sew in ends.

## GETTING STARTED

**Note:** A circular needle is used to hold the large number of sts. The pattern is worked in rows, not rounds.

## WORKING PATTERN THROW

Using a 5.00mm circular needle, cast on 209 sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K2, \*P1, K2; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** WS - P2, \*K1, P2; rep from \* to end.

These two rows form K2, P1 rib pattern.

Work in rib pattern until length measures 165cm. Cast off loosely in rib.

## MAKING UP FRINGE

Cut strands of yarn 20cm in length.

Using 3 strands tog, fold in half. Insert a crochet hook just above cast on (or off) edge from back to front.

Catch the folded strands of yarn with the hook and pull through the knitting. Insert the ends of yarn into the loop and pull through to tighten. Continue in this way until edge is sufficiently covered with fringe. Trim ends to even lengths. Rep at other end.

Cast off 12 (13, 14, 14, 15, 16) sts beg next 2 rows, then 12 (12, 14, 15, 16, 17) beg next 2 rows. 25 (27, 27, 29, 29, 29) sts.

Leave rem sts on hold for back neck.

## LEFT FRONT AND SLEEVE

With 5.50mm needles, cast on 41 (43, 45, 47, 49, 51) sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** P1; \*k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 3:** RS - P1; \*k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 4:** K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

Rep these 4 rows once more, then rows 1 and 2 once more.

**Next Row:** RS - K to last 7 sts, cont in band pattern over these 7 sts (= row 3).

**Next Row:** Patt 7 (= row 4); p to end.

Cont in this manner working Stst over main body but cont to work front edge 7 sts in band pattern as established until front measures 35cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Keeping front edge correct, cast on 14 (14, 14, 15, 15, 15) sts beg next 2 RS rows, then 12 sts next WS row. 81 (83, 85, 89, 91, 93) sts.

**Next Row:** RS - P6, k to last 7 sts, patt 7.

**Next Row:** Cast off 7 sts, p to end.

Keeping sleeve edge correct, and Stst over rem sts, dec 1 st

at neck edge every RS row 8 (9, 8, 9, 9, 9) times, then every other RS row twice. 64 (65, 68, 71, 73, 75) sts.

Keeping sleeve edge correct, cont straight until piece measures 49 (50, 51, 51, 52, 52)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Cast off 12 sts beg next RS row, then 14 (14, 14, 15, 15, 15) sts beg next 2 RS rows. 24 (25, 28, 29, 31, 33) sts.

Cast off 12 (13, 14, 14, 15, 16) sts beg next RS row, then rem 12 (12, 14, 15, 16, 17) beg next RS row.

Place 3 button markers along front edge, the first one 2.5cm down from sts on holder, and the rem two 4cm below one another.

## RIGHT FRONT AND SLEEVE

With 5.50mm needles, cast on 41 (43, 45, 47, 49, 51) sts.

**Row 1:** RS - K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** P1; \*k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 3:** RS - P1; \*k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 4:** K1; \*p1, k1; rep from \* to end.

Rep these 4 rows once more, then rows 1 and 2 once more.

**Next Row:** RS - Patt 7, k to end.

**Next Row:** P to last 7 sts, patt 7. Cont in this manner working Stst over main body but cont to work front edge 7 sts in band pattern as established until right front meas same as left front to button markers; work buttonhole at beg of RS row as following: patt 2, k2tog, yo twice, patt 3 (on next WS row drop one yo of the double yo off needle).

Work rem buttonholes to match, then cont straight until front meas 35cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Keeping front edge correct, cast on 14 (14, 14, 15, 15, 15) sts beg next 2 WS rows, then 12 sts next WS row. 81 (83, 85, 89, 91, 93) sts.

**Next Row:** RS - Cast off 7 sts, k to last 6 sts, p6.

**Next Row:** Purl.

Keeping sleeve edge correct, and Stst over rem sts, dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row 8 (9, 8, 9, 9, 9) times, then every other RS row twice. 64 (65, 68, 71, 73, 75) sts.

Keeping sleeve edge correct, cont straight until piece measures 49 (50, 51, 51, 52, 52)cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Cast off 12 sts beg next WS row, then 14 (14, 14, 15, 15, 15) sts beg next 2 WS rows. 24 (25, 28, 29, 31, 33) sts.

Cast off 12 (13, 14, 14, 15, 16) sts beg next WS row, then rem 12 (12, 14, 15, 16, 17) beg next WS row.

## MAKING UP

Join shoulders and upper sleeves.

## COLLAR

With RS facing of garment and 5.00mm needles, beg at right front neck edge (where 7 sts have been cast-off), pick up and k36 (38, 40, 40, 42, 42) sts to shoulder seam, k the back neck holder 25

(27, 27, 29, 29, 29) sts, pick up and k36 (38, 40, 40, 42, 42) sts down front neck edge to 7 sts cast-off. 97 (103, 107, 109, 113, 113).

Garter Stitch 3 rows.

Change to 5.50mm needles.

**Next Row:** K to last 15 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 15 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to last 25 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 25 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to last 35 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 35 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to last 40 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 40 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to end.

**Next Row:** WS - K.

**Next Row:** K to last 20 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 20 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to last 30 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 30 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to last 15 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 15 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to last 25 sts, turn; slip 1 st, knit to last 25 sts, turn; slip 1 st, k to end.

Garter Stitch over all sts until side edges of collar are same width as 7-sts cast-off edge of front bands.

Cast off loosely (use larger needle).

Join collar edges to band edges.

Join side and sleeve seams. Sew on buttons.

Work 4 rows stocking st.

**Next Row:** K2, M1, knit to last 2  
sts, M1, K2. 51 (53, 55, 55) sts.  
Inc one st (as before) at each



end of every foll 8th (8th, 6th, 4th) row until there are 57 (69, 73, 63) sts, then in every foll 10th (10th, 8th, 6th) row until there are 71 (75, 83, 89) sts.

Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 43cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

#### Shape Top

Cast off 2 (3, 3, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 67 (69, 77, 81) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 39 (39, 51, 55) sts rem, then in every row until 21 sts rem.

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Cast off rem 15 sts.

#### POLO COLLAR

**Note – We recommend using mattress stitch to sew up your jumper.**

Join shoulder seams. With

RS facing and using set of 3.75mm double-pointed needles, knit up 22 (24, 26, 28) sts evenly along left side of neck, knit across sts from front stitch-holder, knit up 22 (24, 26, 28) sts evenly along right side of neck to shoulder seam, then knit up 27 (29, 31, 33) sts evenly across back neck. 84 (90, 96, 102) sts.

**Round 1:** \* K1, P1, rep from \* to end.

Rep last round until polo collar measures 12cm from beg.

Cast off very loosely in rib.

#### MAKING UP

Do not press. Join side and sleeve seams. Placing centre of sleeve to shoulder seam, sew in sleeves evenly. Fold polo collar onto RS.

**Round 1:** \* K1, yfwd\* repeat from \* to end of round.

**Round 2:** \*Purl 1, drop the yfwd from previous round\*. Repeat from \* to end.

Repeat these 2 pattern rounds until end of yarn leaving a 20cm tail.

Thread tail through all sts, pull and secure thread to create hat.

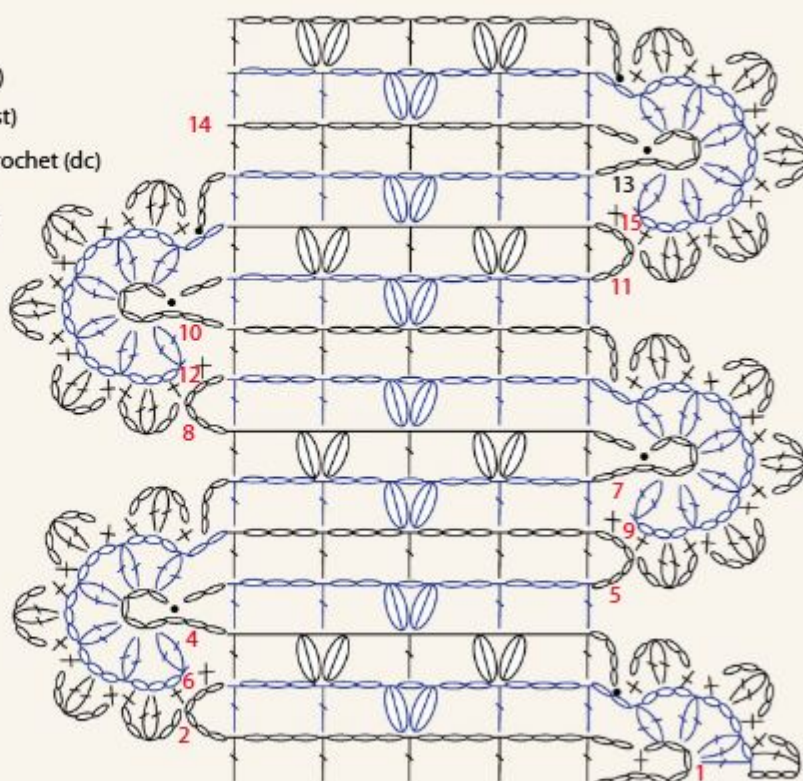

### PINS

Plastic head pins are useful for checking tension and blocking out items. Pins with coloured heads are best because they do not get lost in your work.



### ROW COUNTER

A row counter is helpful for keeping track of rows worked, particularly where increases, decreases or other kinds of patterning occur.



### KNITTING NEEDLES

Knitting needles are made from plastic, aluminium or wood and come in varying lengths and widths. Straight needles come in pairs and doublepointed needles come in sets of four.



### KNITTING BAG

A knitting bag is essential for those who like to knit 'on the go'. Not only is it a practical way to keep all your knitting paraphernalia together, it also helps keep the yarn clean and tangle-free.



### CIRCULAR KNITTING NEEDLES

Circular needles have two working ends joined by a thin nylon wire. They are more balanced than straight needles and allow the weight of your work to rest in your lap.



### KNITTING IN ELASTIC

Elastic yarn prevents sagging in cuffs, collars and waists. You can work it in with knitting yarn on knitted or crocheted garments.



### TAPE MEASURE

A basic tape measure is essential for checking your garment measurements.

### KNITTER'S NEEDLES

Knitter's needles need to have a large eye and a blunt point so they do not split stitches when sewing up your knitting.



### STITCH GAUGE

A stitch gauge is a flat piece of metal or plastic with a ruler marked on one side and/or a window

cut out in the centre. It allows you to mark and measure easily and accurately.



### STITCH HOLDER

A stitch holder is used to secure stitches not in use. You can also use safety pins for holding a small number of stitches.

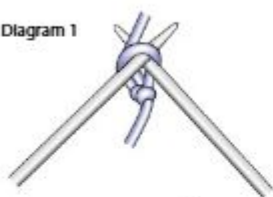
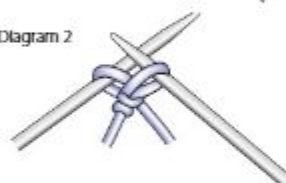

## CASTING ON

Casting on is creating a row of loops on a knitting needle to form the base row for your knitting. One of the most popular methods of casting on is the cable cast on. Form a slipknot about 25cm away from the end of the yarn.

Place the slipknot on a knitting needle and pull gently to secure. Hold this needle in your left hand. Insert the right hand needle through the slip knot. Pass the yarn over the point of the right hand needle (see Diagram 1).

Pull a loop through the slip knot with the right hand needle (see Diagram 2). Place this loop on the left hand needle and gently pull the yarn to secure the stitch. For the remaining cast on stitches, insert the right hand needle between the slip knot and the first stitch on the left hand needle. Wind the yarn around the point of the right hand needle. Draw a loop through and place this loop on the left-hand needle. Continue in this manner until you have cast on the desired number of stitches.

## KNIT STITCH

Once you have cast on, you then knit into the stitches you have made to form the knitted fabric. Hold the needle with the cast on stitches in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the back of your work. Insert the right hand needle from left to right through the front of the first stitch on the left hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from left to right over the point of the right hand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the

yarn through the stitch to form a new stitch on the right hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right hand needle. To knit a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left hand needle to the right hand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

## PURL STITCH

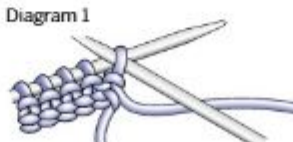

The purl stitch is basically the reverse of the knit stitch. Hold the needle with the stitches on in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the front of your work. Insert the right hand needle from right to left into the back of the first stitch on the left hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from right to left over the point of the right hand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the yarn through the

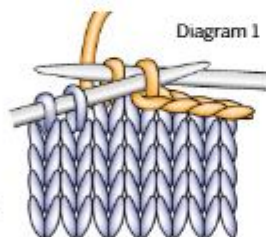
stitch to form a new stitch on the right hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right hand needle. To purl a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left hand needle to the right hand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

## CASTING OFF

### KNITWISE

Knit two stitches. Use the point of the left hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right hand needle over the second, and drop it off the needle. Knit the next stitch on the left hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right hand needle again, and repeat. Continue in this manner until all the stitches have been worked off the left hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right hand needle. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail and thread the yarn through the loop and pull it firmly to fasten off.

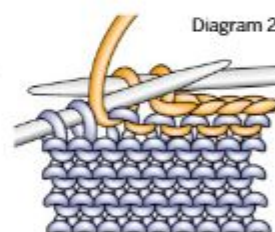

### PURLWISE

Purl two stitches. Use the point of the left hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right hand needle over the second, and drop it off the needle. Purl the next stitch on the left hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right hand needle again, and repeat. Continue in this manner until all the stitches have been worked off the left hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right hand needle. Secure this last stitch as described in casting off knitwise.

## SUBSTITUTING YARNS

If you substitute or spin a yarn for a project, you can compare the weight of the yarn to the project yarn by comparing wraps per inch. Wrap your yarn around a ruler for one inch and count the number of wraps. If you have more wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thin; if you have fewer wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thick.



## KNITTING TENSION

Checking your knitting tension, that is, the tightness or looseness of your knitting, is important. To check your tension, cast on 30 stitches using the recommended needle size. Work in the pattern until your work measures 10cm from the cast on edge then cast off. You now have a "swatch". Measure your tension by placing a ruler over your swatch and counting the number of stitches

across and rows down (including fractions of stitches and rows) in 10cm. Repeat these measurements two to three times on a different parts of the swatch to check your measurements. If you have more stitches and rows than called for in the instructions, you should use larger needles; if you have fewer, use smaller needles. Check your tension again before starting your project.

## PROVISIONAL CAST ON (INVISIBLE CAST ON)

Place a loose slipknot on the needle in your right hand. Hold the waste yarn next to the slipknot and around your left thumb. Hold your working yarn over your left index finger. \*Bring the needle forward under the waste yarn, over the working yarn, grab a loop of working yarn (Diagram

1), then bring the needle to the front, over both yarns, and grab a second loop (Diagram 2). Repeat from \* until you have the desired number of stitches on your needle. When you're ready to work in the opposite direction, pick out the waste yarn to expose the live stitches.

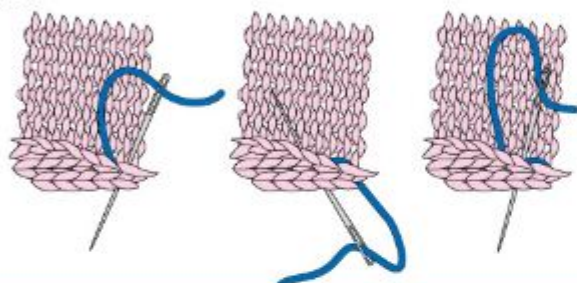

## BACKSTITCH

This is the stitch most commonly used for joining knitted garments. With the right sides of your work together, pin the knitted fabric together with the edges even. The seam should be sewn one full stitch from the end of the row. One stitch should be worked over every row. Thread the yarn needle. Insert the needle through both layers and sew two stitches to the left then one stitch back to the right. Keep stitches at an even distance. Continue working from right to left in this circular motion. (Diagram 1)

## TASSELS

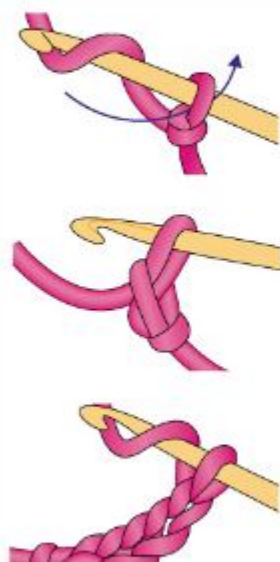
Cut yarn twice the length of your desired tassel plus a bit extra for the knot. According to the desired thickness of the tassel, select a number of lengths of yarn. Fold the lengths of yarn in half over a crochet hook. On the wrong side, insert the crochet hook from the front to the back through the edge of the work. Grab the yarn and pull through and tighten. Trim the ends to the same length.

## KNOTTED FRINGE

After working a tassel, take one half of the strands from each tassel and knot them with half the strands from the neighbouring tassel. Trim.

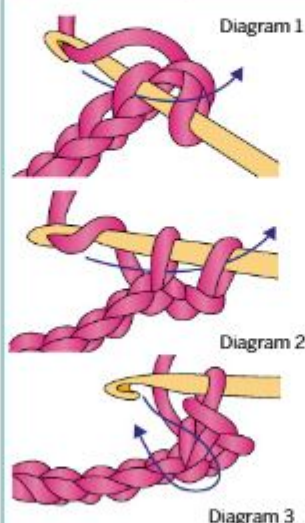


### CROCHET CHAIN



Make a slip knot on your hook. Pass the yarn over the hook and catch it with the hook and draw it through the loop on the hook. Repeat, drawing yarn through the last loop formed.

### DOUBLE CROCHET (DC) (US SINGLE CROCHET SC)



Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch. Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have two loops on the hook (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw through both loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).

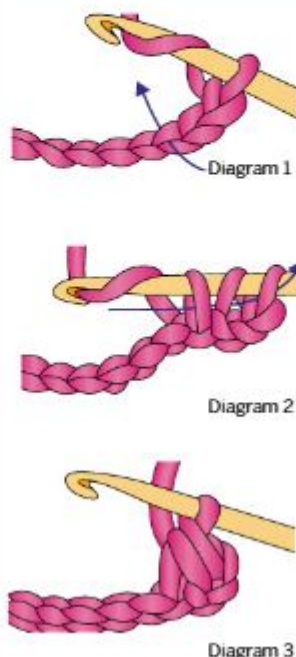
### TREBLE CROCHET (TR) (US DOUBLE CROCHET DC)

Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw it through the first two loops on the hook, pass the yarn over the hook and draw through the remaining two loops. Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).

### HALF TREBLE CROCHET (HTR) (US HALF DOUBLE CROCHET HDC)



Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that there are three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Draw through all three loops on the hook (Diagram 3).

### SLIP STITCH CROCHET (SL ST)



Insert your hook into the stitch. Yarn over the hook and draw the loop through the stitch and loop onto the hook.

### I-CORD

With double pointed needles, cast on the desired number of stitches. \*Without turning the needle, slide the stitches to the other end of the needle, pull the yarn around the back and knit the stitches as usual. Repeat from \* until your work measures the desired length



### PICKING UP DROPPED STITCHES

A dropped stitch can be picked up using a crochet hook and don't be put off by stitches that have unraveled several rows down into the work. To pick up knit stitches, insert the crochet hook into the dropped stitch, draw through the bar lying above the dropped stitch and pull it through the loop of the dropped stitch.
