ashion trends this season will see a transformation in colours and styles to reflect the brisk change in weather this autumn season.

Knitting trends

- · Cardigans in bright colours
- Skinny scarves thin scarves can be teamed with all types of garments, from a casual sweater dress to jeans and a top
- · Gloves the perfect way to keep warm as well as adding a feminine touch to your outfit
- · Lace cardigans mimic the trends of the 19th century by wearing elegant

- Skirts with flounce hem lines
- · Coats featuring faux fur sleeves and cuffs
- High waisted skirts
- Long sleeved blouses

Colours - autumn hues

Purple, blue and yellow shades continue to lead the way into autumn, a season in which the colour palette usually transitions from brighter hues into earthy tones. Trending colours this autumn includes dark teal, royal blue, sangria, mustard yellow, radiant orchid and mauve mist.

A range of monochromatic and brown tones will also see a rise in popularity, including hazy taupe,





timeless black and metallic silver.

Grey tones, such as aluminium grey, are set to become a favourite, with the colour possessing a surprising amount of nuance and life due to the variety of brown, blue and green undertones it contains.

Plaid in the form of black and red is a colour combination that holds stylish potential this autumn. The red makes any outfit pop and has taken a modern spin on the traditional colours you would expect at this time of year. Think plaid scarves, shawls and throwovers to start incorporating the trend into your wardrobe.

Yarn types

Worsted verse woollen

There are many benefits to both worsted and woollen yarn types, worsted yarn however is considered to be superior quality, spun from better quality materials and of longer length fibres. Worsted yarn goes through 16 different operations to convert the greasy wool to a two-fold worsted yarn. In the process, the fibres are assembled nearly parallel and all the short fibres are removed by combing.

On the other hand, woollen yarns are usually coarser and produced from shorter wools. Unlike worsted yarn, the fibres do not lay parallel, which makes the yarn fuller with more projecting fibre ends. Woollen yarns are ideal for knitwear, blankets and rugs where warmth without weight is desirable (ref: Australian Country Spinners).

Man-made fibres – Rayon verse nylon Nylon is a thermoplastic material which is produced by combining equal parts diamine and dicarboxylic acid. This compound creates a nylon salt, which when heated and dehydrated, turns into a polymer which is then melted and spun to create a nylon fibre.

Rayon is created from organic matter, specifically a high-grade wood pulp called dissolving cellulose. The pulp is refined with a caustic soda before it's streamed through a spinneret. Finally, the fibres solidify in an alkali-based bath to product fine silken fibres.

One of the major differences between the two fibres is there chemical makeup. Nylon fibres are stronger than rayon, producing a smooth fabric that's strong, elastic and abrasion resistant. Unlike nylon, rayon is highly absorbent fabric that can be more luxurious to the touch. Rayon fabric however is more fragile and can be difficult to wash. Most importantly it





Luxe cashmere designers

Loro Piana - The renowned Italian brand has been designing highquality garments for more than 90 years. The brand sells some of the finest wool, cashmere and alpaca garments in the world and a cashmere sweater can cost around \$2,000 USD and an alpaca/wool blend coat can command upwards of \$3,600 USD. Since 2000, Loro Piana has awarded a prize for the world's finest bale of wool, which produced just enough fabric for 50 suits. The cup is awarded to an Australian or New Zealand woolgrower who produces the year's finest bale.

Brunello Cucinelli - Another Italian designer to sell upmarket cashmere and alpaca garments, this designer originally started out selling sweaters from his garage in the 1970's. Although the quality rivals Loro Piana, the style is more playful and often incorporates subtle trim with metal beads or sequins. A cashmere sweater from the designer starts from \$2,000 USD, with alpaca/wool blends attracting well over \$5,000 USD. Interestingly, the company donates 20% of profits to its charitable foundation and pays their workers a wage 20% higher than the industry average.

must be dried flat. Furthermore, rayon has a low melting point and must be ironed with a medium to cool iron (ref: eHow rayon vs nylon).

Cashmere verse alpaca

Cashmere and alpaca fibres are considered to be 'luxury yarns' that have woven their way into many high-end fashion designs. For many years, cashmere was considered the most luxurious wool due to the strict and costly manufacturing process the fibre underwent. The finest cashmere must consist of only the whitest, longest, thinnest hair from the Kashmir goat's underfleece, with the hairs measuring more than 36mm to qualify as premium.

In the 1990's, cashmere became so mass-produced that people started searching for a more exclusive alternative. Alpaca quickly caught the attention of designers, who believe the yarn is more luxurious, slightly softer, lighter and warmer due to its longer fibres. It also advances cashmere in the way that it pills less, is hypoallergenic and rarer.

The downfall for cashmere is the difficulty to decipher between high and poor quality. Cheap cashmere can feel luxurious to the touch but will pill or sag within days. Expensive cashmere will pill too but typically stops after the first wash. The best cashmere improves with age (ref:

Investopedia). Although on par with cashmere in terms of comfort and water absorption, overall, alpaca offers greater thermal insulation, fibre strength, wear, wrinkle and stretch resistance (Ref: Alpaca Direct).

Must knit patterns

Have your knitwear looking stylish for the new season upon us and knit these basic wardrobe essentials to see you through autumn.

Long cardigan – Every wardrobe requires a light weight, flattering cardigan that can take you from winter to spring and everything in between! The Longline Cardi Pattern by Australian Superfine Merino by Cleckheaton is a perfect option, with a long stylish hemline that can be paired with a range of outfits. The pattern's full fashioned waist panels also create a tailored yet relaxed look. Knit the cardigan in a single bright colour or experiment with a mix of saturated monochromatic hues to keep on track with colour trends this autumn.

Lace - A major trend this season, don't forget to add a touch of lace to your wardrobe. Knitting patterns by Marilyn Peters has a variety of lace designs including a lace pullover with saddle shoulders and a lace bolero. We also recommend the stylish Patons 0021 Lace Jacket pattern. Keep cosy this autumn with lace designs that suit any occasion and can take you from day to night. Tip: Don't forget to use a 000-1





needle with a Steel 6-8 or Regular B hook size for lace yarn and needle size 1-3, hook size B-E for fingering yarn.

High collar jacket — Get the 19th century high collar look with a modern day twist. The Aran Jacket by Cleckheaton is figure flattering and features a thick collar to keep you not only warm but also on trend. Knit the jacket in a monochromatic colour to stay on trend this season and

beyond. Best of all, the pattern can be knitted in short or three-quarter sleeves depending on your personal style.

Cape — A wardrobe essential when the weather starts to cool, a cape such as the Autumn Cape pattern from Knit Picks Australia offers an easy fitting pullover with a gorgeous stitch pattern and stylish high collar. Knit this garment for the perfect top later to pair with leggings

or jeans. The addition of a knitted belt shapes the silhouette, adding a stylish touch on par with this season's trends. Skinny scarf — A quick and easy item to knit, design your own or purchase a pattern that suits your style. The skinny scarf will become increasingly popular leading into autumn and is a staple item you can knit in various colours and stitches to match any outfit. ■







NEEDLES AND TOOLS

- · 3.00mm knitting needles
- · 3.25mm knitting needles
- · Stitch holders and markers

MEASUREMENTS

Size: 6-9, 12-18 mths, 2-3, 3-4 years Finished fit: 51, 56, 64, 68cm Garment length: 25, 29, 33, 37cm

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

skp - slip 1 stitch, knit 1 stitch, pass the slipped stitch over. tbl - through back of loops.

TENSION

28 sts by 36 rows over Stocking Stitch on 3.25mm needles to 10cm.

WORKING PATTERN BACK

With 3.00mm needles, cast on 73 (79, 91, 97) sts.

Row 1: RS - P1, *k2, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2: WS - *K1, p2; rep from * to last st, k1.

Rep these 2 rows 3 (3, 4, 4) times

Change to 3.25mm needles.

Beg Main Pattern

Row 1: RS - Purl.

Row 2 and all other WS rows: Purl.

Row 3: RS - P1; *k5, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 5: As row 3.

Row 7: As row 3.

Row 8: Purl.

Rep these 8 rows throughout.

Patt until piece measures 14 (17, 20, 23)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Underarms

Cast off 5 (6, 7, 7) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 4 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 2 (2, 3, 3) RS rows. 51 (55, 63, 69) sts.

Patt straight until piece measures 23 (27, 31, 35)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Neck

Next Row: RS - Patt 14 (15, 18, 20) sts, turn on these sts only (leave rem sts on hold).

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge next 4 rows.

Beg with a p row on WS, patt 5 more

Cast off loosely rem 10 (11, 14, 16) shoulder sts.

With RS facing, return to sts on hold, slip next 23 (25, 27, 29) sts to holder for centre back neck, rejoin yarn, patt to end.

Dec 1 st at neck edge next 4 rows. Beg with a p row on WS, patt 4 more

Cast off loosely rem 10 (11, 14, 16) shoulder sts.

FRONT

With 3.00mm needles, cast on 73 (79, 91, 97) sts.

Row 1: RS - P1, *k2, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2: WS - *K1, p2; rep from * to last st. k1.

Rep these 2 rows 3 (3, 4, 4) times more.

Change to 3.25mm needles.

Beg Main Pattern

Row 1: RS - Purl.

Row 2 and all other WS rows: Purl. Row 3: RS - P1; *k5, p1; rep from *

to end.

Row 5: As row 3.

Row 7: As row 3.

Row 8: Purl.

Rep these 8 rows throughout. Patt until piece measures 14 (17, 20, 23)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Underarms

Cast off 5 (6, 7, 7) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 4 rows. Dec 1 st each end next 2 (2, 3, 3) RS rows. 51 (55, 63, 69) sts. Patt straight until piece measures 18 (22, 26, 30)cm from beg, end with a

Shape Neck

WS row.

Next Row: RS - Patt 17 (19, 22, 25) sts, turn on these sts only (leave rem sts on hold).

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge next 7 (8, 8, 9) rows. 10 (11, 14, 16) sts.

Patt straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS

Cast off loosely rem 10 (11, 14, 16) shoulder sts.

With RS facing, return to sts on hold, slip next 17 (17, 19, 19) sts to holder for centre front neck, rejoin yarn, patt to end.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge next 7 (8, 8, 9) rows. 10 (11, 14, 16) sts.

Patt straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a RS row.

Cast off loosely rem 10 (11, 14, 16) shoulder sts.

MAKING UP

loin left shoulder seam.

NECKBAND

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, pick up and k10 sts down back neck, k the back neck holder 23 (25, 27, 29) sts, pick up and k10 sts up back neck, 25 (26, 27, 29) sts down front neck edge, k the front neck holder 17 (17, 19, 19) sts, pick up and k 25 (26, 27, 29) sts up front neck edge. 110 (114, 120, 126) sts.

Next Row: WS - Knit all sts and inc

1 (0, 0, 0) st at centre back to 111 (114, 120, 126) sts.

Row 1: RS - *K2, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2: WS - *K1, p2; rep from * to end.

Rep these 2 rows 2 (2, 3, 3) times more.

Cast off loosely in patt.

Join right shoulder and neckband.

ARMHOLE BANDS

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, beg at underarm edge, pick up and k 40 (43, 46, 49) sts up armhole edge to shoulder and 40 (43, 46, 49) sts down armhole edge to side seam edge. 80 (86, 92, 98) sts. Next Row: WS - Knit and dec 1 st at shoulder seam edge. 79 (85, 91, 97)

Next Row: RS - P1, *k2, p1; rep from * to end.

Next Row: WS - *K1, p2; rep from * to last st, k1.

Rep these last 2 rows 1 (1, 2, 2) times more.

Change to 3.00mm needles. Rib 2 more rows.

Cast off loosely in patt.

Join side seams and armhole bands.

YARN

16 balls 50gm Cleckheaton Country Wide 14ply Pictured in colours 0015 Mulberry, 0019 Metal and 0024 Airforce

NEEDLES AND TOOLS

6.00mm crochet hook Wool sewing needle

MEASUREMENTS

Size: 25cm diameter x 33cm high

TENSION

12 sts by 8 rows over side patt, on 6mm hook and 2 strands of yarn together to 10cm.

Correct tension is not essential for this Bucket, however stated measurements and yarn quantity are based on this tension.

WORKING PATTERN BUCKET

Using 6.00mm hook and 2 strands of yarn together, make 2ch.

Round 1: Miss 1ch, 6dc in 2nd ch from hook.

Note: As rounds are not completed with a sl st but are worked in a spiral shape, mark end of rounds with a contrasting thread or safety pin.

Round 2: (Do not beg with a ch), (2dc in next dc) 6 times, do not join. 12dc.

Round 3: (1dc in next dc, 2dc in next dc) 6 times. 18dc.

Round 4: (2dc in next dc, 1dc in each of next 2dc) 6 times. 24dc.

Round 5: (1dc in each of next 2dc, 2dc in next dc, 1dc in next dc) 6 times. 30dc.

Round 6: (1dc in each of next 4dc, 2dc in next dc) 6 times. 36dc.

Round 7: (1dc in each of next 2dc, 2dc in next dc, 1dc in each of next 3dc) 6 times. 42dc.

Round 8: (1dc in each of next 6dc, 2dc in next dc) 6 times. 48dc.

Round 9: (1dc in each of next 3dc, 2dc in next dc, 1dc in each of next 4dc) 6 times. 54dc.

Round 10: (1dc in each of next 8dc, 2dc in next dc) 6 times. 60dc.

Round 11: (1dc in each of next 5dc,

2dc in next dc, 1dc in each of next 4dc) 6 times. 66dc.

Round 12: (1dc in each of next 10dc, 2dc in next dc) 6 times. 72dc. Round 13: (1dc in each of next 6dc, 2dc in next dc, 1dc in each of next 5dc) 6 times. 78dc.

Round 14: (1dc in each of next 12dc, 2dc in next dc) 6 times, sl st in next dc. 84dc. Do not fasten off.

Beg Side Patt

Note: Side of bucket is worked in completed rounds, not in a spiral.

Round 1: 2ch (counts as first htr),
1 htr in back loop only of each dc to
end, sl st in 2nd ch at beg. 84 htr.
Round 2: 3ch (counts as 1 htr, 1ch),
miss next st, * 1 htr in both loops of
next htr, 1 ch, miss one st, rep from *
to end, sl st in 2nd of 3ch at beg.
Round 3: 2ch, * 1 tr in st missed in
previous round (working over ch), 1 htr
in next htr, rep from * to last st, 1 tr in
st missed in previous round, sl st in
2nd ch at beg.
Round 3: 2 rounds until Side measures.

Rep last 2 rounds until Side measures approx 32cm, ending with a 3rd round.

Beg Handle

Next Round: 14ch, miss next 15 sts, * 1htr in next htr, 1ch, miss 1tr, rep from * 33 times, do not join, cont working over 14ch lp, (1htr in 14ch lp, 1ch) 8 times. Do not join.

Next Round: * 1htr in next htr, 1tr in tr missed in previous round, rep from * 33 times, (1htr in next htr, 1tr in 14ch lp, working over ch) 8 times, 1htr in next htr, 1dc in next tr, sl st in next htr. Fasten off.

MAKING UP

Do not press. Sew in ends.

Hocking Hitch Throw

The easiest pleasurable knit. Looks smart without the fringe. Great for the bed or the couch.

YARN

- 12 balls 50gm Rare Essentials Misty or Rare Earth Brushed yarns - throw
- 1 ball 50gm Rare Essentials Misty or Rare Earth Brushed yarns - fringe Pictures show
- Rare Earth Brushed (Colour Old Snow)

NEEDLES AND TOOLS

- · 6.00 circular knitting needle 80cm
- Wool sewing needle

MEASUREMENTS

Size 130cm x 130cm

TENSION

14 sts by 20 rows over stocking st, on 6.00mm needles to 10 cm

WORKING PATTERN THROW

Using 6.00mm circular Needle, cast on 182 sts.

Note: Work in rows not rounds. Knit 7 rows garter st (first row is wrong side).

Beg Main Pattern

Row 1: RS Knit.

Row 2: K6, purl to last 6 sts, K6. Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for main pattern until work measures 127cm from beg, ending with a Row 1.

Knit 7 rows garter st. Cast off loosely knitways.

MAKING UP

Do not press. Using wool sewing needle, sew in all loose ends.

FRINGE

Make 58 fringes by the following method.

Wind yarn round a piece of cardboard 15 cm long and cut along one edge.

Take 4 strands of the cut yarn for each fringe, fold yarn strands in half and draw the looped end through work wrong side to right side of throw, then draw loose ends through the looped end and pull tightly, this will form a knot on right side. Repeat these steps, evenly placing 29 fringes across the cast-on edge and 29

fringes across the cast-off edge of throw. Trim ends of fringes as desired to even up ends.

DESIGN OPTION

Adapt the size of this Throw to make a Baby Throw or Knee Rug 65cm x 65cm using 6 x 50g balls brushed. Using 6mm needles cast on 91 sts. Follow instructions for throw above until work measures 65cm. Complete as above.

- 2.75mm knitting needles
- · 3.25mm knitting needles
- · Stitch holders and markers

MEASUREMENTS

Jacket

Size: 6, 9-12, 18 mths, 2, 3 yrs Finished fit: 48, 51, 54, 58.5, 64cm Garment length: 26, 29, 32, 35, 39cm Sleeve length: 16, 18, 20, 21, 24cm Hat

Size: 6-9, 12-18 mths, 2-3 years Circumference: 40, 43, 46cm

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

M1 - knit into the back of strand between last stitch worked and next stitch on left hand needle. skp - slip 1 stitch, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over. yo - yarn over needle (to make 1 stitch).

TENSION

28 sts by 36 rows over Stst on 3.25mm needles to 10cm

WORKING PATTERN JACKET BACK

With 3.25mm needles, cast on 78 (82, 86, 94, 102) sts.

Row 1: RS - K2; *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2: WS - *P2, k2; rep from * to last 2 sts, p2.

Row 3: P2; *k2, p2; rep from * to end. Row 4: *K2, p2; rep from * to last 2 sts. k2.

Rep these 4 rows 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) times more.

Stst 2 rows.

Cont in Stst and dec 1 st each end of next row, then every 8th (8th, 8th, 8th, 10th) row 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) times more, 68 (72, 76, 82, 90) sts. Stst straight until piece measures 16 (18, 20, 22, 26)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape underarms

Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts beg next 2

Dec 1 st each end next 3 (3, 3, 3, 4)



RS rows. 52 (56, 60, 64, 68) sts. Stst straight until work measures 26 (29, 32, 35, 39)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Cast off loosely 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts beg next 2 rows, leave rem 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts on holder for back neck.

LEFT FRONT

With 3.25mm needles, cast on 44 (46, 48, 52, 56) sts.

Row 1: RS - *K2, p2; rep from * to last 0 (2, 0, 0, 0) sts, k0 (2, 0, 0, 0). Row 2: WS - P0 (2, 0, 0, 0); *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 3: *P2, k2; rep from * to last 0 (2, 0, 0, 0) sts, p0 (2, 0, 0, 0).

Row 4: KO (2, 0, 0, 0); *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Rep these 4 rows 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) times more.

Next Row: RS - K to last 8 sts, patt 8.

Next Row: WS - Patt 8, p to end.

Keeping front edge 8 sts correct and rem sts in Stst, dec 1 st at beg of next RS row, then every 8th (8th, 8th, 8th, 10th) row at side seam edge 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) times more. 39 (41, 43, 46, 50) sts.

Keeping front edge correct, cont straight until piece measures 16 (18, 20, 22, 26)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape underarm

Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts beg next RS row.

Next Row: WS - Patt 8, p to end. Dec 1 st at armhole edge next 3 (3, 3, 3, 4) RS rows. 31 (33, 35, 37, 39) sts.

Keeping front edge correct, cont straight until piece measures 21 (24, 26, 29, 33)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Neck

Next Row: RS - K to last 8 sts, turn, (leave the 8 sts on holder for neckband).

Next Row: WS - Cast off 4 (4, 5, 5, 5) sts, p to end.

Dec 1 st at neck edge next 6 (7, 7, 8, 9) rows. 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

Stst straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row.

Cast off loosely rem 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

Place 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) button markers along left front patterned edge, the first one 6 rows below sts on hold, the last one 6 (7, 7, 7.5, 7.5) cm from cast-on edge and rem evenly in between.

RIGHT FRONT

With 3.25mm needles, cast on 44 (46, 48, 52, 56) sts.

Row 1: RS - KO (2, 0, 0, 0); *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2: WS - *P2, k2; rep from * to last 0 (2, 0, 0, 0) sts, p0 (2, 0, 0, 0). Row 3: P0 (2, 0, 0, 0); *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 4: *K2, p2; rep from * to last 0 (2, 0, 0, 0) sts, k0 (2, 0, 0, 0). Rep these 4 rows 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) times

Next Row: RS - Patt 8, k to end. Next Row: WS - P to last 8 sts, patt 8. Please read complete next sentence before commencing:

Keeping front edge 8 sts correct and rem sts in Stst, dec 1 st at end of next RS row, then every 8th (8th, 8th, 8th, 10th) row at side seam edge 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) times more, and at the same time, work buttonholes opposite markers at beg of row: Patt 3, k2tog, yo twice, patt 3 and on next WS row work only into one yo, drop the 2nd yo off needle. Now with 39 (41, 43, 46, 50) sts; keeping front edge and buttonhole placement correct, cont straight until piece measures 16 (18, 20, 22, 26) cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Shape underarm

Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts beg next WS row.

Keeping buttonhole placement correct, dec 1 st at armhole edge next 3 (3, 3, 3, 4) RS rows - 31 (33, 35, 37, 39) sts.

Keeping front edge and buttonhole placement correct, cont straight until piece measures 21 (24, 26, 29, 33) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Neck

Cont straight until piece measures 16 (18, 20, 21, 24) cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Top

Cast off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 6 rows. Cast off 4 sts beg next 4 rows. Cast off loosely rem 14 (18, 22, 24, 24) sts.

MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams.

match buttonholes.

NECKBAND

With RS facing and 3.25mm needles, slip the right front 8sts onto needle as if they have already been worked, rejoin yarn and pick up and k20 (21, 22, 25, 26) sts up neck edge to shoulder, k the back neck holder 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts, pick up and k20 (21, 22, 25, 26) sts down front neck, patt the 8 sts from holder. 82 (86, 90, 98, 102) sts.

Keeping the front 8 sts correct, patt over all sts for 7 (7, 9, 9, 9) rows.

Cast off loosely in patt.

Next Row: WS - P2tog across row

Break yarn leaving longer end, thread yarn through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off. loin back seam.

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

Size 80cm x 165cm long

TENSION

16 sts by 11 rows over herringbone patt, on 10.00mm circular needles to 10 cm

WORKING PATTERN THROW

Main Piece

Using 10.00mm circular Needle, cast on 198 sts.

Note - to work in rows not rounds.

Beg Herringbone Patt

Row 1: RS - K1, * slip one st knitways, K1, yfwd, using left-hand needle, pass slipped st over (K1 and yfwd), and off right-hand needle, rep from * to last st, K1. 198 sts Row 2: * P2tog, but before slipping off

left-hand needle, purl only the first st again, then slip both sts tog off left-hand needle, rep from * to end. 198 sts

These 2 rows form herringbone patt.

Work a further 8 rows herringbone patt. 10 rows patt in all, thus completing first side border.

Beg Main Patt

Row 1: RS - * K1, K2tog, rep from * to end = 132 sts.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: RS - Knit to end, wrapping yarn twice round needle for each st instead of once.

Row 4: Purl to end, wrapping yarn twice round needle for each st instead of once AT THE SAME TIME dropping extra loops made from previous row.

Row 5: Knit to end, dropping extra loops made from previous row. 132 sts. Row 6: * P1, inc purlways into next st, rep from * to end. 198 sts.

Work 4 rows herringbone patt as before. Last 10 rows form main patt.

Cont in main patt until work measures approx 70cm from beg, ending with a 6th patt row.

Work 10 rows herringbone patt as before, thus completing second side border.

Cast off firmly knitways.

Place a coloured marker to identify right hand side edge of this main piece for finishing purposes.

END BORDERS (MAKE 2)

Using 10.00mm circular Needle, cast on 136 sts.

Note: to work in rows, not rounds. Work 10 rows herringbone patt as for Throw. Cast off firmly knitways.

Place coloured markers to identify the cast-off edges of these pieces for finishing purposes.

MAKING UP

Do not press. Using a flat seam, with same sides facing, sew the cast-off edge of one End Border (an edge with a marker), to the right hand side of Main Piece (the side with marker). Next sew the cast on edge of remaining End Border (the edge without marker) to the remaining left hand side of main piece, thus completing herringbone border all around throw. Take care when working along long threads of main patt sts. Using wool sewing needle, sew in all loose ends.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 17 (19, 23, 26)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Cast off 6 (6, 7, 7) sts beg next 2

With RS facing of Right Front for Girls garment or Left Front for Boys garment, 3mm needles and A, pick up and k62 (74, 86, 98) sts along straight front edge.

Next Row: WS - P2; *k2, p2; rep from

Next Row: RS - *K2, p2; rep from * to last 2 sts. k2.

Rib further 3 (5, 5, 5) rows.

Next Row: RS - Rib to marker, k2tog, yo twice, skp; cont in this manner until all buttonholes are worked. Rib further 3 (3, 3, 5) rows. Cast off loosely in rib.

MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams.

NECKBAND

With RS facing, 3.25mm needles and C, beg at right front neck edge, omitting half of button(buttonhole) band, pick up and k 27 (29, 31, 33) sts to shoulder seam, pick up and k 11 sts down back neck, k the back neck holder 12 (14, 16, 18) sts, pick up and k 11 sts up back neck and 27 (29, 31, 33) sts down front neck edge, omitting half of band again. 88 (94, 100, 106) sts. Garter Stitch (k every row) for 7 (9,

11, 13) rows.

Cast off loosely.

Sew in sleeve tops. Join sleeve seams.

Sew on buttons.

Increase Section (Rows 1 to 211)

Note: The first 5 sts of Row 1 on the Edge Chart - Right are not worked the first time you work the chart, only on subsequent repeats.

All rows in the Increase Section are worked as follows:

Row 1 and all RS (odd) rows: Work from Edge Chart - Right to first M, SM, M1R, K to next M, M1L, SM, work from Edge Chart - Left to end of row. Row 2 and all WS (even) rows: Work from Edge Chart - Left to first M, SM, K to next M, SM, work from Edge Chart - Right to end of row.

Colours are changed intermittently throughout the increase and decrease sections. Colour changes occur in pattern as given above and next colours are always added in at the beginning of a Right Side Row.

Colour Pattern for Increase Section:

Rows 1 - 48: two strands of A held together.

Rows 49 - 72: one strand of A and one strand of B held together.

Rows 73 - 102: two strands of B held together.

Rows 103 - 130: one strand of B and one strand of C held together.

Rows 131 - 156: two strands of C held together.

Rows 157 - 168: one strand of C and one strand of D held together. Rows 169 - 200: two strands of D held together.

Rows 201 - 211: one strand of D and one strand of E held together.

Decrease Section (Rows 212 to 422)

Continue with Edge Charts where last section left off.

All rows in the Decrease Section are worked as follows:

All RS (odd) rows: Work from Edge Chart - Right to first M, SM, SSK, K to two sts before next M, K2tog, SM, work from Edge Chart - Left to end of row.

All WS (even) rows: Work from Edge Chart - Left to first M, SM, k to next M, SM, work from Edge Chart - Right to end of row.

Colour Pattern for Decrease Section

Rows 212 - 222: one strand of D and one strand of E held together.

Rows 223 - 254: two strands of E held together.





Row 6: P3, K5, SM, K1, SM, K5, P3. Row 7: K1, SSK, P2tog, P3, SM, P1, SM, P3, P2tog, K2tog, K1. 13 sts. Row 8: P2, K9, P2, removing markers. Row 9: K1, SSK, P2tog, P3, P2tog, K2tog, K1. 9 sts.

Row 10: P2tog, K2tog, K1, K2tog,

P2tog. 5 sts.

Cast off all sts in Knit.

MAKING UP

Weave in all ends and block to finished measurements.

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

- 1 pair 3.75mm and 5.00mm knitting needles or size needed to give correct tension.
- · Wool needle for sewing seams.

MEASUREMENTS

Size: XS, S, M, L, XL To fit bust: 70, 80, 90, 100, 110cm Finished fit: 95, 105, 115, 125, 135cm Garment length: 59, 60, 61, 62, 63cm Sleeve length: 25cm

TENSION

19 sts by 25 rows over stocking st, on 5.00mm needles to 10cm.

GETTING STARTED

Note: This jumper is worked on larger needles and at a looser tension than usually recommended for this yarn.

WORKING PATTERN BACK AND FRONT (ALIKE)

Using 3.75mm needles and C1, cast on 92 (102, 112, 120, 130) sts.

Using C1, work 2 rows.

Using C2, work 12 rows. **

Using C5, work 12 rows.

Using C4 for rem, work 8 (10, 12, 16, 18) rows.

Cast off loosely.

SLEEVES

Using 3.75mm needles and C5, cast on 68 (72, 76, 80, 84) sts. Work 4 rows stocking st, beg with a knit row.

Purl 2 rows.

Change to 5.00mm needles. Working in stocking st for rem, beg with a knit row, work 6 rows.

Beg Stripe Patt and Sleeve Shaping

Working in stripes as for Back and Front from ** to **, at same time inc one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 16th (16th, 10th, 8th, 6th) row until there are 74 (78, 86, 92, 98) sts.

Change to C5 for rem.

Work 4 rows. Cast off 10 (11, 12, 13, 14) sts at beg of next 6 rows. Cast off rem 14 (12, 14, 14, 14) sts.

MAKING UP

Note: We recommend using mattress stitch to sew up your jumper.

Do not press. Join shoulder seams, leaving centre 29cm open for neck. On side edges of Back and Front measure down 18 (19, 21, 22, 24) cm from shoulder seams and place markers. Placing centre of sleeve to shoulder seam, sew in sleeves evenly between markers. Join side and sleeve seams, matching stripes. Sew in ends.



Row 19: RS – (K1, p1) 6 times, k to last 12 sts, (p1, k1) 6 times. Row 20: WS – (P1, k1) 6 times; p to last 12 sts; (k1, p1) 6 times. Cont to slant sts in this manner until piece measures 43, (44, 45, 45, 46, 46)cm from beg, end with a WS row. Mark centre 19 (19, 21, 21, 23, 23) sts of last row.

Shape Neck

Next Row: RS – Keeping slanting patt correct, work to marked sts, slip next 19 (19, 21, 21, 23, 23) sts onto stitch holder, rejoin new yarn and work to end.

Note: When the slanting pattern reaches the point where the dec for the yo which is made every 4th row at the edge of the rib is no longer possible; make the yo and in the same row work a dec right at the neck edge (this dec is not counted in the actual neck shaping itself as it is only to keep the stitch count correct); do not make a yo if there are not enough sts left to work the required decrease.

Working both halves at the same time, dec 1 st at each neck edge next 7 rows, then every other row 3 times. 28 (31, 33, 36, 38, 41) sts rem each front.

Keeping patt correct, work straight over rem sts until front meas 53 (54, 55, 55, 56, 56)cm from beg, end with a WS row for Left Front and with a RS row for Right Front.

Cast off loosely rem 28 (31, 33, 36, 38, 41) sts of each front.

SLEEVES

With 3.75mm needles, cast on 47 (47, 49, 49, 51, 53) sts.

Size Hat: 48.5cm Circumference Scarf: 30cm wide x 68 - 73cm long, laid flat

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

K5tog: Knit 5 together - Slip 3 sts to the RHN as if to K3tog. SS K, then pass 3 slipped sts over. SS - Slip Stitch KBF - Knit front and back

TENSION

20 sts by 21 rows in Leaf pattern in the round to 10cm blocked. 20 sts by 24 rows in Leaf pattern worked flat 10cm blocked.

WORKING PATTERN HAT

The hat begins with a series of welts, which are decoratively gathered with a tab.

Cast on 96 sts onto larger needles and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist sts.

Welt Pattern:

Purl 5 rounds.

Knit 3 rounds.

These 8 rounds form welt pattern. Work the 8 rounds of the Welt Pattern twice.

Purl 5 rounds.

Knit one round.

Begin working from Hat chart (See page 52) at round 1, repeating the 24 sts of the pattern four times around the hat.

Note: Where a centred double decrease occurs in stitch 1, slip the last st of the previous round together with the first st of the current round, removing marker and placing it to the right of these sts. K1, pass slipped sts over.

Work until round 47. After all rounds have been worked, 8 sts remain. Break yarn, pull the tail through the remaining working sts and pull tight to bind off.

MAKING UP

A small decorative tab adds vintage flair to the hat's brim. Turn the hat inside out. Holding hat so that the brim (cast on edge) is facing up, with smaller needles pick up and purl 7 sts into the round between the last welt and round 1 of the chart. Centre these sts with any one of the leaves on the hat.

Row 1: KFB 6 times, K1, 13 sts. Row 2: (P1, K1) to last st, P1.

Row 3: (K1, P1) to last st, K1. Repeat Rows 2-3 for 75cm.

Work row 2 once more.

Row 4: SS K. (K1, P1) to last 3 sts. K1, K2tog. 11 sts.

Row 5: P2tog through back of loop, (K1, P1) to last 2 sts, P2tog. 9 sts.

Row 6: Repeat Row 4. 7 sts.

Row 7: K2tog twice, pass 1st st over second, (K2tog, pass 1st st over second) to last st, K1, pass 1st st over

Break yarn and pull tail through remaining st. Pull tight to finish. Turn hat right side out. Pull tab around the bottom of the hat so that the cast

off is just overlapping the first round of Leaf patterning. Stitch button to hat through tab and hat fabric.

Weave in ends, wash and block.

SCARF

This fluffy keyhole scarf starts and ends with reverse stockinette welts. Columns of 1x1 rib form the borders. With larger needles, cast on 59 sts. Welt pattern:

Row 1: Purl. Row 2: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

Rows 3 - 4: As rows 1-2.

Rows 5 - 6: Purl. Row 6: Knit.

Repeat rows 1 - 8 of the Welt pattern twice, work rows 1 - 6 once.

Next Row: (K1, P1) twice, K1, PM, begin working from Scarf chart (See page 52) on row 1, repeating sts 2 -13 three times. After the last st of the chart, place marker, (K1, P1) twice, K1. Continue working from chart between markers, and keeping the first and last 5 sts in rib.

Work to Row 98. Repeat rows 99 -100 for 40 - 45cm.

KEYHOLE

Work 9 repeats of the Welt pattern, work rows 1 - 5 once more. Break yarn, leaving a long tail for grafting. With the WS facing, fold the welt section in half so that the working sts line up with the WS of the first row of the welt pattern. Using yarn tail, graft the working sts to the WS of the fabric.

BOTTOM TAB

Holding scarf with WS facing so that the cast on edge is facing up, with smaller needles pick up and purl into the centre 7 sts of the row between the last welt and round 1 of the chart.

Row 1: KFB 6 times, K1, 13 sts.

Row 2: (P1, K1) to last st, P1. Row 3: (K1, P1) to last st, K1. Repeat rows 2 – 3 for 75cm. Work row 2 once more.

Row 4: SS K, (K1, P1) to last 3 sts, K1, K2tog. 11 sts.

Row 5: P2tog TBL, (K1, P1) to last 2 sts, P2tog. 9 sts.

Row 6: Repeat row 4. 7 sts.

Row 7: K2tog twice, pass 1st st over second, (K2tog, pass 1st st over second) to last st, K1, pass 1st st over second.

Break yarn and pull tail through remaining st. Pull tight to bind off. Turn scarf to RS. Pull tab around the bottom of the welt section so that the bind off is just overlapping the first round of Leaf patterning. Stitch button to hat through tab and scarf fabric.

KEYHOLE TAB

Holding scarf with WS facing so that the fold in the keyhole welts is facing up, with smaller needles pick up and purl into the centre 7 sts of the graft row.

Row 1: KFB 6 times, K1. 13 sts. Row 2: (P1, K1) to last st, P1. Row 3: (K1, P1) to last st, K1. Repeat rows 2 – 3 for 25.5cm. Work row 2 once more.

Row 4: SS K, (K1, P1) to last 3 sts, K1, K2tog. 11 sts.

Row 5: P2tog TBL, (K1, P1) to last 2 sts, P2tog. 9 sts.

Row 6: Repeat row 4. 7 sts.

Row 7: K2tog twice, pass 1st st over second, (K2tog, pass 1st st over second) to last st, K1, pass 1st st over second.

Break yarn and pull tail through remaining st. Pull tight to bind off. Turn scarf to RS. Pull tab around the bottom of the folded welt section so that the bind off is just overlapping the last round of Leaf patterning. Stitch button to scarf through tab and scarf fabric.

MAKING UP

Weave in ends, wash and block. To wear, pass the loose end through the keyhole.

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Hat Chart

Pick up sts for button tab along any rep of these sts.

Cast off loosely in knit.

MAKING UP

Trim and leave tails all approx same length. Separate and use 2 strands of C4 yarn loop yarn through back of stitches on pattern panel section going across the row, add 1 button on each stem of pattern, a total of 11 across stem end rows. Choose a larger button for first button on increase edge to go with the loop. Using a small amount of yarn and crochet hook make a chain loop big enough to loop around 1st button on pattern panel add loop to 1st C4 section edge, this holds wrap in place when worn.

Optional – if you like use 1 or 2 of the tail yarns to anchor roll collar section in place permanently.

MEASUREMENTS

Size: S, M, L, XL, XXL, XXXL
To fit chest: 95, 105, 115, 125, 135, 145cm
Finished fit:, 105, 115, 125, 135, 145, 155cm
Garment length: 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75cm
Sleeve length: 48cm

SPECIAL ABBREVIATION

M1: make 1 — pick up loop which lies before next st, place on left-hand needle and knit into back of loop.

TENSION

26 sts by 35 rows over stocking st, on 3.75mm needles to 10cm.

WORKING PATTERN BACK


Using 3.00mm needles, cast on 139 (151, 165, 177, 191, 203) sts. Row 1: K2, * P1, K1, rep from * to

last st, K1.

Row 2: K1, * P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows 11 times. 24 rows rib in all.

Change to 3.75mm needles.





Man's Jumper with Set In Sleeves continued.

Work in stocking st until Back measures 46cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

Shape Armholes

Cast off 8 (10, 12, 13, 16, 17) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 123 (131, 141, 151, 159, 169) sts.

Dec one st at each end of every row until 117 (125, 131, 137, 141, 151) sts rem, then in every foll alt row until 109 (113, 119, 125, 129, 135) sts rem. **

Work 71 (71, 73, 73, 75, 75) rows.

Shape Shoulders

Cast off 11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13) sts at beg of next 4 rows, then 12 (12, 12, 12, 12, 14) sts at beg of foll 2

Leave rem 41 (45, 47, 49, 53, 55) sts on stitch-holder for neckband.

FRONT

Work as for Back to **. Work 1 row.

Divide for V Neck

Next Row: K54 (56, 59, 62, 64, 67),

Cont on these 54 (56, 59, 62, 64, 67) sts for left side of neck. Dec one st at neck edge in every foll alt row until 45 (43, 45, 46, 45, 46) sts rem, then in every foll 4th row until 34 (34, 36, 38, 38, 40) sts rem. Work 7 rows.

Shape Shoulder

Cast off 11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13) sts at beg of next row and foll alt row. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 12 (12, 12, 12, 12, 14) sts.

Slip next st (centre st) onto a thread or safety pin and leave for neckband. With right side facing, join yarn to rem 54 (56, 59, 62, 64, 67) sts for right side of neck and knit to end. Dec one st at neck edge in every foll alt row until 45 (43, 45, 46, 45, 46) sts rem, then in every foll 4th row until 34 (34, 36, 38, 38, 40) sts rem.

Work 8 rows.

Shape Shoulder

Cast off 11 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13) sts at beg of next row and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 12 (12, 12, 12, 12, 14) sts.

SLEEVES

65 (67, 69, 73, 75, 77) sts. Work 24 rows rib as for Back. Change to 3.75mm needles. Work 4 rows stocking st. Row 5: K2, M1, knit to last 2 sts, M1, K2. 67 (69, 71, 75, 77, 79) sts. Cont in stocking st, inc one st (as before) at each end of every foll 4th

(4th, 4th, 4th, 2nd) row until

there are 69 (75, 95, 111, 131, 87)

Using 3.00mm needles, cast on

sts, then in every foll 6th (6th, 6th, 6th, 6th, 4th) row until there are 107 (111, 119, 127, 135, 143) sts. Cont without further shaping until Sleeve measures 48cm (or length desired) from beg, ending with a purl row.

Shape Top

Cast off 4 (5, 6, 7, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 99 (101, 107, 113, 119, 125) sts.

Dec one st at each end of next row, then in every foll alt row until 53 (53, 57, 69, 73, 81) sts rem, then in every row until 23 sts rem.

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows. Cast off rem 11 sts.

NECKBAND

Join right shoulder seam. With right side facing and using 3.00mm needles, knit up 68 (68, 70, 70, 72, 72) sts evenly along left side of neck, K1 (centre st) from thread or safety pin, knit up 68 (68, 70, 70, 72, 72) sts evenly along right side of neck to shoulder, then knit across sts from back stitch-holder, 178 (182, 188, 190, 198, 200) sts.

Row 1: * K1, P1, rep from * to end. Row 2: Rib to within 2 sts of centre st, ybk, sl 1, K1, psso, K1 (centre st), K2tog, rib to end. 176 (180, 186, 188, 196, 198) sts.

Row 3: Rib to within 2 sts of centre st, K2tog, P1 (centre st), K2tog tbl, rib to end. 174 (178, 184, 186, 194, 196) sts.

Rep 2nd and 3rd rows 4 times, 158 (162, 168, 170, 178, 180) sts, 11 rows rib in all. Cast off loosely in rib.

MAKING UP

Do not press. Join left shoulder and neckband seam. Join side and sleeve seams. Sew in sleeves.

NEEDLES AND TOOLS

5.00mm knitting needles

TENSION

Not critical to project

GETTING STARTED

Pattern

Increasing row: yo, k to end.
(Beginning a row with a yo creates a large decorative loop at the edge)
Wrapping row: k1, *k 2 tog, yo three times. Repeat from * to last 3 sts, k3.
Dropping row: k to end of row, dropping the extra loops of previous row.

Decreasing row: yo, k2tog twice, k to end.

WORKING PATTERN THE SCARF

Cast on 2 sts.

Work increasing rows until there are 18 sts on the needle.

Work 1 wrapping row, then 1 dropping row.

Work 8 increasing rows (yo, k to end), then repeat 1 wrapping row and 1 dropping row.

These rows can be repeated until you have 36 sts (or desired width).

For main body of scarf

K 8 rows, work 1 wrapping row and 1 dropping row. These 10 rows form the body pattern.

Repeat until scarf measures 60 cm or desired length.

Work 8 decreasing rows, 1 wrapping



row and 1 dropping row.

Continue to work the end in this way until the last 2 sts remain. Cast off.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

M1 – place yarn between last st worked and next onto left hand needle and k into the back of this strand; skp - slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over:

TENSION

22 sts by 30 rows over Stst on 4.00mm needles to 10cm.



WORKING PATTERN BACK

With 4.00mm needles, cast on 100 (106, 112, 118, 124, 130) sts.

Next Row: RS - K4; *p2, k4; rep from * to end.

Row 2: *P4, k2; rep from * to last 4 sts, p4.

Rep these 2 rows 4 times more. Cont in Stst until piece measures 12cm from beg, end with a WS row. **Next Row:** RS - K1, skp, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 98 (104, 110, 116, 122, 128) sts.

Place marker each end of last row; front decreases will be matched to these markers later.

Next Row: WS - Purl.

**Stst 28 (22, 22, 22, 22, 22) rows. Next Row: RS - K1, skp, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 96 (102, 108, 114, 120, 126) sts.

Place marker each end of last row; front decreases will be matched to these markers later.

Next Row: WS - Purl.**
Rep from ** to ** 1 (2, 2, 2, 2, 2)
times more. 94 (98, 104, 110, 116, 122) sts.
Stst straight until piece measures

46cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape Armholes

Cast off 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 6) rows.

Dec 1 st each end every RS row 4 times. 70 (72, 76, 80, 84, 90) sts. Stst straight until work measures 65 (65, 66, 66, 67, 67)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape neck and shoulders Next Row: RS - K23 (24, 25, 27, 28, 31) sts, turn, on these sts only.

Next Row: Cast off 6 sts, p to end. Next Row: Cast off 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 10)

sts k to end.

Next Row: Cast off 6 sts, p to end. Cast off rem 5 (6, 6, 7, 8, 9) sts. With RS facing, return to rem sts, rejoin yarn and cast off loosely next 24 (24, 26, 26, 28, 28) sts; work 2nd half to match first, reversing shapings. Mark centre back.

FRONT

With 4.00mm needles, cast on 100 (106, 112, 118, 124, 130) sts.

Next Row: RS - K4; *p2, k4; rep from * to end.

Row 2: *P4, k2; rep from * to last 4 sts, p4.

Rep these 2 rows 4 times more. Cont in Stst until piece measures 12cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Next Row: RS - K1, skp, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 98 (104, 110, 116, 122, 128) sts (meeting up with first set of markers of back).

Next Row: WS - Purl.

Stst 28 (22, 22, 22, 22, 22) rows. **Next Row:** RS - K1, skp, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 96 (102, 108, 114, 120, 126) sts (meeting up with 2nd set of markers of back).

Next Row: WS - Purl.

Stst until piece measures 25cm from beg, end with a WS row and mark centre 18 (18, 18, 20, 20, 20) sts in last row.

Split Front & Shape Sides and Neck

Next Row: RS - K to marked sts; slip the marked centre 18 (18, 18, 20, 20, 20) sts to stitch holder; join new ball of yarn and k to end.

Next Row: WS - Purl both fronts. **Stst 4 rows.

Next Row: RS - Left Front: K to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Right Front: k2, skp, k to end.

Next Row: WS - Purl both fronts.**
Rep from ** to ** (dec 1 st each neck edge every 6th row) and at same time work rem side edge dec's to match with Back markers.

Keeping front neck dec's correct every 6th row until front measures same as back to underarm, end with a WS row.

Shape Armholes and Neck

Next Row: RS - Left Front: Cast off 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6) sts, k to end unless neck dec is required.

Right Front: Work neck dec if required, k to end.

Next Row: WS - Right Front: Cast off 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6) sts, p to end. Left Front: Purl.

Keeping front neck dec's correct, dec 1 st each end next 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 6) rows each armhole edge, then every RS row 4 times.

Work straight at armhole edge but cont to dec at neck edge every 6th row until 11 (12, 13, 15, 16, 19) sts rem.

Stst straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row.

Shape Shoulders

Next Row: RS - Left Front: Cast off 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 10) sts, k to end.

Right Front: Knit.

Next Row: WS - Right Front: Cast off 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 10) sts, p to end. Left Front: Purl.

Next Row: RS - Left Front: Cast off rem 5 (6, 6, 7, 8, 9) sts.

Right Front: Knit.

Next Row: WS - Right Front: Cast off rem 5 (6, 6, 7, 8, 9) sts.

SLEEVES

With 3.75mm needles, cast on 54 sts. Next Row: RS - P1, k4; *p2, k4; rep

from * to last st, p1.

Row 2: K1; *p4, k2; rep from * to last 5 sts, p4, k1.

Rep last 2 rows twice more. Change to 4.00mm needles.

Cont in rib and inc 1 st each end next row then every 10th (10th, 9th, 8th, 7th, 7th) row until 76 (78, 82, 84, 86, 88) sts on needle.

Rib straight until sleeve measures 46 (47, 47, 47, 48, 48)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts beg next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each end next 10 rows. Dec 1 st each end every RS row 7 (7, 7, 7, 8, 8) times. Dec 1 st each end next 10 (10, 12, 12, 12, 12) rows. Cast off 3 sts beg next 2 rows. Cast off rem 8 sts.

MAKING UP

Join shoulder seams.

COLLAR

Slip the 18 (18, 18, 20, 20, 20) sts from holder onto 4.00mm needles, ensure next row is a RS row.

Next Row RS - K. Next Row: WS - K.

Next Row: RS - K to last st, M1, k1. 19 (19, 19, 21, 21, 21) sts. Garter Stitch (k every row) 9 rows. Next Row: RS - K to last st, M1, k1. 20 (20, 20, 22, 22, 22) sts. Cont in this manner, inc 1 st as established every 10th row at neck edge until 35 sts are on needle in total.

Place marker both ends of last row. Garter Stitch straight until collar easily fits up front neck edge to centre back marker.

Place marker at end of WS row. Now count the Garter Stitch ridges between markers and work the same amount of rows straight in Garter Stitch (2 rows = 1 ridge), end with a WS row.

Next Row: RS - K to last 2 sts, k2tog. 34 sts.

Garter Stitch (k every row) 9 rows. Cont in this manner, dec 1 st as established every 10th row at neck edge until 18 (18, 18, 20, 20, 20) sts rem.

Garter Stitch 2 more rows. Second half of collar should measure same as first half. Cast off loosely.

With markers meeting at centre back neck, join collar to neck edge, loosely tack cast off edge in behind beg of collar.

Insert sleeve tops. Join side and sleeve seams.

WORKING PATTERN PONCHO (MAKE 2 PIECES, BEG AT LOWER EDGE)

Using 6.50mm needles, cast on 101sts. Knit 1 row (WS).

Beg Patt

Row 1: RS - K1, * yfwd, K2tog, rep

from * to end.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K2tog, knit to last 2 sts,

K2tog. = Decrease 2 sts.

Row 4: P2tog, purl to last 2 sts,

P2tog. = Decrease 2 sts.

Row 5: K2tog, knit to last 2 sts,

K2tog. = Decrease 2 sts.

Row 6: Purl.v

Rows 1 to 6 incl form patt.

Cont in patt until for 41 sts rem, ending with a 6th row.

Knit 1 row.

Cast off knitways.

RUFFLE

With RS facing and using 6.00mm needles, knit up 101 sts evenly along cast on edge.

Row 1: WS - Knit.

Row 2: Knit into front and back of

each st. 202 sts.

Note – If this number of sts does not fit comfortably on pair of needles, we suggest using a circular needle. Work in rows, not rounds.

Knit 4 rows garter st (every row knit).

Row 7: K1, * yfwd, K2tog, rep from * to last st. K1.

Row 8: Knit, Cast off.

Work ruffle along cast on edge of other piece.

MAKING UP

Do not press. Using a wool sewing needle and back-stitch, join the 2 pieces tog along angled (shaped) edges, noting to carefully match pattern — this forms centre front and back seams.

Sew in all loose ends.

Correct tension is not essential for this Scarf.

GETTING STARTED

Note: Prepare fringe first – wrap yarn around 24cm wide piece of cardboard 90 times and cut along one edge, making sure you have a total of 90 lengths of yarn. Set aside for attaching to Scarf after completing knitting.

WORKING PATTERN SCARF

Using 20.00mm needles and 2 strands of yarn together, cast on 15 sts loosely.

Note:To keep edges neat, join new balls of yarn 3 sts in from edge.

Row 1: Knit. Row 2: Purl.

Last 2 rows form stocking st.
Continue in stocking st until Scarf
measures approx 190cm from
beginning, or near end of last ball,
leaving approx 2 metres for casting
off, ending with a purl row.
Cast off loosely.

MAKING UP

Do not press. Sew in ends through knitting (not along edge). Using yarn set aside for fringe, fold 3 strands in half then use crochet hook to draw loop through first stitch at end of

Row 2: WS - P all sts.

Beg Main Lace Pattern

Row 1: RS - K1; *k2tog, yo twice, skp; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2: WS - P1; *p2, p1-tbl, p1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1; *yo, skp, k2tog, yo; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 6: P2; *p3, p1-tbl; rep from * to last 4 sts, p4.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

Rep these last 8 rows for Main Lace throughout.

Patt until piece measures 33 (35, 36, 39, 39)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Keeping Lace correct, cast on 4 sts beg of next 8 rows, then cast on 8 sts beg of next 2 rows, 146 (154, 162, 170, 178) sts.

Patt straight until piece measures 53 (56, 58, 61, 62)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Mark centre 38 (40, 40, 42, 42) sts of last row (leave those markers in place until neckband has been picked up).

Next Row: RS - Cast off loosely all sts.

LEFT FRONT

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 68 (74, 80, 86, 92) sts.

Row 1: RS - K1; *k2tog, p2, skp; rep from * to last st, k1. 46 (50, 54, 58, 62) sts.

Row 2: WS - P all sts.

Beg Main Lace Pattern

Row 1: RS - K1; *k2tog, yo twice, skp; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2: WS - P1; *p2, p1-tbl, p1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1; *yo, skp, k2tog, yo; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 6: P2; *p3, p1-tbl; rep from * to last 4 sts. p4.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

Rep these last 8 rows for Main Lace throughout.

Patt until piece measures 33 (35, 36, 39, 39)cm from beg, end with a WS

Keeping Lace correct, cast on 4 sts at beg of next 4 RS rows, then cast on 8 sts beg of following RS row. 70 (74, 78, 82, 86) sts.

Patt straight until piece measures 38 (41, 43, 46, 47)cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Shape Neck

Cast off loosely 6 (7, 7, 8, 8) sts beg next WS row, then dec 1 st at neck edge next 8 rows, then every other row twice. 54 (57, 61, 64, 68) sts. Patt straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Cast off loosely.

RIGHT FRONT

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 68 (74, 80, 86, 92) sts.

Row 1: RS - K1; *k2tog, p2, skp; rep from * to last st, k1. 46 (50, 54, 58, 62) sts.

Row 2: WS - P all sts.

Beg Main Lace Pattern

Row 1: RS - K1; *k2tog, yo twice, skp; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2: WS - P1; *p2, p1-tbl, p1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1; *yo, skp, k2tog, yo; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 6: P2; *p3, p1-tbl; rep from * to last 4 sts. p4.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

Rep these last 8 rows for Main Lace throughout.

Patt until piece measures 33 (35, 36, 39, 39)cm from beg, end with a RS

Keeping Lace correct, cast on 4 sts at beg of next 4 WS rows, then cast on 8 sts beg of following WS row. 70 (74, 78, 82, 86) sts.

Patt straight until piece measures 38 (41, 43, 46, 47)cm from beg, end with a WS row.



Shape Neck

Cast off loosely 6 (7, 7, 8, 8) sts beg next RS row, then dec 1 st at neck edge next 8 rows, then every other row twice. 54 (57, 61, 64, 68) sts. Patt straight until front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a RS row. Cast off loosely.

FRONT BAND EDGE (MAKE 2)

With 3.75mm needles, cast on 128 (140, 146, 152, 158) sts.

Row 1: RS – K1; *k2tog, p2, skp; rep from * to last st, k1 – 86 (94, 98, 102, 106) sts.

Row 2: WS – Purl all sts. Leave these sts on spare needle.

BUTTONBAND

With 3.75mm needles and RS facing, beg at left front neck edge, pick up and k86 (94, 98, 102, 106) sts down straight front edge.

Next Row: WS – Purl all sts.

Next Row: RS – With RS facing hold front band edge sts in front of left front needle, k first st of front band edge together with first st of buttonband; k 2nd st of front band edge together with 2nd st of buttonband; cont in this manner until all sts have been worked. 86 (94, 98, 102, 106) sts on needle.

Next Row: WS – P2; *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Next Row: RS – K2; *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Rib 8 more rows. Cast off loosely in rib on WS.

BUTTONHOLE BAND

With 3.75mm needles and RS facing, beg at right front cast on edge, pick up and k86 (94, 98, 102, 106) sts up straight front edge.

Next Row: WS – Purl all sts. Next Row: RS – With RS facing hold front band edge sts in front of left front needle, k first st of front band edge together with first st of buttonband; k 2nd st of front band edge together with 2nd st of buttonband; cont in this manner until all sts have been worked – 86 (94, 98, 102, 106) sts on needle.

Next Row: WS - P2; *k2, p2; rep

from * to end.

Next Row: RS – K2; *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Rib 3 more rows.

Next Row: RS - Rib 5, k2tog, yo twice, skp; (rib 14 (16, 17, 18, 19), k2tog, yo twice, skp) 4 times; rib 5.

Next Row: WS — Rib across.

Rib 3 more rows.

Next Row: K1, sl 1 knitways, K1,

Next Row: Knit. Next Row: Purl.

Rep last 4 rows until 37 (42) sts rem,

ending with a dec row.

Cont dec one st (as before) at each end of every foll alt row until 23sts rem.

Sizes M, L and XL Only

Rep last 2 rows until (30, 34, 37) sts rem, ending with a dec row.

All Sizes: Shape Neck

Next Row: Cast off 5 (6, 7, 8, 8) sts, purl to end. 18 (18, 23, 26, 29) sts. Cont dec one st (as before) at raglan edge in every foll 4th (4th, alt, alt, alt) row 3 (2, 32, 31, 30) times, then in foll alt (alt, every, every, every) row 24 (28, 3, 7, 13) times, at the same time dec one st at front edge in every foll 4th row 3 (5, 12, 14, 11) times, then in every foll 6th row 7 (6, 2, 1, 3) time/s, 2 sts. Work 1 (1, 0, 0, 0) row/s.

Next Row: K2tog. Fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT FOR CREW CARDIGAN

Using 3.25mm needles and MC, cast on 43 (47, 55, 59, 63) sts.

Row 1: K3, * P2, K2, rep from * to end. Row 2: P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to last st. P1. Rep 1st and 2nd rows 7 times = 16 rows rib in total. Change to 4.00mm needles. Work in stocking st until work measures 36 cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

Cont dec one st (as before) at raglan edge in every foll 4th (4th, alt, alt, alt) row 3 (2, 32, 31, 30) times, then in foll alt (alt, every, every) row 24 (28, 3, 7, 13) times, at the same time dec one st at front edge in every foll 4th row 3 (5, 12, 14, 11) times, then in every foll 6th row 7 (6, 2, 1, 3) time/s, 2 sts. Work 1 (1, 0, 0, 0) row/s.

Next Row: K2tog.

Fasten off.

SLEEVES

Using 3.25mm needles and MC, cast on 50 (50, 54, 54, 58) sts.

Work 16 rows rib as for lower band of Back.

Change to 4.00mm needles. Work in stocking st, inc one st at each end of next row, then in every foll 8th (6th, 6th, 6th, 4th) row until there are 64 (58, 62, 86, 64) sts, then in every foll 10th (8th, 8th, 8th, 6th) row until there are 74 (78, 82, 88, 94) sts. Cont without shaping until work measures 40 cm from beg, ending with a purl row.

Beg stripes

Using CC, work 10 rows stocking st. Using MC, work 6 rows stocking st. Using CC, work 4 rows stocking st. Using MC, work 2 rows stocking st.

Shape Raglan

Using MC for rem, cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 70 (74, 78, 84, 90) sts.

Next Row: K1, sl 1 knitways, K1, psso, knit to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. Cont dec one st (as before) at each end of every foll alt row until 8 (8, 10, 18, 22) sts rem, then in every row until 6 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts rem. Leave rem sts on a stitch holder.

CREW CARDIGAN NECKBAND

Using wool sewing needle and mattress st seam, join raglan seams, noting that tops of sleeves form part of neckline.

With RS facing, using 3.25mm needles and MC, knit up 25 (26, 31, 32, 35) sts evenly along right front neck, knit across sts from right sleeve stitch holder, knit across sts from back stitch holder, knit across sts from left sleeve stitch holder, then knit up 25 (26, 31, 32, 35) sts evenly along left front neck. 92 (96, 112, 116, 124) sts.

Row 1: WS - P3, * K2, P2, rep from * to last st. P1.

Row 2: K3, * P2, K2, rep from * to last st. K1.

Rep 1st and 2nd rows 3 times, then 1st row once = 9 rows rib in total. Cast off loosely in rib.

RIGHT FRONT BAND FOR CREW CARDIGAN

With RS facing, using 3.25mm needles and MC, knit up 142 (146, 146, 146,

146) sts evenly along right front edge and side edge of neckband. Work 9 rows rib as for lower band of

Back, beg with a 2nd row. Cast off loosely in rib.

Place markers along Right Front Band 8 positions for buttons, placing first marker 2 cm up from lower edge and last 1 cm below neck edge and remainder spaced evenly between.

LEFT FRONT BAND FOR CREW CARDIGAN

Work to correspond with Right Front Band, working a buttonhole at each marker thus, yarn forward to make a stitch, rib 2tog.

RIGHT FRONT BAND FOR VEE CARDIGAN

With RS facing, using 3.25mm needles and MC, knit up 100 sts evenly along right front edge to beg of front slope shaping, 56 (56, 60, 60, 62) sts evenly along right front slope shaping, knit across sts from right sleeve stitch holder, then knit up 16 (16, 18, 18, 20) sts evenly across half of back neck to centre. 178 (178, 186, 186, 190) sts. Work 9 rows rib as for lower band of Back, beg with a 2nd row. Cast off loosely in rib.

Place markers along Right Front Band 5 positions for buttons, placing first marker 2 cm up from lower edge and last 1 cm below front slope shaping and remainder spaced evenly between.

LEFT FRONT BAND FOR VEE CARDIGAN

Work to correspond with Right Front Band, working a buttonhole at each marker thus, yarn forward to make a stitch, rib 2tog.

MAKING UP

Do not press.

Using wool sewing needle and mattress st seam. Join side and sleeve seams. For Vee Cardigan: Join side edge of Front Bands together at Centre Back edge. Sew on buttons. Sew in all loose ends.

All sizes 100sts

Row 1: *K8, K2tog repeat from * to end of row. 90sts.

Next and every alternate row: Purl. Row 3: *K7, K2tog rep from * to end. 80sts.

Row 5: * K6, K2tog rep from * to end. 70sts.

Row 7: *K5, K2tog rep from * to end. 60sts.

Row 9: *K4, K2tog rep from * to end. 50sts.

Row 11: *K3, K2tog rep from * to end. 40sts.

Row 13: *K2, K2tog rep from * to end. 30sts.


Row 15: *K2 repeat across row. 15sts.

Row 16: Purl.

MAKING UP

Break off yarn leaving a tail. Use a wool needle to thread tail of yarn through remaining stitches.

Draw up tightly and fasten securely.



Sew back seam and attach flower.

FLOWER

Inner rosette: leaving a 30cm tail of yarn at the beginning cast on 60sts using 4.50mm needles.

Knit in stocking stitch for 6 rows. Cast off. Do not press.

Outer rosette: leaving a 30cm tail at the beginning cast on 80 sts using 4.50mm needles. Knit in stocking stitch for 8 rows. Cast off. Do not press.

MAKING UP

Both rosettes the same.

Thread wool needle with tail of yarn and gather up cast on edge tightly arranging work into a rosette shape. Fasten off.

Sit inner rosette on top of outer rosette and join together at centre with a few stitches. Attach centre of flower to beanie at top of rib pattern.

YARN

1 skein 50gm knitalpaca Argenta alpaca/mohair blend. Beads or buttons for optional trim

NEEDLES AND TOOLS

3.50mm knitting needles

TENSION

Not critical to project

GETTING STARTED

Diagonal lace pattern

Row 1: RS - K2, *YO, K2 tog, K3 from * to end of row.

Row 2: alternate rows: WS – Purl. Row 3: K 3, *YO, K 2 tog, K3 from * to end.

Row 5: K 4, *YO, K2 tog, K3 from *

Row 7: K5, *YO, K2 tog, K3 from * to end.

Row 9: K6 *YO, K2 tog, K3 from * to end.

WORKING PATTERN

Cast on 60 sts. Knit 5 rows.

Next Row: *Pattern - begin diagonal lace pattern and work for 10 cm,

ending on a RS row. Knit 5 rows. **

Work from * to ** three more times. Cast off.

MAKING UP

Darn in ends. Join short ends

GLOSSARY

BEGINNER'S TOOL KIT

PINS

Plastic-head pins are useful for checking tension and blocking out



items. Pins with coloured heads are best because they do not get lost in your work.

ROW COUNTER

for keeping track of rows worked, particularly where increases, decreases or OCCUF.



KNITTING NEEDLES

Knitting needles are made from plastic, aluminium or wood and come in varying lengths and widths. Straight needles come in pairs and doublepointed needles come in sets of four.

KNITTING BAG

A knitting bag is essential for those who like to knit 'on the go'. Not only is it a practical way to keep all your knitting paraphenalia together, it also helps keep the yarn clean and tangle-free.



A row counter is helpful other kinds of patterning



CIRCULAR KNITTING NEEDLES

Circular needles have two working ends joined by a thin nylon wire. They are more balanced than straight needles and allow the weight of your work to rest in your lap.



KNITTING IN ELASTIC

Elastic yarn prevents sagging in cuffs, collars and waists. You can work it in with knitting yarn on knitted or crocheted garments.



TAPE MEASURE

A basic tape measure is essential for checking your garment measurements.



KNITTER'S NEEDLES

Knitter's needles need to have a large eye and a blunt point so they do not split stitches when sewing up your knitting.




STITCH GAUGE

A stitch gauge is a flat piece of metal or plastic with a ruler marked on one side and/or a window

cut out in the centre. It allows you to mark and measure easily and accurately.

STITCH HOLDER

A stitch holder is used to secure stitches not in use. You can also use safety pins for holding a small number of stitches.




CASTING ON

Casting on is creating a row of loops on a knitting needle to form the base row for your knitting. One of the most popular methods of casting on is the cable cast on. Form a slipknot about 25cm away from the end of the yarn.

Place the slipknot on a knitting needle and pull gently to secure. Hold this needle in your left hand. Insert the right-hand needle through the slip knot. Pass the yarn over the point of the right-hand needle (see Diagram 1). Pull a loop through the slip knot with the right hand needle (see Diagram 2). Place this loop on the left hand needle and gently pull the yarn to secure the stitch. For the remaining cast on stitches, insert the right hand needle between the slip knot and the first stitch on the left hand needle. Wind the yarn around the point of the right hand needle. Draw a loop through and place this loop on the left-hand needle. Continue in this manner until you have cast on the desired number of stitches.

KNIT STITCH



Once you have cast on, you then knit into the stitches you have made to form the knitted fabric. Hold the needle with the cast on stitches in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the back of your work. Insert the right hand needle from left to right through the front of the first stitch on the left hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from left to right over the point of the right hand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the

yarn through the stitch to form a new stitch on the right hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right hand needle. To knit a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left hand needle to the right hand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

PURL STITCH




The puri stitch is basically the reverse of the knit stitch. Hold the needle with the stitches on in your left hand, with the loose yarn at the front of your work. Insert the right-hand needle from right to left into the front of the first stitch on the left-hand needle (see Diagram 1). Wind the yarn from right to left over the point of the right-hand needle (see Diagram 2). Draw the yarn through the

stitch to form a new stitch on the right-hand needle. Slip the original stitch off the left-hand needle, keeping the new stitch on the right-hand needle. To purl a row, repeat these steps until all the stitches have been transferred from the left-hand needle to the right-hand needle. Turn your work, transferring the needle with the stitches on into your left hand to work the next row.

CASTING OFF

KNITWISE


Knit two stitches. Use the point of the left hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right hand needle over the second, and drop if off the needle. Knit the next stitch on the left hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right hand needle again, and repeat. Continue in this manner



until all the stitches have been worked off the left hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right hand needle. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail and thread the yarn through the loop and pull it firmly to fasten off.

PURLWISE

Purl two stitches. Use the point of the left hand needle to lift the first stitch on the right hand needle over the second, and drop it off the needle. Purl the next stitch on the left hand needle so that there are two stitches on the right hand needle again, and



repeat. Continue in this manner until all the stitches have been worked off the left hand needle and only one stitch remains on the right hand needle. Secure this last stitch as described in casting off knitwise.

SUBSTITUTING YARNS

If you substitute or spin a yarn for a project, you can compare the weight of the yarn to the project yarn by comparing wraps per inch. Wrap your yarn around a ruler for one inch and count the number of wraps. If you have more wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thin; if you have fewer wraps per inch than the project yarn, your yarn is too thick.



KNITTING TENSION


Checking your knitting tension, that is, the tightness or looseness of your knitting, is important. To check your tension, cast on 30 stitches using the recommended needle size. Work in the pattern until your work measures 10cm from the cast on edge then cast off. You now have a "swatch". Measure your tension by placing a ruler over your swatch and counting the number of stitches


across and rows down (including fractions of stitches and rows) in 10cm. Repeat these measurements two to three times on a different parts of the swatch to check your measurements. If you have more stitches and rows than called for in the instructions, you should use larger needles; if you have fewer, use smaller needles. Check your tension again before starting your project.

PROVISIONAL CAST ON (INVISIBLE CAST ON)

Place a loose slipknot on the needle in your right hand. Hold the waste yarn next to the slipknot and around your left thumb. Hold your working yarn over your left index finger. *Bring the needle forward under the waste yarn, over the working yarn, grab a loop of working yarn (Diagram

1), then bring the needle to the front, over both yarns, and grab a second loop (Diagram 2). Repeat from * until you have the desired number of stitches on your needle. When you're ready to work in the opposite direction, pick out the waste yarn to expose the live stitches.





BACKSTITCH

This is the stitch most commonly used for joining knitted garments. With the right sides of your work together, pin the knitted fabric together with the edges even. The seam should be sewn one full stitch from the end of the row. One stitch should be worked over every row. Thread the yarn needle. Insert the needle through both layers and sew two stitches to the left then one stitch back to the right. Keep stitches at an even distance. Continue working from right to left in this circular motion. (Diagram 1)

TASSELS


Cut yarn twice the length of your desired tassel plus a bit extra for the knot. According to the desired thickness of the tassel, select a number of lengths of yarn. Fold the lengths of yarn in half over a crochet hook. On the wrong side, insert the crochet hook from the front to the back through the edge of the work. Grab the yarn and pull through and tighten. Trim the ends to the same length.

KNOTTED FRINGE

After working a tassel, take one half of the strands from each tassel and knot them with half the strands from the neighbouring tassel. Trim.




CROCHET CHAIN




Make a slip knot on your hook. Pass the yarn over the hook and catch it with the hook and draw it through the loop on the hook. Repeat, drawing yarn through the last loop formed.


DOUBLE CROCHET (DC) (US SINGLE CROCHET SC)




Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch. Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have two loops on the hook (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw through both loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).

HALF TREBLE CROCHET (HTR) (US HALF DOUBLE CROCHET HDC)





Pass the yarn over the hook.
Insert the hook through the top
two loops of a stitch (Diagram
1). Pass the yarn over the hook
and draw up a loop so that there
are three loops on the hook
(Diagram 2). Draw through
all three loops on the hook
(Diagram 3).



SLIP STITCH CROCHET (SL ST)

Insert your hook into the stitch. Yarn over the hook and draw the loop through the stitch and loop onto the hook.

TREBLE CROCHET (TR) (US DOUBLE CROCHET DC)




Pass the yarn over the hook. Insert the hook through the top two loops of a stitch (Diagram 1). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop so that you have three loops on the hook (Diagram 2). Pass the yarn over the hook and draw it through the first two loops on the hook, pass the yarn over the hook and draw through the remaining two loops. Continue in the same way, inserting the hook into each stitch (Diagram 3).



I-CORD

With double pointed needles, cast on the desired number of stitches. *Without turning the needle, slide the stitches to the other end of the needle, pull the yarn around the back and knit the stitches as usual. Repeat from * until your work measures the desired length



PICKING UP DROPPED STITCHES

A dropped stitch can be picked up using a crochet hook and don't be put off by stitches that have unraveled several rows down into the work. To pick up knit stitches, insert the crochet hook into the dropped stitch, draw through the bar lying above the dropped stitch and pull it through the loop of the dropped stitch.



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
